DULUTH--An Industrial Education Workshop designed to emphasize the importance of industrial safety will be offered during the first UMD Summer Session beginning June 17.

A student can register for either three or six credits depending on the amount of independent work he wants to do, according to instructor Gordon O. Voss, associate professor and head of the Industrial Education department.

The workshop will meet Monday through Friday from 2-3:50 p.m. in Room 221, Industrial Education building.

"We are fortunate in being in an area of the state where there is a great resource of both people and material available for this kind of instruction," Voss pointed out.

Voss explained that many industrial people have indicated an interest to serve as guest speakers and to arrange industrial field trips in connection with the workshop.

Voss said the workshop will stress three principal aspects: (1) safety program organizations, (2) safety information and attitude development, (3) safety engineering as regards the technical approach to guarding, storage, material handling, processing, etc.

The course is open to graduate students working toward a masters degree, undergraduates who wish to use the credit toward a baccalaureate degree and persons in industry interested in the further development of industrial safety programs.
