Duluth--- Applications for admission to the two-year Air Force ROTC program will be accepted during January, according to Major Richard E. Snyder, UMD Professor of Aerospace Studies.

To qualify for the two-year program, Snyder said candidates must pass the Air Force Officer Qualification Test, pass a physical examination and attend a six-week field training course during the summer of 1968.

Snyder said the next officer qualification test will be administered at 9 a.m. on Jan. 13 in the ROTC Building at UMD. The physical examinations are given at the Duluth Air Base dispensary at no cost to applicants.

During their junior and senior years at UMD, cadets will enroll in upper division Air Force ROTC courses for which they are awarded 8 to 21 academic credits which may be applied toward the Bachelor of Arts degree. Upon completion of the University's degree requirements, they receive an Air Force Commission.

Young men at UMD or area junior colleges who are interested in the two year program should contact the UMD Department of Aerospace Studies for additional information.
