

Duluth --- Jobs are open on the UMD campus for students who can qualify under the Work Study Program, according to Dr. Chester W. Wood, director of Student Personnel Services.

"Funds are available for both campus and off-campus employment under the federal Educational Opportunity Act for students from low-income families," Dr. Wood said. "Such students can work up to 15 hours per week if they currently are attending classes at UMD or up to 40 hours per week if they have been admitted for fall quarter."

Dr. Wood noted that recent high school graduates or transfer students who will attend UMD next year, previously enrolled UMD students or those who are attending Summer Session are eligible.

Students may qualify if any of the following conditions exist:

- * The family is on any form of welfare.
- * The family is likely to become involved in a welfare situation due to conditions such as illness or seasonal employment.
- * The family income is below \$3,000 per year if there are two adults and one child, \$3,500 if two children, \$4,000 if three children and in \$500 increments for each additional child.
- * The family is unable to make a significant contribution of \$200 or more to the child's college education.
