Academic Excellence Award

This award is presented to the student who ranks highest scholastically among all undergraduates at the Carlson School.

Dean's Award for Best Undergraduate Honors Theses

In order to recognize the accomplishments of undergraduate honors students, the Carlson School awards an annual prize to the students whose theses achieve the highest level of excellence. The recipients of this award were chosen from a select group of honors students who were nominated by their faculty supervisors based on the contribution and innovativeness of their theses. The winners also have demonstrated great initiative, professionalism, and independent thinking throughout the thesis project. Honors

Carlson School degree candidates may graduate with either Latin Honors (*cum*, *magna*, or *summa cum laude*) or with Distinction (Distinction or High Distinction) or both. Honors citations are provisional and do not become official until all requirements for the award indicated are fulfilled.

Latin Honors Awards

Cum laude, *magna cum laude*, or *summa cum laude* graduates complete honors requirements, including research leading to an honors thesis project in their major. Students graduating *cum laude* have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.50 for their last 60 graded credits at the University of Minnesota; *magna cum laude* awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.66; and *summa cum laude* awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.75.

Degrees with Distinction

Students earn degrees “with Distinction” or “with High Distinction” based on cumulative grade point average at the University of Minnesota. Students graduating “with Distinction” must have earned a cumulative GPA of at least 3.75; students graduating “with High Distinction” must have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.90 or higher at the time of graduation.

Beta Alpha Psi

Membership in this national honorary accounting society is awarded to accounting majors on the basis of performance in specific accounting courses and overall grade point average.

Academic costume and regalia

Academic gowns date back to the 14th century, when they served two functions of nearly equal importance: to indicate the academic rank of the wearer and to keep the scholar warm in the drafty stone halls of academia.

The markings, cut, and color of the modern-day academic costume—cap, gown, and sometimes hood—indicate the academic degree, the field of study, and the institution that granted the degree.

Degree candidates wear the gowns appropriate for the degrees they are about to receive. Bachelor's degree gowns are black and untrimmed. A maroon and gold tassel hangs from the mortar board worn on the head by candidates. Master's degree gowns, black and untrimmed, have pointed sleeves.

Doctoral gowns in the United States traditionally have been black with velvet front facings and crossbars on the sleeves. The Minnesota hood, which may be worn by anyone with a doctoral degree from the University of Minnesota, is black with maroon chevron on gold. Each institution has its own pattern of colors on the hood, worn around the neck and down the back of the gown. The length and shape of the hood identify the most advanced degree the wearer has earned, and the velvet edging shows the field: drab for doctor of business administration.

In recent years a number of universities have adopted gowns of distinctive school colors. A new University of Minnesota doctoral gown and matching tam made their appearance in 1988 to celebrate the centenary of the first Minnesota doctor of philosophy degree. The new Minnesota gown is maroon-trimmed with black velvet chevron and gold metallic braid. The traditional gown may still be worn.
