DULUTH--A one-time advisor to the 1st Korean Marine Corps Regimental combat team and the author of a paper on the works of Tennessee Williams have joined the UMD staff faculty for the 1962-63 academic year.

William Henry Granse, a native of Detroit, Mich., has joined the English department as an instructor after a similar post at Luther College, Decorah, Iowa. A graduate of the University of Michigan (BA) and Wayne State University (MA), Granse once wrote on "The Social Significance of Abnormal Characters in the Works of Tennessee Williams."

George Arthur Johnson completed his MA requirements at UMD in July and has stayed on as a senior personnel worker in student counseling. A native of New York Mills (Minn.), Johnson served with the U.S. Marine Corps for eight years, first in the South Pacific and then in Korea.
