

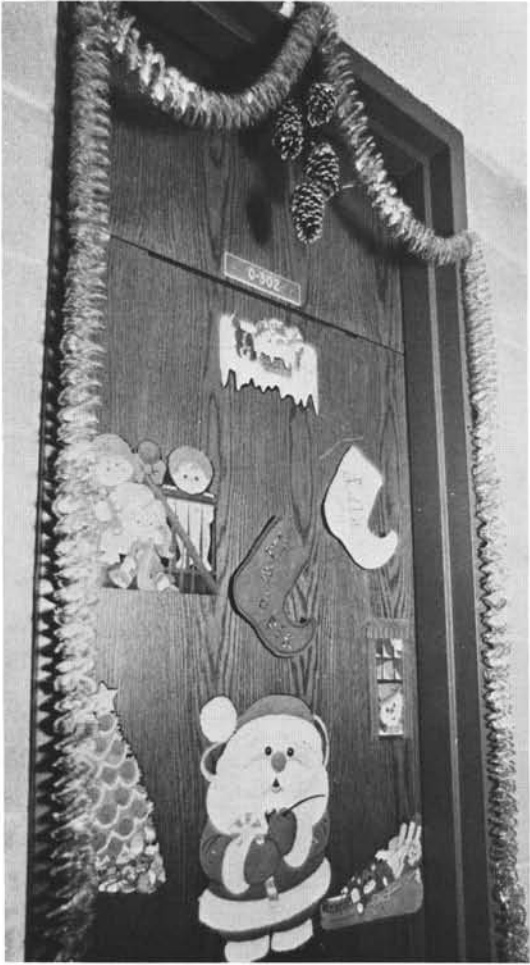

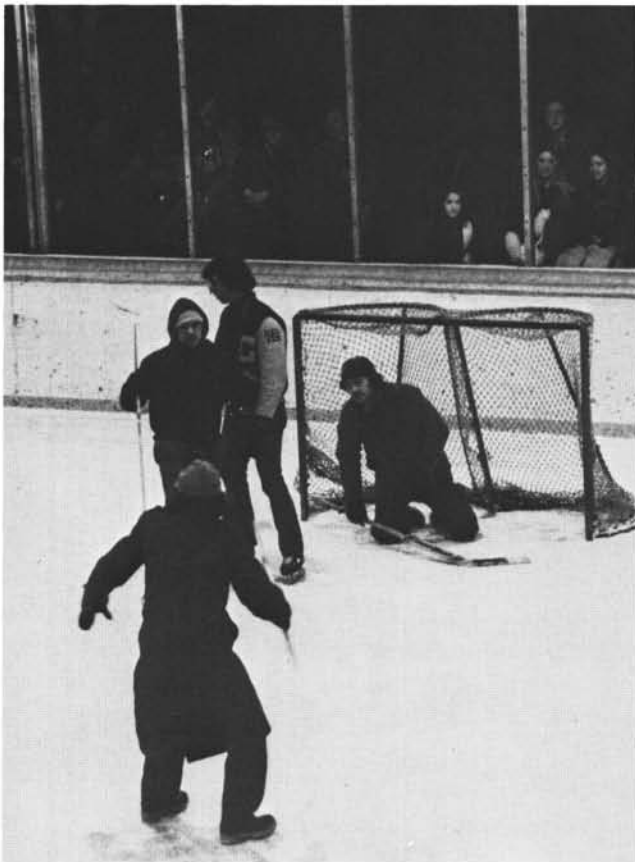
Snodays

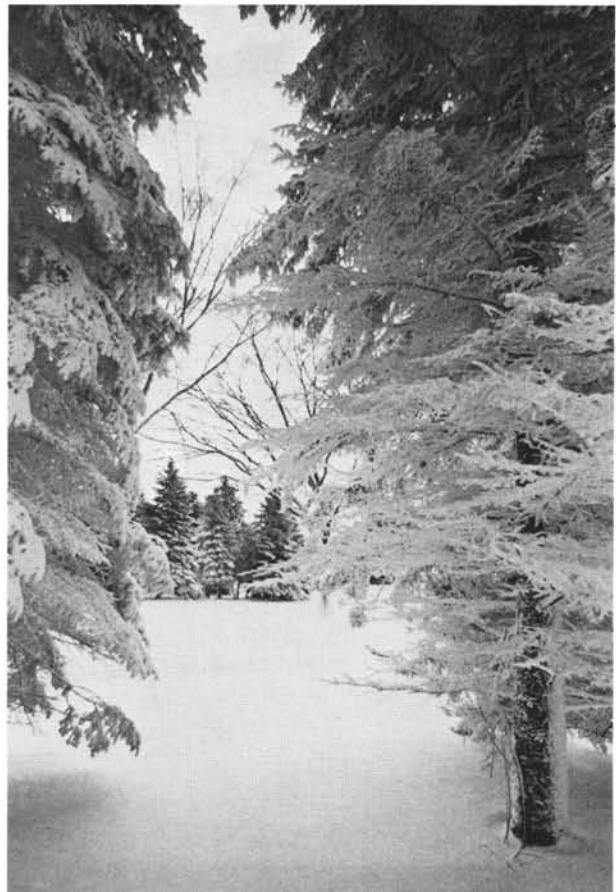

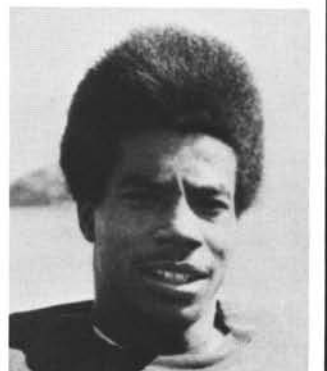

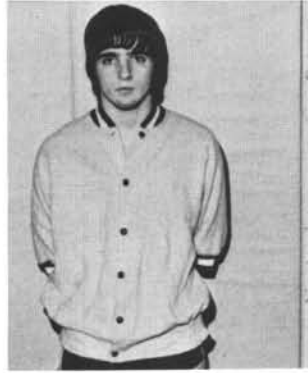

Starting right, the team defeated Mayville 28-0 and continued on to obtain a 9-0 record for the season.

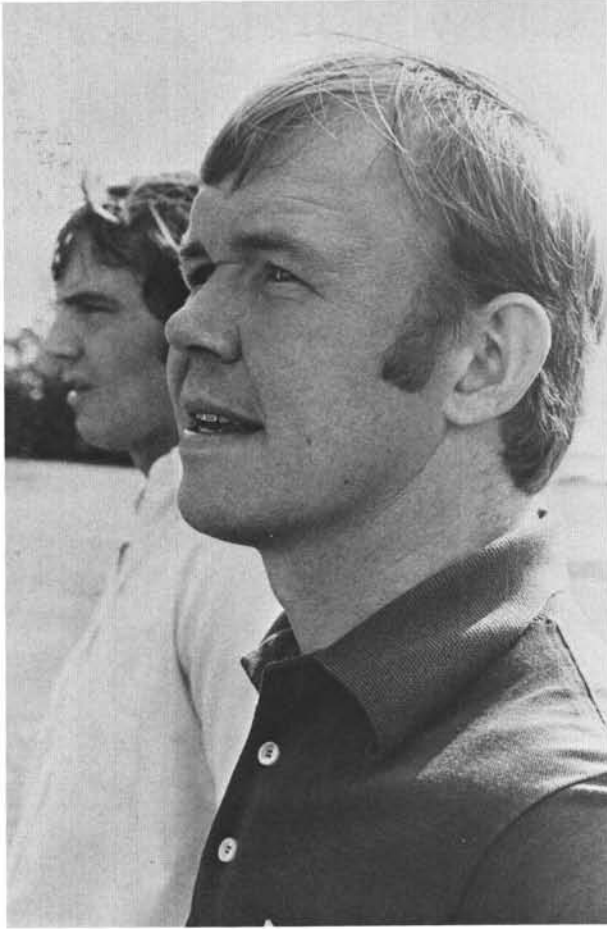
Coach Ramey was picked as the 1973 Football Coach of the Year.

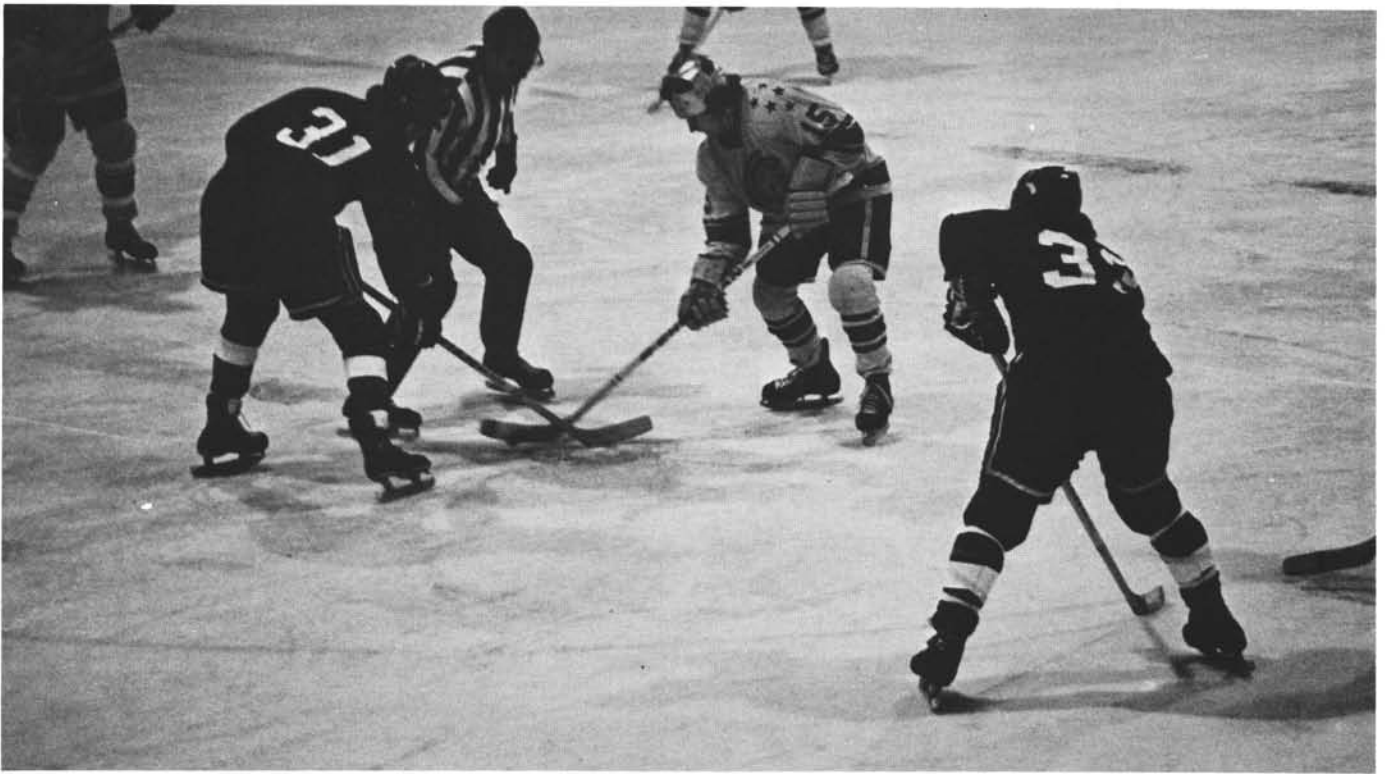

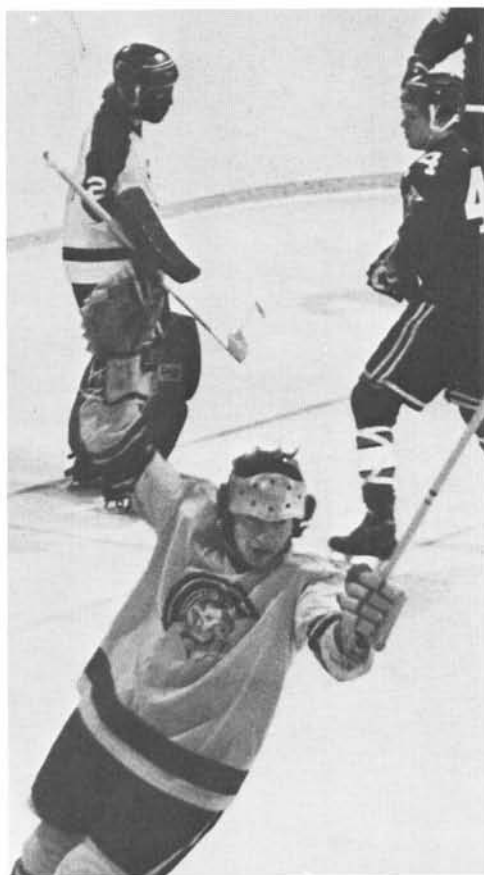

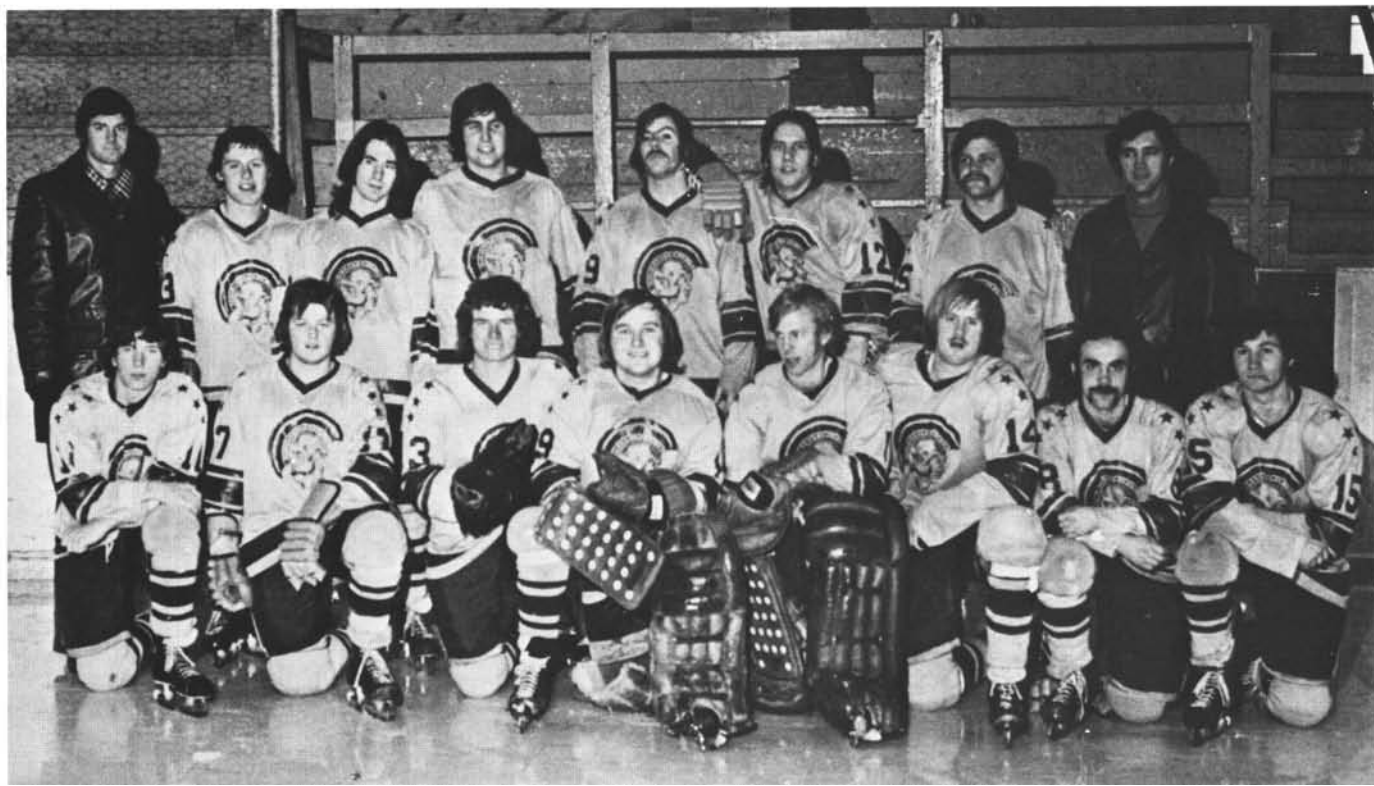

Andy Kelson was voted the team's most valuable player. He also received awards as a member of the All-State Team and second team of the All-Region.

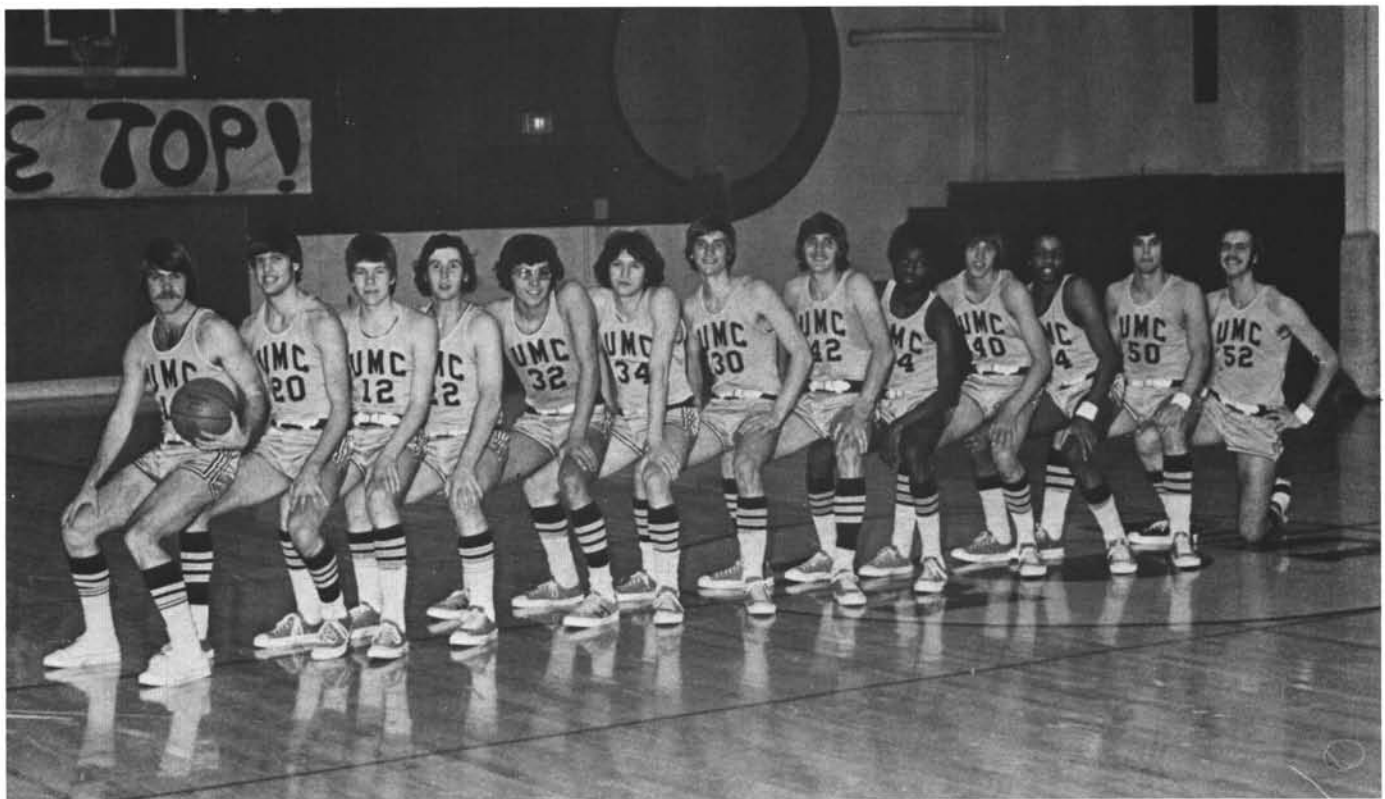

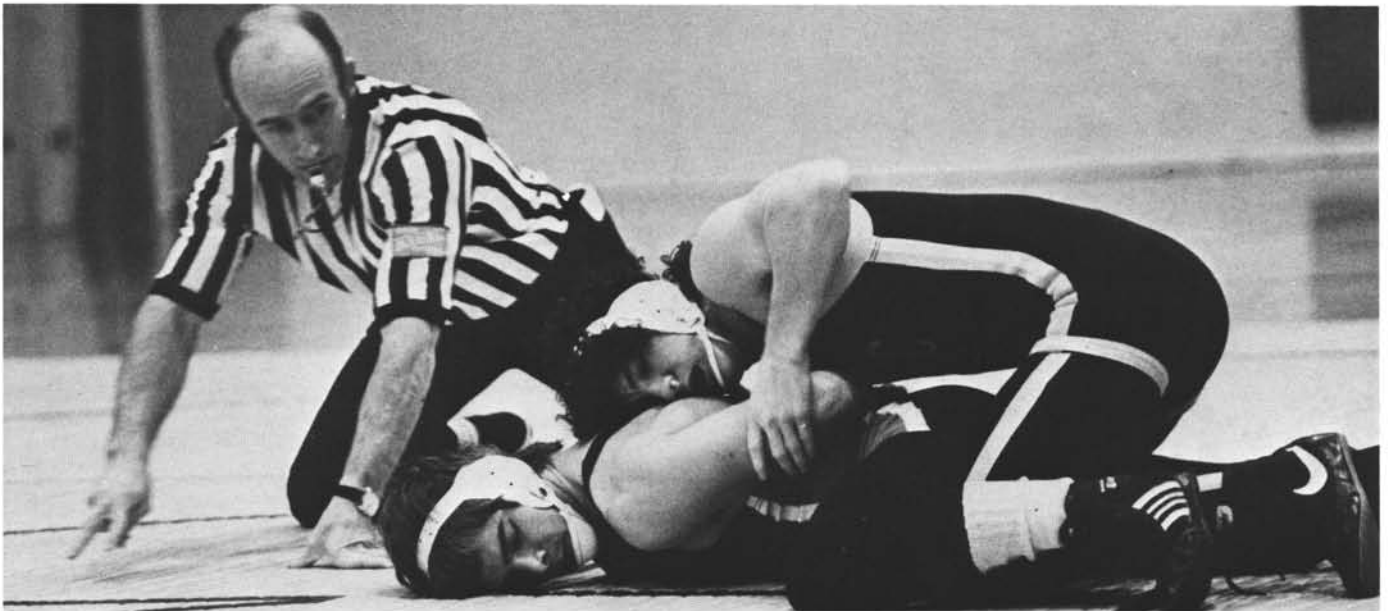

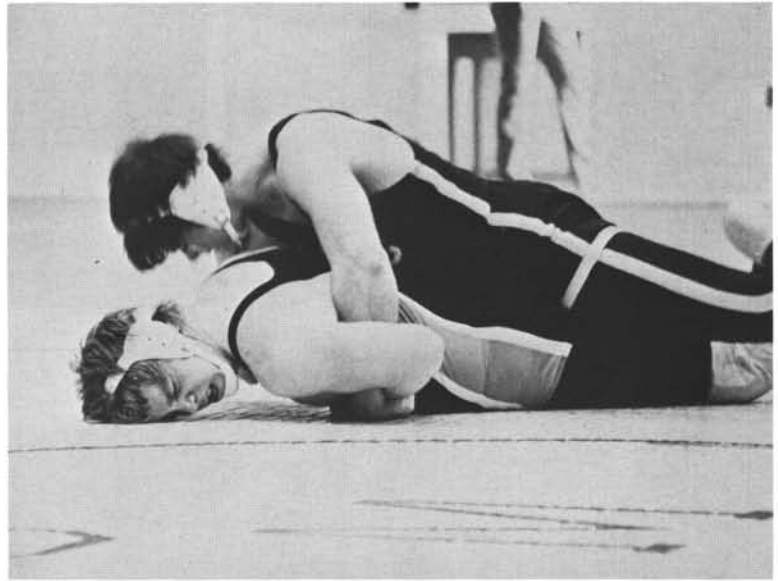
UMC's Wrestling team took the Northern Conference for the third straight year and went on to place second in the State Championship. Five wrestlers went on to compete in nationals.

Director Al Filipi supervises make-up application before performance of the fall play "A Company of Wayward Saints."

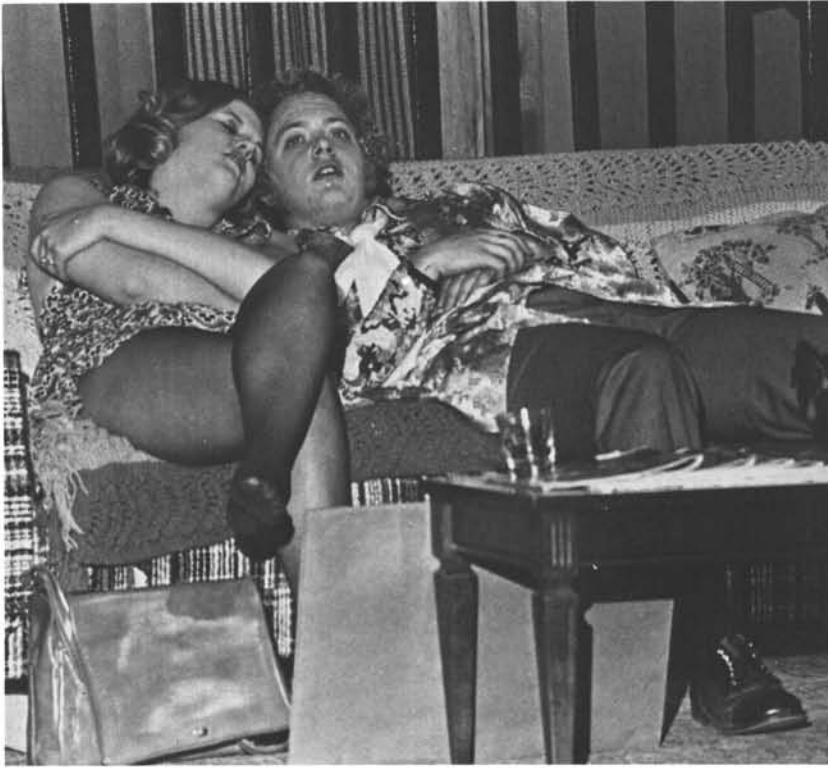

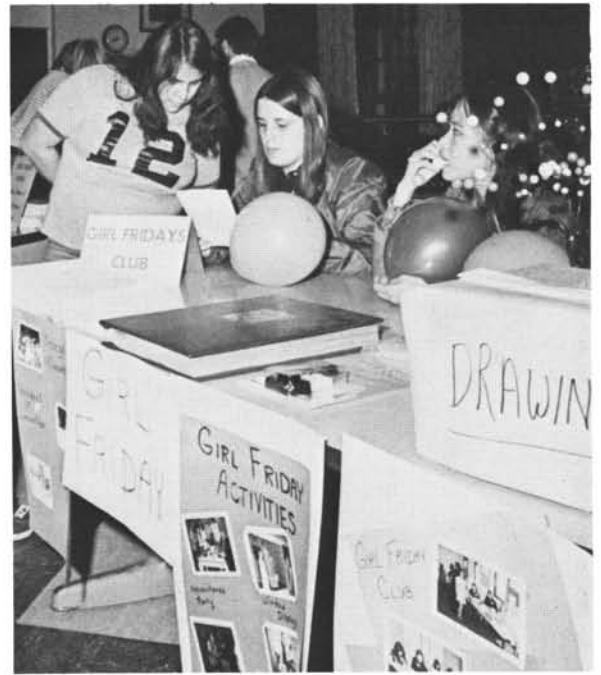


Girl Fridays

Campus ministry sponsored numerous activities throughout the year. Campouts were held at Maple Lake, rap sessions with local clergy and recreational activities kept interested students busy.



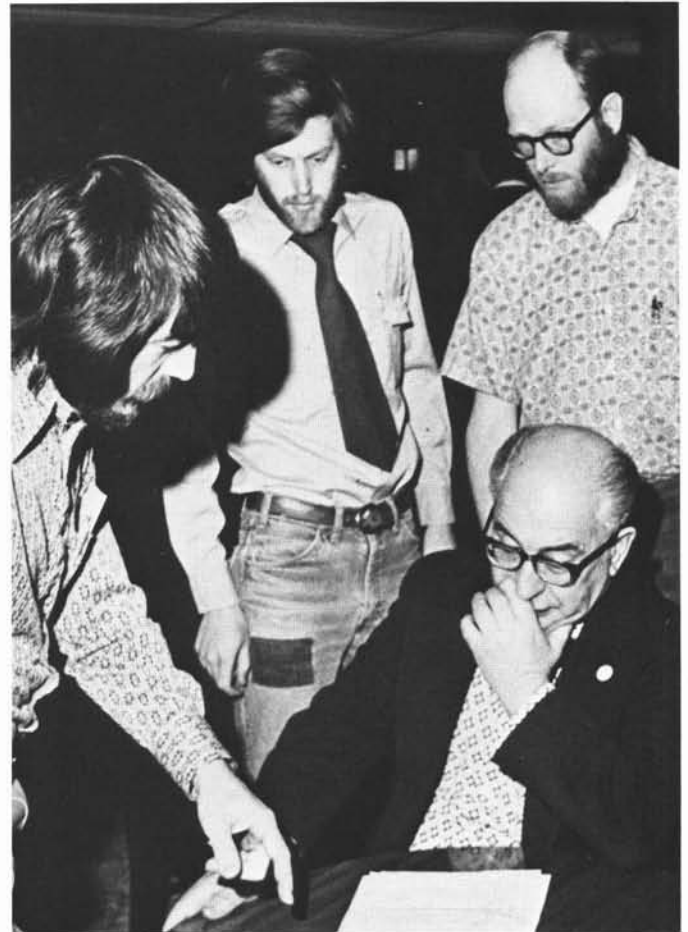

Park and Rec, Conservation

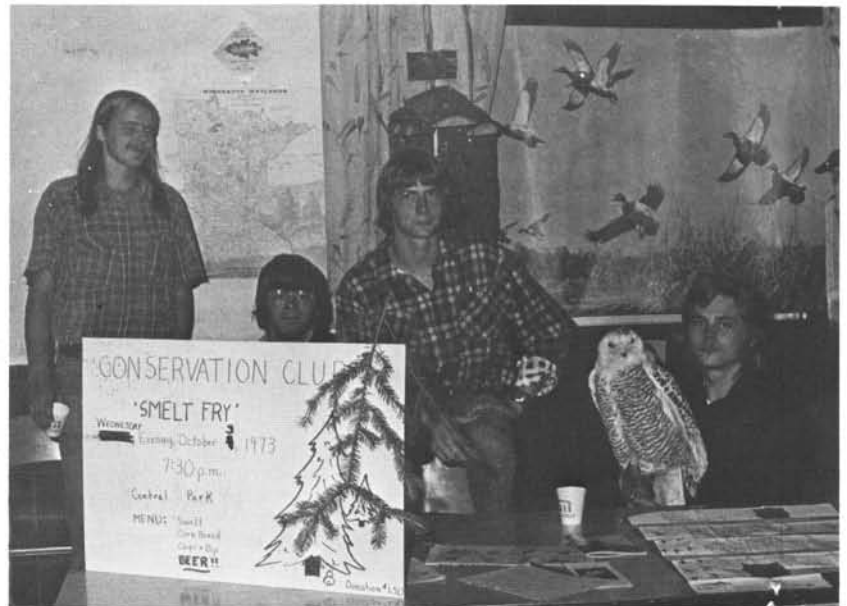


In recognition of Arbor Day, May 2, the Hort Club planted a tree on the UMC campus.

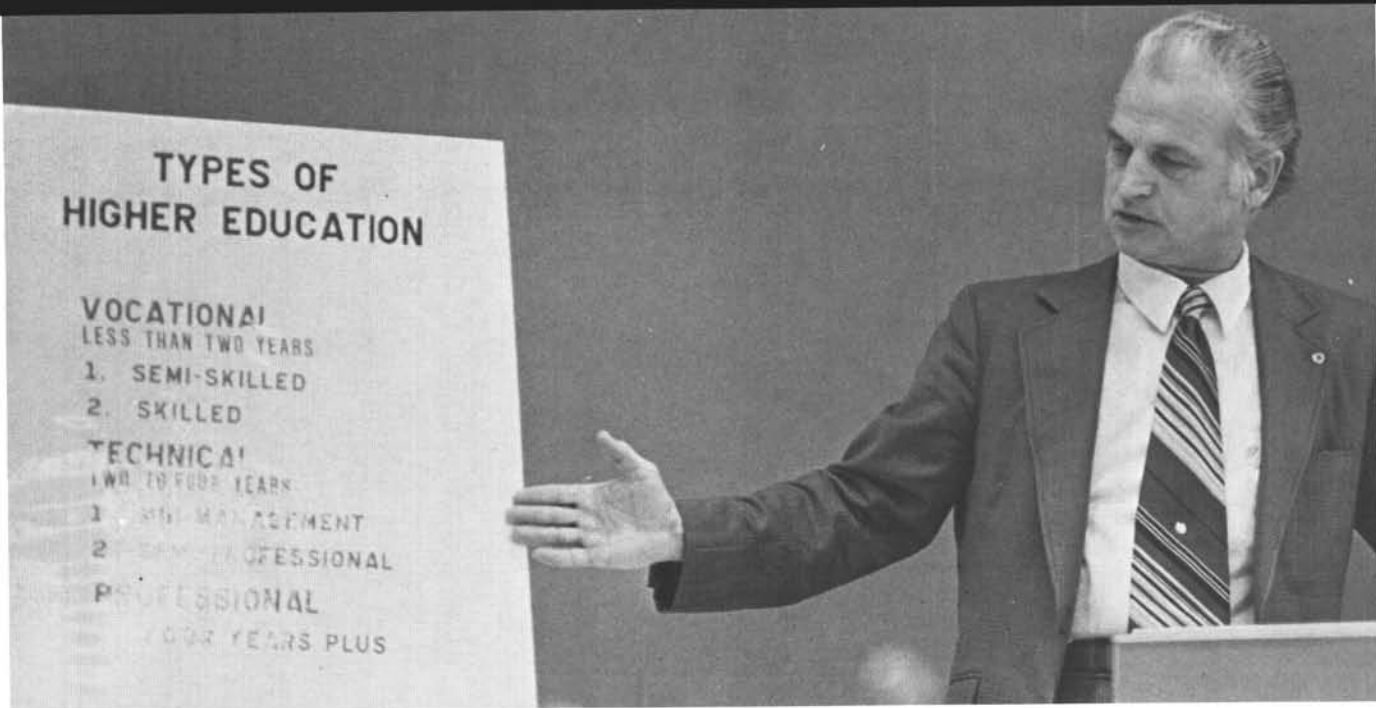

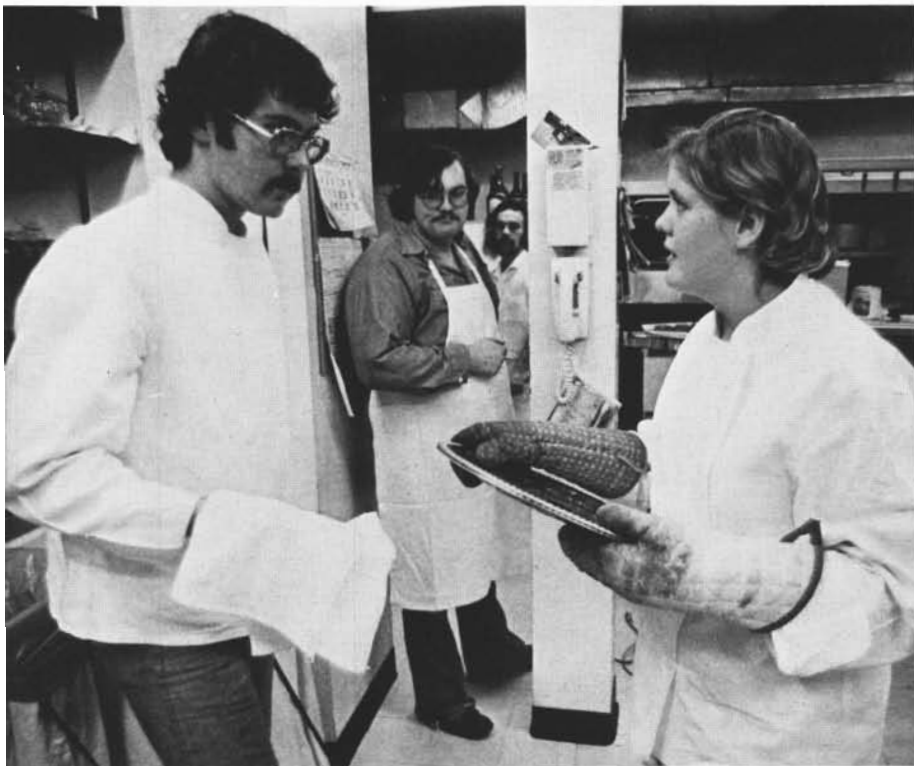
HRI Faculty

HRI (Hotel, Restaurant and Institutional Mgmt.) provides training for employment in the hospitality industry.

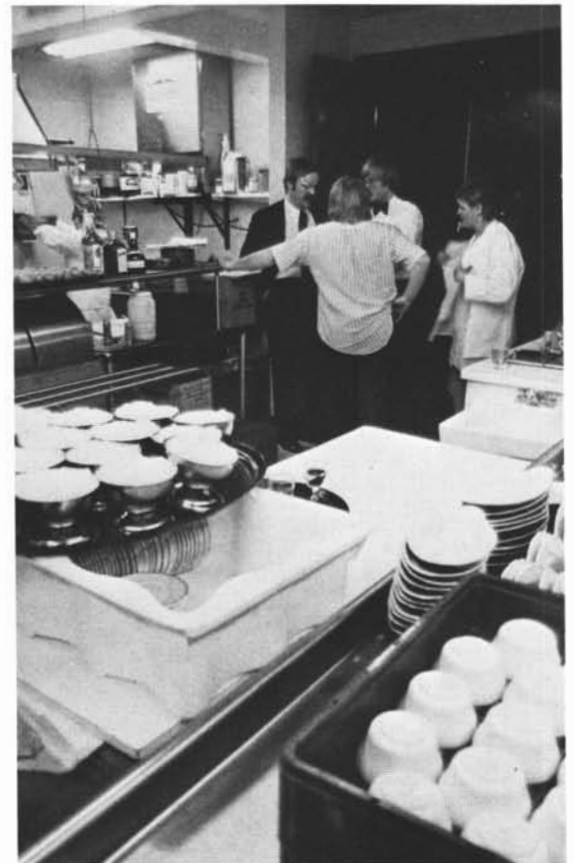
Students majoring in HRI learn food preparation and service as well as business and human relations skills.

Guest speakers throughout the year also provided students an opportunity to learn about their field.

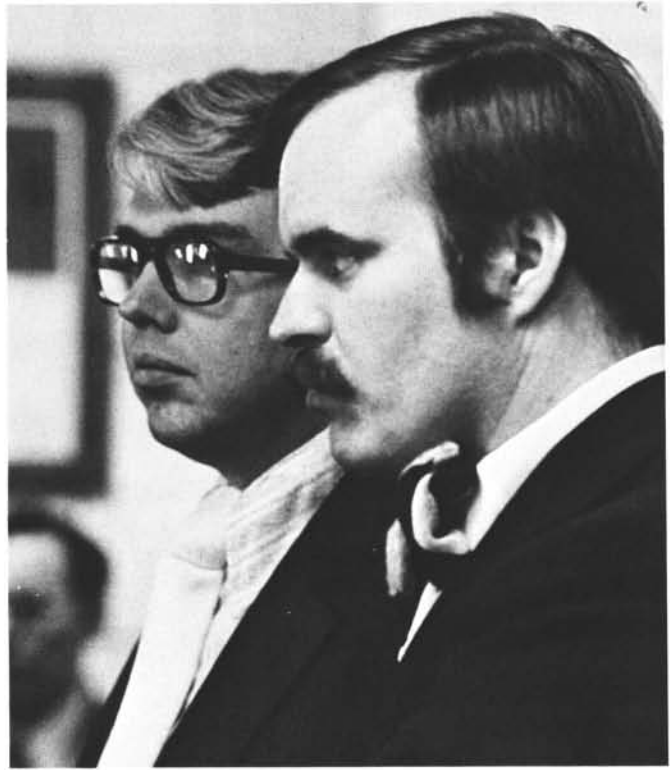
