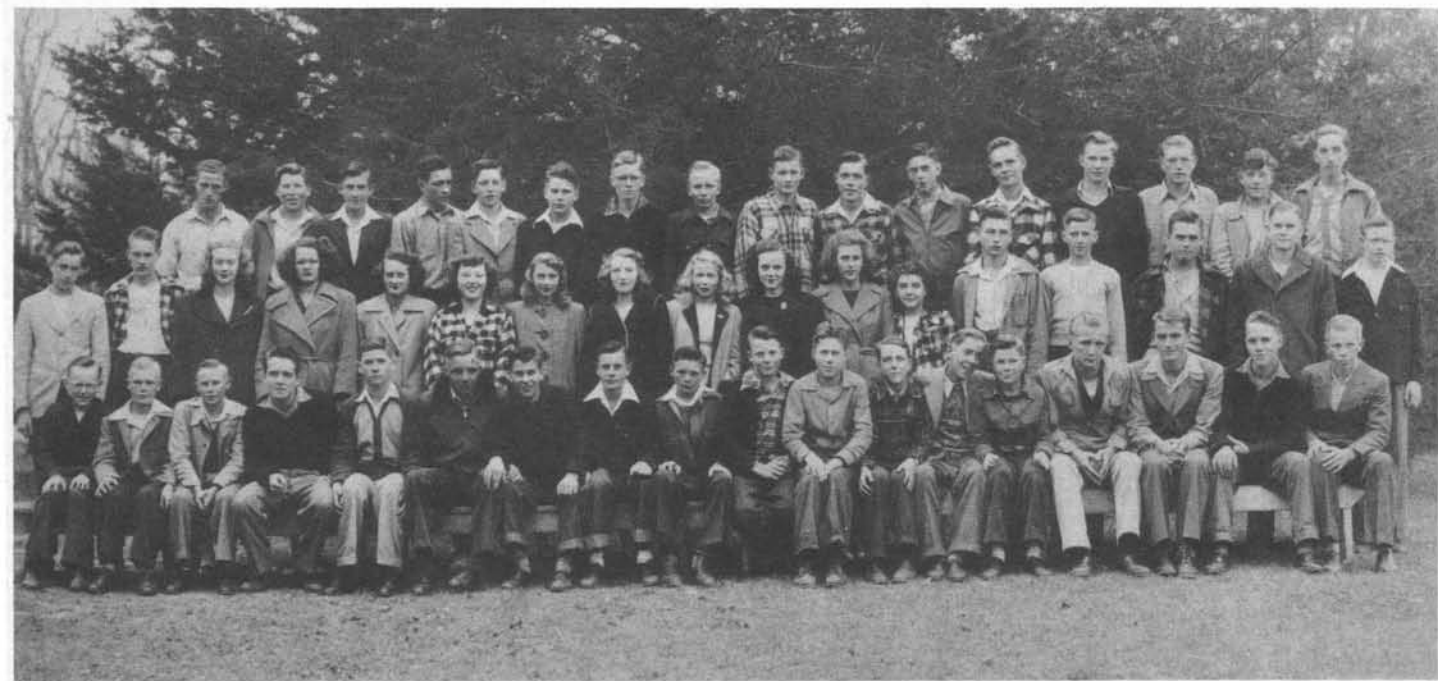
On October 1, 1946, a new group of eager students entered a new phase of life. To many the years at school will be a stepping-stone leading into other fields of endeavor.

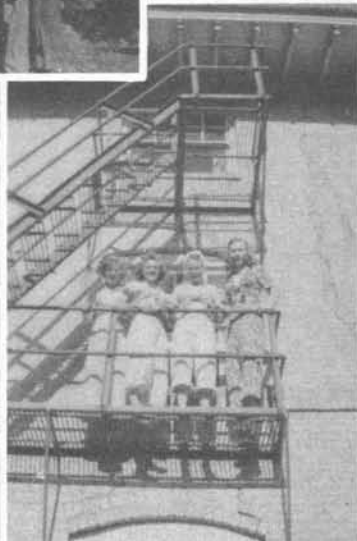

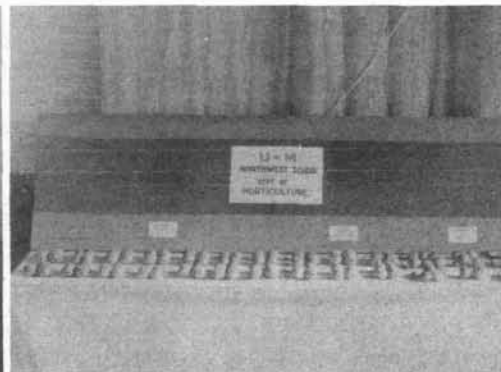
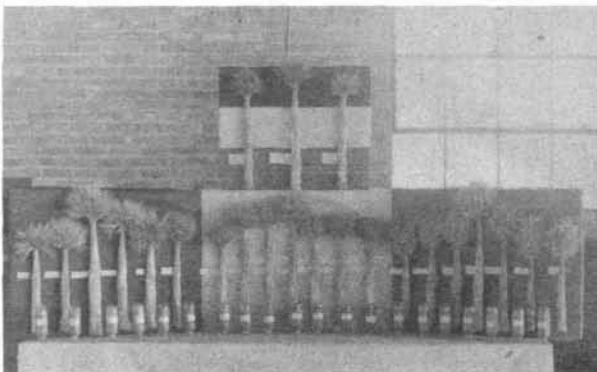

Senior Day



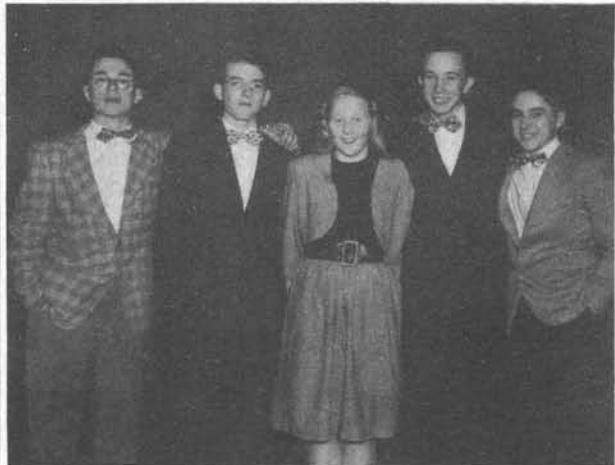

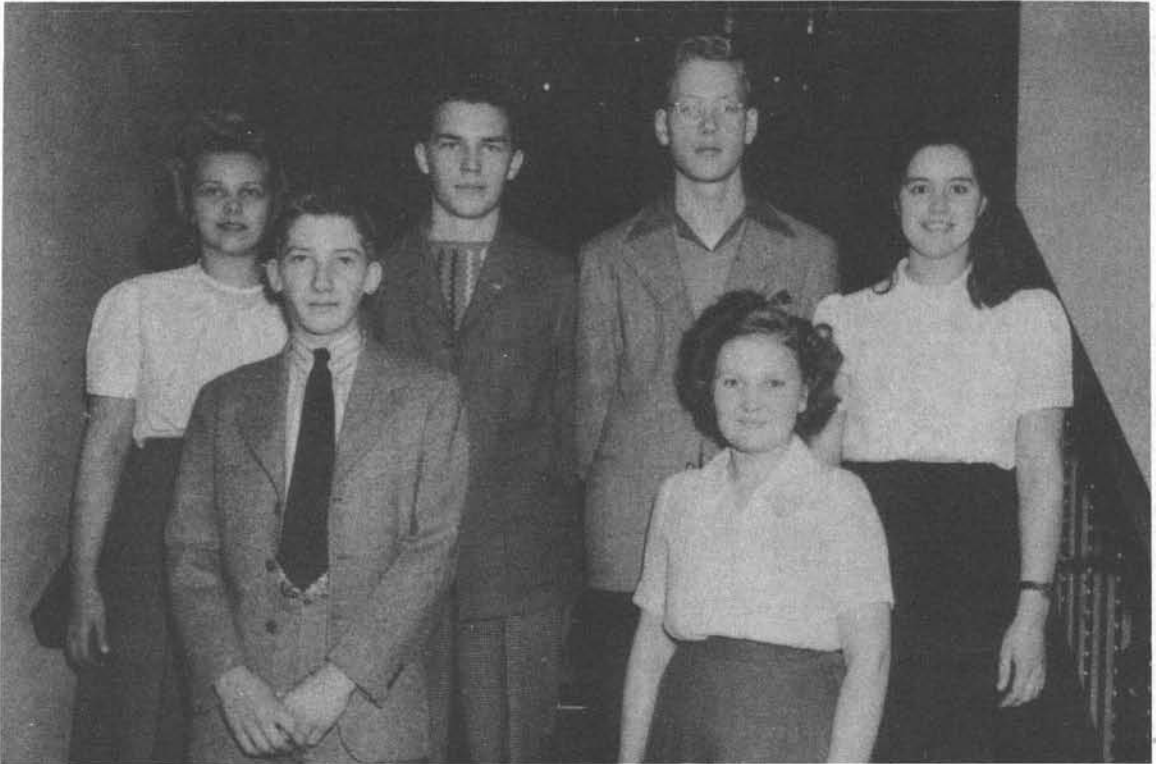

But a small portion of the club membership is represented in the above picture.

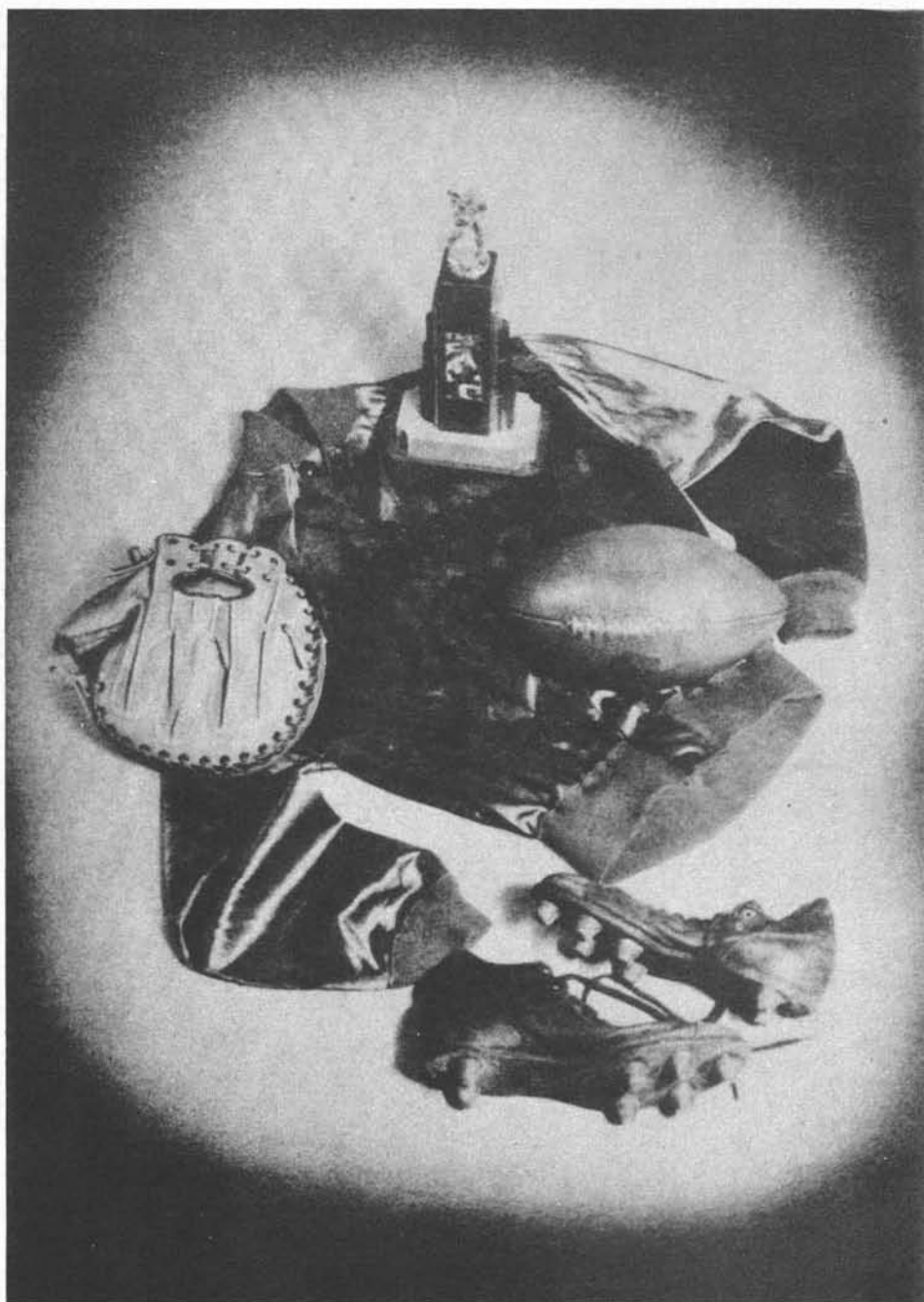

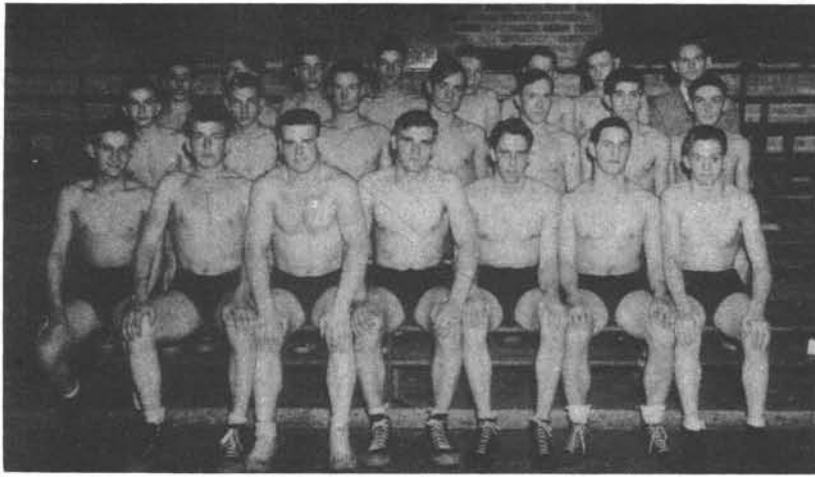
