Duluth --- Ernest H. Bergquist, a senior at the University of Minnesota, Duluth (UMD) Friday was presented the 1964 Paterson Undergraduate Award, given annually to the outstanding psychology major from all the four-year colleges and universities in the state.

Bergquist, 21, was presented the award at the annual meeting of the Minnesota Psychological Association at 7:00 p.m. at the Leamington Hotel in Minneapolis. The award, which includes a check for \$100, was made by Dr. Donald E. Swanson, award committee chairman and a member of the psychology staff at Hamline University.

Bergquist is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest A. Bergquist, 214 15th St., Cloquet, Minnesota.

A graduate of Cloquet High School in 1960, Bergquist is majoring in psychology and mathematics at UMD with a minor in zoology. He will graduate in June.

He has been a research assistant in the UMD Department of Psychology under the direction of Dr. Armas W. Tamminen, adviser and department head. Bergquist is vice president of Psi Chi, national honorary society in psychology, and co-chairman of the UMD Psychology Club.

He has accepted a research assistantship at the University of Minnesota Minneapolis while he does graduate work in experimental and physiological psychology. He was offered similar ^{and}scholarships/assistantships by three other American universities.

Bergquist is only the fourth recipient of the Paterson award.

Each psychology department in Minnesota colleges or universities may make a single nomination. The award is given to the psychology senior who shows superior academic achievement, high potential for a career in psychology, and who is recommended by at least three persons. Previous recipients came from Hamline University, University of Minnesota, and Carleton College.
