Duluth -- A joint band concert will be given Tuesday (Feb. 13) at 7:30 p.m. in the UMD Kirby Student Center ballroom. Taking part will be the UMD Concert Band and an honor band made up of musicians from 31 area high schools.

James R. Murphy, head of music, will conduct the UMD band in a program of six numbers. Included will be Mozart's "Concerto for Bassoon," first movement, transcribed for euphonium. Richard H. Carlson, instructor of music, will be the soloist.

The high school honor band will be conducted by Dr. George E. Reynolds, director of instrumental music at the Kenosha-Racine campuses of the University of Wisconsin. The students will take part in an all-day clinic before giving the evening concert. The program will be announced at the concert.

Other numbers on the UMD band's program are "Symphony for Band" by Robert Washburn, "Variants on a Medieval Tune for Band" by Norman Dello Joio, "Incidental Suite" by Claude Smith, "Sonata Pian' E Forte" by G. Garieli and "The Ramparts" by Clifton Williams.

The concert is free and open to the public.
