Duluth --- A 16-item, \$6,202,000 UMD building program for 1965 was presented Saturday to members of the Legislative Building Commission by Provost Raymond W. Darland.

The ten-man commission headed by Senator J. A. Josefson, Minnesota, heard Provost Darland explain in detail UMD building requests which will be presented at the next session of the Minnesota Legislature.

Following the morning presentation and a luncheon at Kirby Student Center, commission members toured the campus and viewed the Duluth-Superior harbor by boat.

Provost Darland emphasized that the 1965 requests "represent a realistic appraisal of the construction needs on this campus if we are to meet rising enrollments by Northeastern Minnesota students."

The 1965 UMD building requests, as approved by the University of Minnesota Board of Regents, include such major projects as a Life-Science building, Classroom Addition, Physical Plant shops, study hall, campus school, theater, Reception Center and Food Service building, and a residence hall addition.

Other requests cover utilities and campus improvements.

The Legislative Building Commission members are visiting all state facilities and will make recommendations to the 1965 legislature on construction requests.
