

DULUTH--Registration will begin Dec. 23 for two graduate-level courses in educational administration which will be taught at UMD winter and spring quarters as University Extension Division classes.

The courses, which are being offered for the first time, have been scheduled as a result of cooperation between Extension, the College of Education at Minneapolis and the UMD Division of Education and Psychology.

Dr. Luvern(correct) L. Cunningham, professor of educational administration, Minneapolis campus, will teach Educational Administration 201 during winter quarter from 6:00-8:40 p.m. each Monday in Social Science 116. Classes begin Jan.6.

Dr. Clifford Hooker, professor of educational administration at the Minneapolis campus, will teach Educational Administration 202 spring quarter at the same times and place beginning March 30.

Dr. Cyril M. Milbrath, associate professor of secondary education at UMD, will serve as the course coordinator between the campuses.

"It is our hope that these initial offerings in educational administration will mark the beginning of an expanded number of courses in this field," Milbrath said. "This cooperative program is the first step in this direction."

Dr. Milbrath said the courses to be offered at UMD this year are basic to any program in educational administration by practising administrators, aspiring administrators who have not completed advanced degrees, educators planning to work toward a doctorate at the University of Minnesota, and supervisory school personnel.

All such courses at UMD are offered through the Graduate School' at the University of Minnesota.

Interested individuals may get more information or may pre-register up to Dec. 20 by contacting Dr. Milbrath at 211 Education building at UMD. Advance notice of intent to register is needed because of Graduate School requirements, Milbrath said.

Actual registration will be held Dec. 23-Jan.4 at the General Extension Division office at 110 New Garrick building, Duluth.
