DULUTH — James Taylor Dunn, librarian for the Minnesota Historical Society, will trace the "Trail of Daniel Greysolon Sieur du Luth" before the annual meeting of the St. Louis Historical Society on Tuesday, January 31.

The meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. in Kirby Student Center ballroom will and ~~include~~ election of the St. Louis Society's board of Governors. President Arthur Roberts will preside.

Dunn will present a slide-lecture into the authenticity of picture reputed to be that of Sieur du Luth at age 20. It was sent to Duluth Mayor ~~George~~ George Johnson two years ago by a Dr. A. Boel of St. Germain Laval in France, the birthplace of French voyager.

Dr. Boel secured the picture from a house near his St. Germain and sent it to Johnson, ~~who~~ thinking it an appropriate token after ~~heard~~ ~~about the suggestion~~ that Jacques Lipchitz had ~~sculpted~~ sculpted a statue of du Luth to be placed on the UMD campus.

After receiving the picture the St. Louis Historical Society sought verification of the picture's authenticity. When Dunn ~~went to Europe~~ visited Europe in February-March 1966, he was able to visit with Dr. Boel and carry out an investigation.

Dunn took many photographs ~~of his~~ during his investigation and will present the slides and reveal his findings. ~~at the annual gathering~~
