DULUTH--Four works featuring soloists and two purely orchestral compositions will highlight the UMD Orchestra concert at 8:15 p.m. Tuesday (March 12) in Kirby Student Center ballroom. Dr. Robert House and James Smith, associate professor of music, will conduct.

Handel's "D Minor Organ Concerto, No.10," a work fashioned for an organ without pedal manual, will have David Dahlgren, Hermantown, as a soloist. He is a pupil of Dr. Addison Alspach.

"Hungarian Rhapsody" by David Popper, a 'cello virtuoso composition utilizing themes from Liszt rhapsodies, will be performed by Mary Wright, Fergus Falls, a pupil of Professor House.

Wieniaski's "Scherzo Tarantelle" is a romantic work still frequently included in contemporary violin repertoire; this composition will be presented with Julie Ehlers, Duluth, as soloist.

St. Saen's second of five pianoforte concertos will feature Paula Quaderer, Duluth, as soloist. She is a pupil of Ruth van Appledorn.

Orchestral works include the Scherzo movement from Soviet composer Shostakovich's "Ninth Symphony," and Britisher Fredrick Delius' "Over the Hills and Far Away."

The public is invited to attend the concert at no charge.
