DULUTH--Danforth Graduate Fellowships for college teaching careers worth up to \$12,000 are now available, UMD Academic Dean Thomas W. Chamberlin announced today.

The fellowships, offered by the Danforth Foundation of St. Louis, Missouri, are open to male college seniors or recent graduates preparing for a career of teaching, counseling or administrative work at the college level. Applicants should not have already undertaken graduate work, Chamberlin said.

Nominations close October 25 and any area student interested in the fellowships should write to Dean Thomas W. Chamberlin, University of Minnesota, Duluth, Duluth 12, Minnesota.

Winners will be eligible for up to four years financial assistance, with an annual maximum of \$1,500 for single men and \$2,000 (as well as \$500 per child) for married men, plus tuition fees.

Nominees will be judged on intellectual promise and personality, integrity, genuine interest in religion, and high potential for effective college teaching.
