Topics coming up include a slide presentation on the natural beauty and Afro-American heritage of the South in the work of Clyde Connell, presented by Deborah Howard on Jan. 21. On Feb. 4, Visions as Hallucinations: Bessie Head (Botswana) and Julian of Norwich (England) will be discussed by Elizabeth Evasdaughter. This will be a comparison of Buddhist and Catholic visions as projections of an inner drama originating in the social and religious erasure of the feminine. 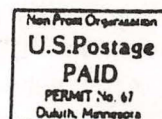
