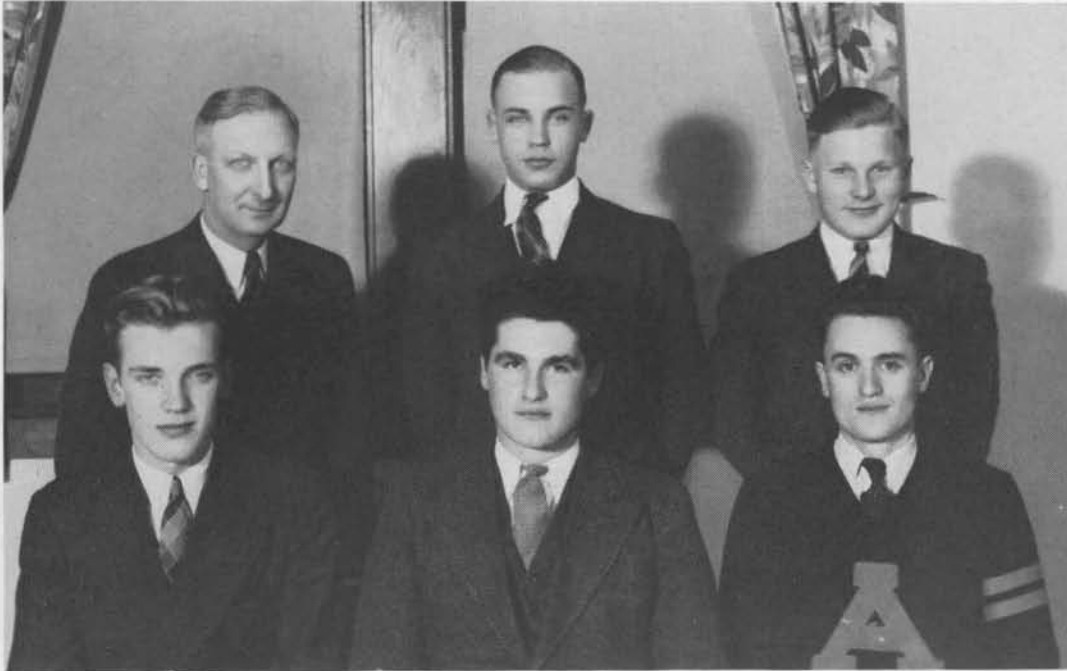

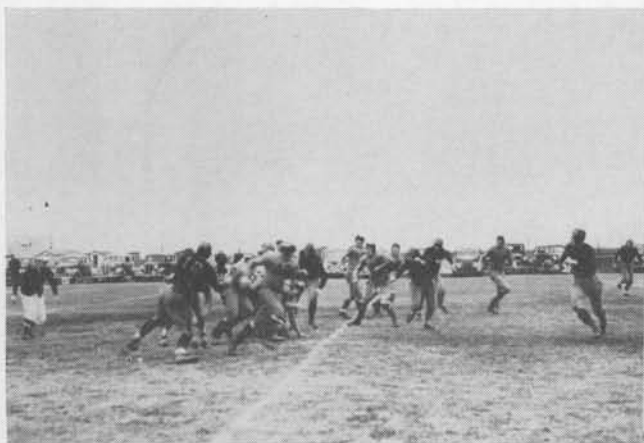

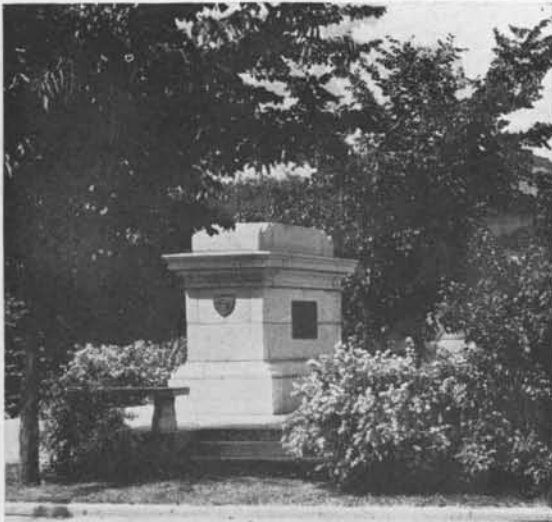

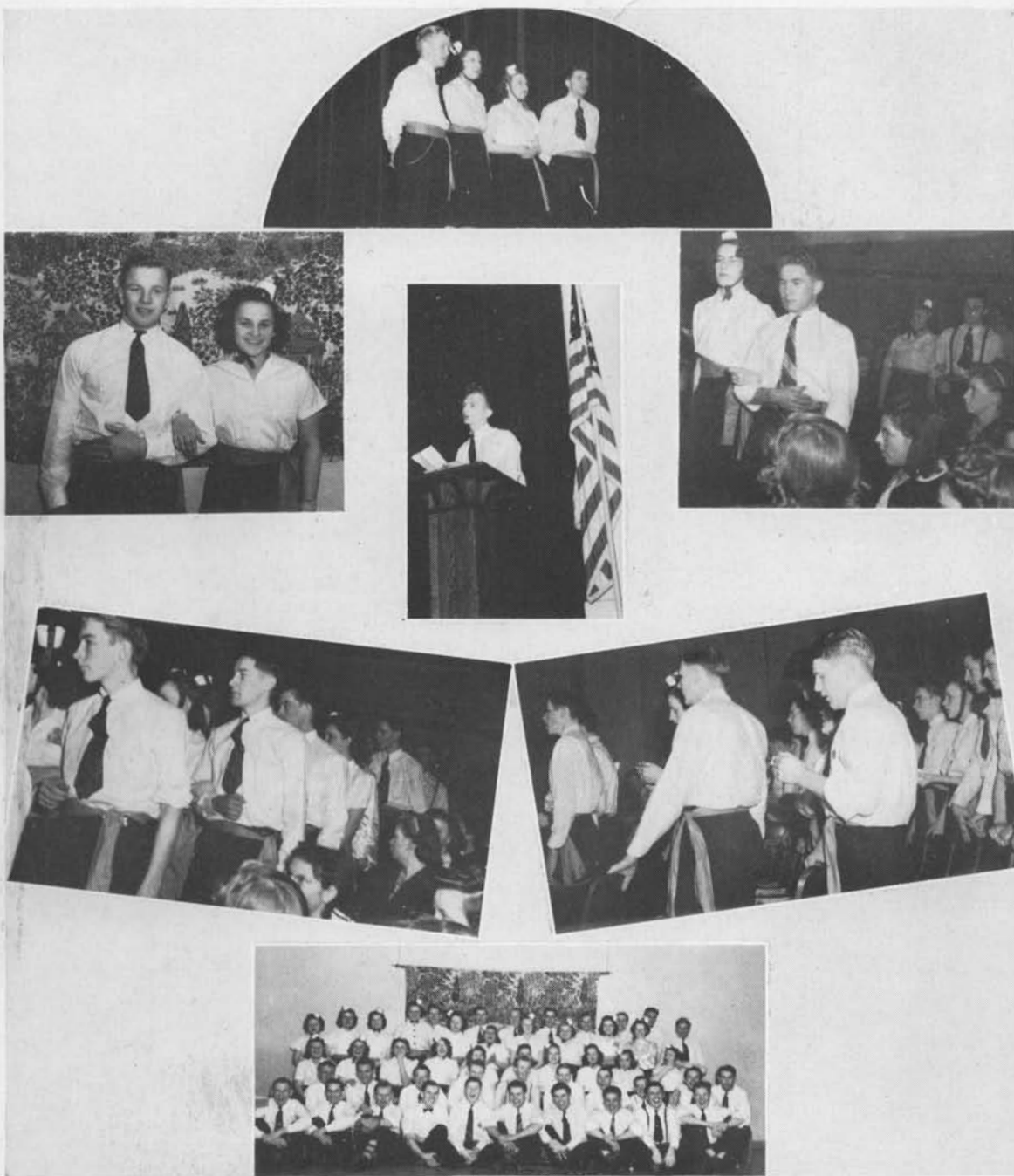

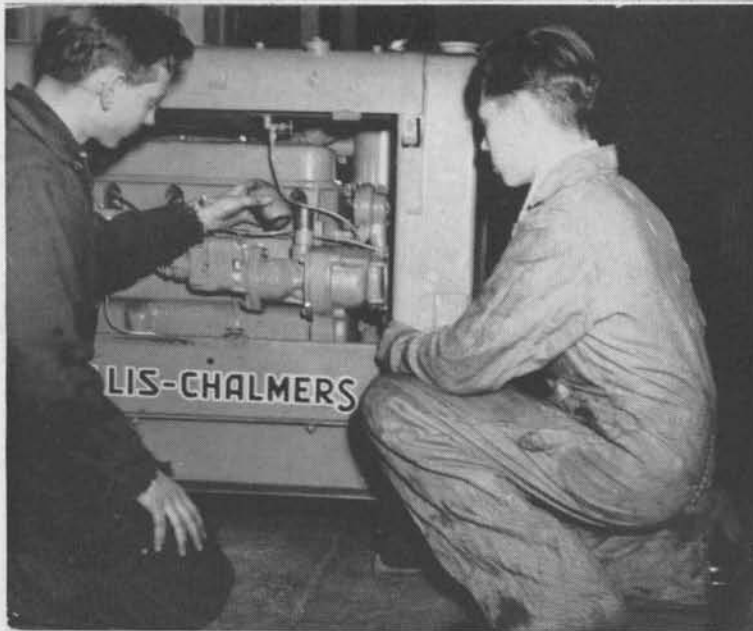

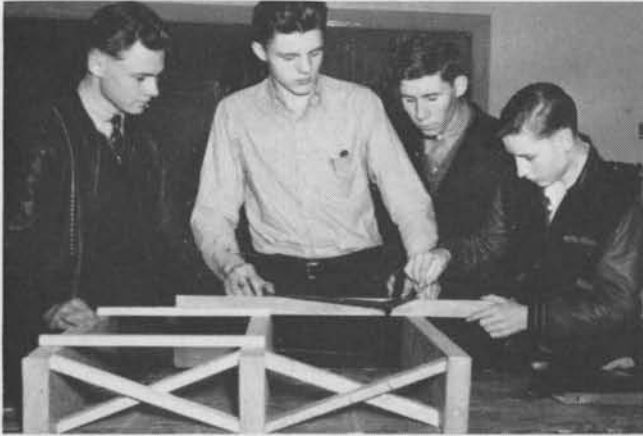

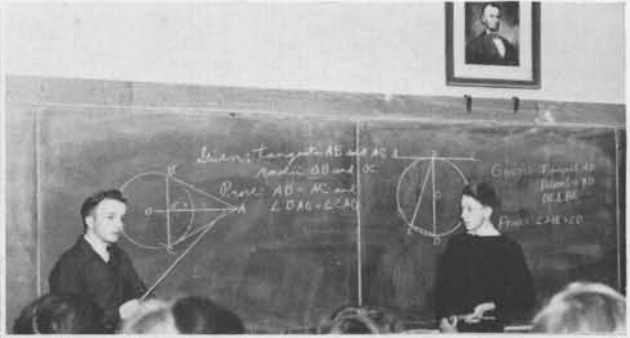

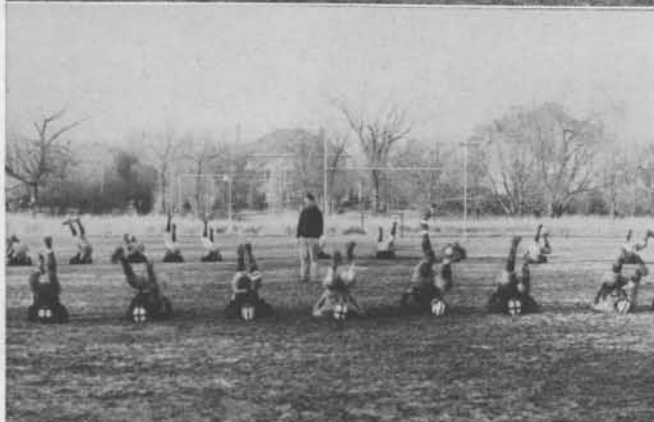


RESUME OF 1940 FOOTBALL SEASON

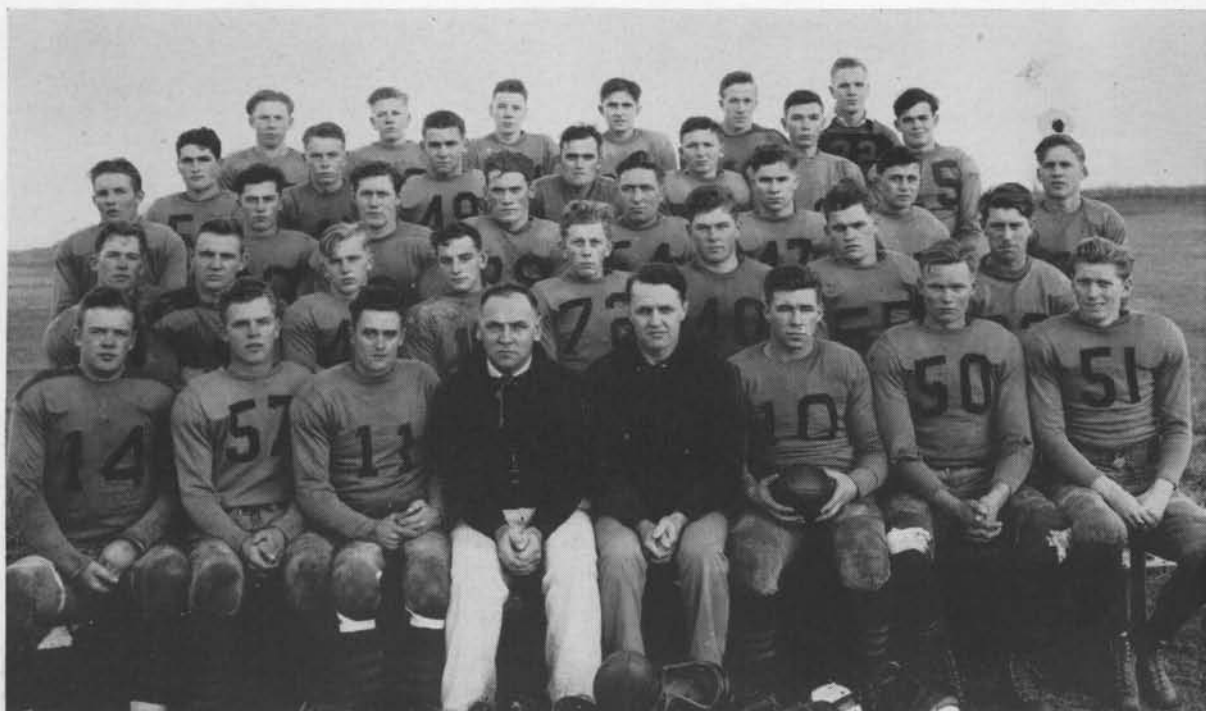

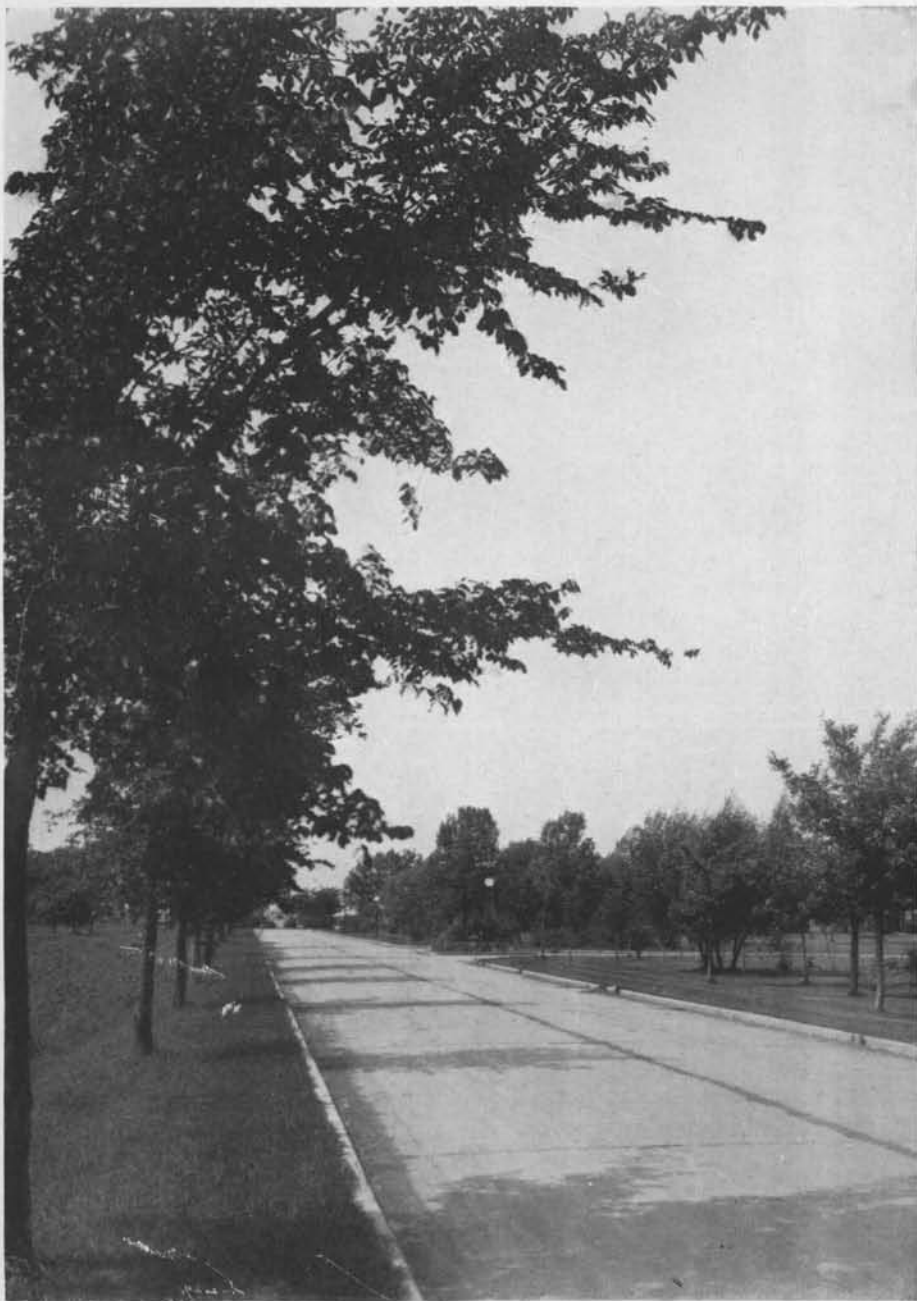
BOYS' CLASS BASKETBALL
