DULUTH. . . UMD's Convocations and Lectures committee will launch its Spring Film Series Friday, April 7 in the Science Auditorium. English and French films will be shown free to the public at 8 p.m. Fridays throughout most of spring quarter.

The series includes: April 7—"Richard III," the story of England's hunchbacked king (English). April 14—"The Colditz Story," true account of Allied prisoners' flight from the supposedly escape-proof POW camp, Colditz Castle, during World War II. (English). April 21—"The Crucible," Arthur Miller's tale of witchcraft in Salem, Mass. (French).

April 28—"Things to Come," H. G. Wells' amazing forecast of life in the next century, when mankind builds a new civilization following a war of complete destruction (English). May 5—"The Case of Dr. Lawrent," the story of introduction of natural childbirth in a provincial town, despite ignorance, terror and superstition. (French).

UMD students will be admitted to the series upon presentation of their activity cards.
