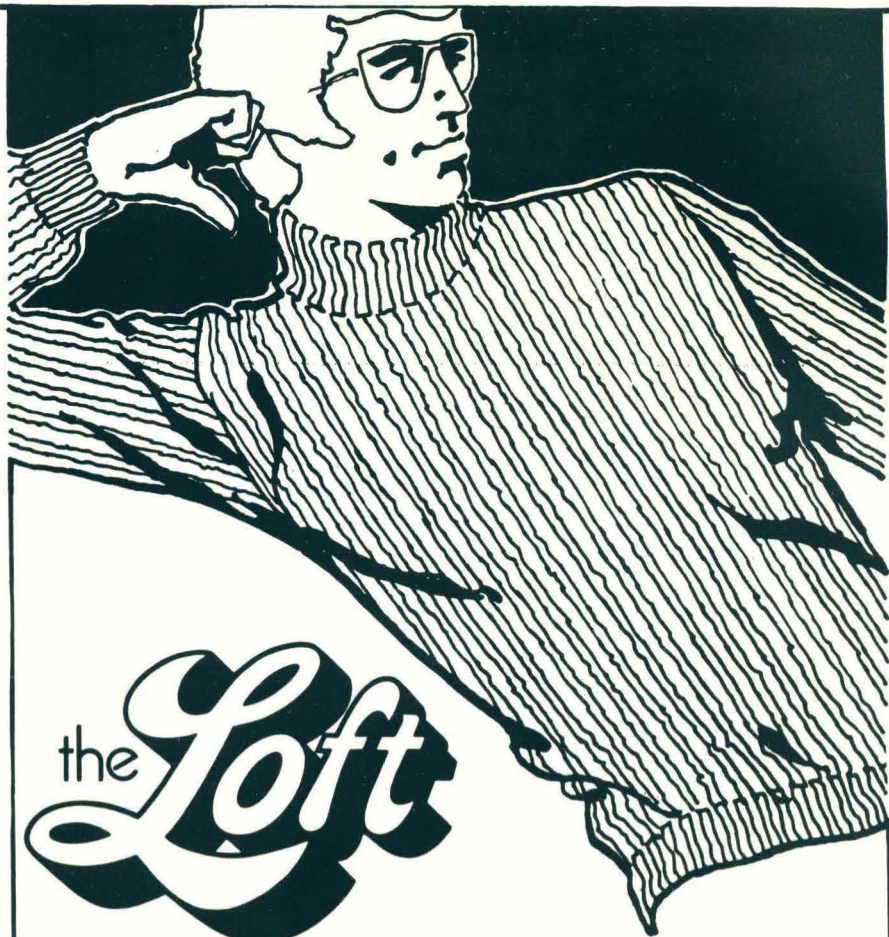

The campus, developed since UMD's establishment in 1947, represents an investment of more than \$43 million in land and buildings. Among new structures scheduled to open during this academic year are the Performing Arts building, a residence hall dining area, a 312-student apartment building near the Griggs Stadium and a new Classroom-Laboratory building. Ground was broken this summer for a \$1.7 million Physical Education Fieldhouse, just south of the stadium.

UMD offers its students opportunities both in and out of the classroom. Taking advantage of the unique and beautiful Northern Minnesota environment, UMD offers such classes as sailing on Lake Superior, winter-time ski courses on the campus ski hill, biology study at the natural arboretum and the man-made lake on campus, a summer biology tour using a mobile laboratory, geology field trips and others. There are also increasing opportunities for students to pursue internships with community agencies for college credit. Complementing the academics is a full program of extra-curricular activities ranging from intramurals to music organizations to 100 special interest student groups. The Kirby Student Center features several lounge and recreation areas where a host of programs and events are scheduled weekly by the student program board.

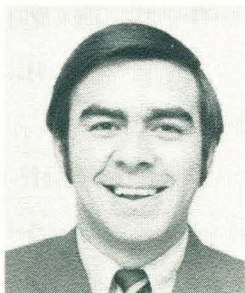

The Coach



After three years at the Bulldog helm, Terry Shercliffe has established a record of solid consistency and growth.

But Shercliffe has higher aspirations for UMD hockey and hopes that 1973-74 will be the year the Bulldogs move from solid to strong.

"We have great support," said Shercliffe, "and hope we can provide excitement and success this season."

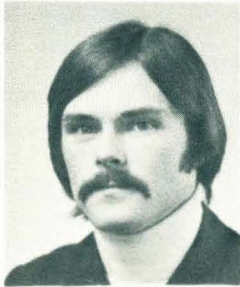
A native of Regina, Sask., Shercliffe was a three-year letterman for Bulldogs' hockey team while attending UMD. He captained the squad in his senior year and was voted UMD's Outstanding Senior Athlete Award in 1964-65.

Shercliffe won a B.S. degree in physical education at UMD and following graduation, he became head hockey coach and physical education instructor at Osseo, where Shercliffe established himself as a hard-working, winning coach. Former UMD coach and current Athletic Director Ralph Romano persuaded Shercliffe to return to his alma mater as assistant coach, a position he held for four years. He also became an instructor in UMD's physical education department.

As an assistant coach Shercliffe was placed in charge of recruiting and brought in the best talent from the United States and Canada ever assembled at UMD.

While recruiting keeps him busy during the off season, Shercliffe also is featured speaker at countless post-season banquets and get togethers, as he tries to communicate with as many young hockey players as possible during such engagements. He has started a highly successful summer hockey school and was instrumental in establishing the growing Jr. Bulldog Club.

Assistant Coach



The appointment of Chuck Whalen as assistant hockey coach has been met with outstanding acceptance among Bulldog supporters.

"I am very fortunate to have someone of Chuck's ability and background as part of my staff," said head mentor Terry Shercliffe. "He has an outstanding knowledge of the game."

Whalen, a former UMD goaltender, has had playing experience with the Green Bay Bobcats of the United States Hockey League and includes a tryout with the Minnesota Fighting Saints in his background.

Although only 24 years old, Chuck feels his hockey playing days are behind and coaching and education are his future.

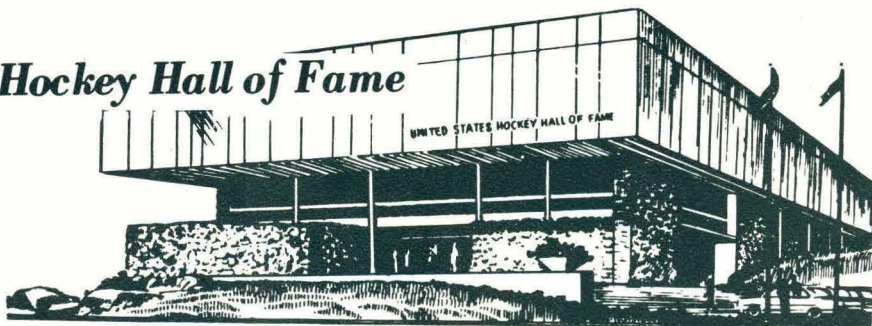

U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame



"Hockey has done so much for so many people and it's time we've put something back into it. The Hall of Fame is just that."

So spoke Minnesota North Stars President Walter L. Bush, Jr. at the dedication and initial enshrinement ceremonies of the United States Hockey Hall of Fame on June 21, 1973 in Eveleth, Minnesota. A six year dream for the people of Eveleth, the State of Minnesota, and the United States was culminated on that date when under cloudy skies and cool temperatures the Hall made its way onto the American sports scene. Twenty-five former American hockey greats, including collegians Hobey Baker (Princeton), John Chase (Harvard), John Garrison (Harvard), Myles Lane (Dartmouth), "Ding" Palmer (Yale), and coaches Eddie Jeremiah (Dartmouth) and Alfred Winsor (Harvard), were formally inducted into the Hall, while key speakers Minnesota's hockey Governor Wendell Anderson and Walter Bush delivered the main addresses to overflow crowds.

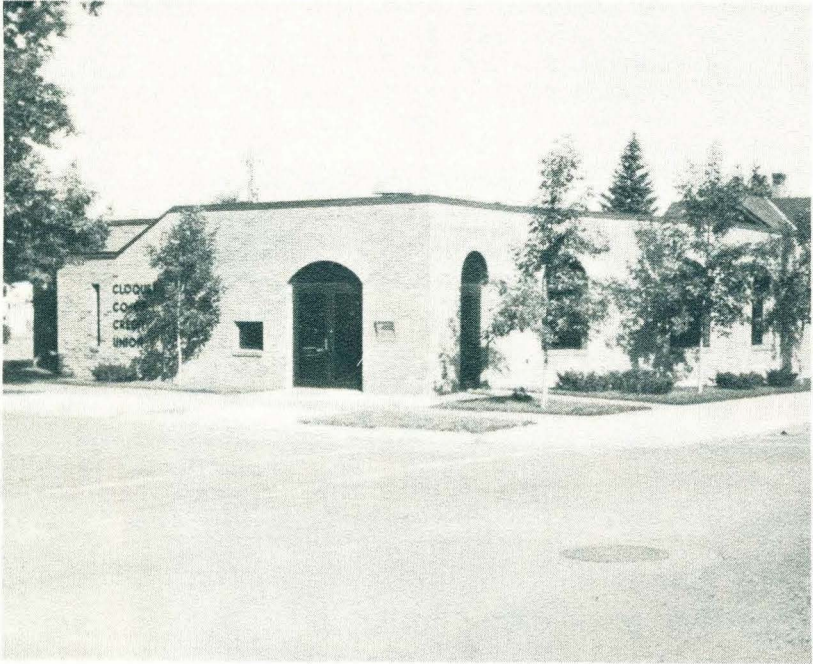
Each of the twenty-five enshrinees has a "pylon" on the main floor of the Hall which contains his biography and photograph. The "pylons" are particularly unique as they are unlike the bust or painting found in most such facilities. The other principal display area is found on the second floor where there are areas devoted to hockey as played at the high school/private school, college, amateur, international, and professional levels. There is also an area dealing with the origins of the game and a miscellaneous information gallery on various facets of hockey: rinks, fans, etc.

Movies are shown four times daily in the theater and you can pick up a memento of your favorite team in the souvenir shop. The United States Hockey Hall of Fame is located on Highway 53 in Eveleth (60 miles north of Duluth) and is open 9 am - 5 pm Monday thru Saturday and noon - 5 pm Sundays. Plan a visit on your next vacation and learn the story of America's hockey heritage.

This Week's Series

“At this point in the season every game is of equal importance,” said Michigan Wolverine coach Dan Farrell of this weekend’s clash with the UMD Bulldogs. Perhaps the most important factor of the series is that either team will move up in the WCHA with a sweep, as both are tied in seventh place in the WCHA with Notre Dame. All three teams have identical 7-10-1

records in the conference, and both UMD and Michigan hold identical 13-10-1 overall slates.

“We would like a road victory as we haven’t been able to sweep at home yet,” added the first year Farrell, a 1960 graduate of Michigan Tech. “It’ll be a close race for the other seven play-off spots.”

Farrell has done more so far this season for the Wolverines than the total of last year as Michigan finished in the WCHA cellar last year with a 4-25-1 slate. The Wolverine fans, who are viewing their hockey team this year in a new ice arena, appear to like their new mentor as a great fan support is evident in the new Yost Ice Arena.

The basic Wolverine problem is that of needing to score more goals. "I've been juggling the lines all season and will continue to do so until I find the right scoring punch," Farrell stated. He also would like to have a tighter defense to help out Robbie Moore, the Wolverine sophomore goalie.

In the last two weeks, Michigan split series with Wisconsin and with Minnesota. Last week's action saw the Wolverines lose to the Gophers 4-2 Friday night, after pacing Minnesota with a 2-1 lead early in the contest. Saturday's game gave Michigan a come-from-behind thriller, as the Wolverines

turned a 3-0 deficit into a 5-3 victory. Moore, who suffered a concussion in the Wisconsin series, turned aside 80 shots in the Gopher series. All seven series goals were provided by different Michigan personnel, thus indicating that perhaps Farrell has found the balanced scoring that he has been looking for all season.

Leading the Wolverines in WCHA scoring is center Angie Moretto with nine goals and 12 assists, which gives him 21 total points (30 points overall). Next is Don Fardig with 8 goals and 10 assists in the league, for 18 total points (26 overall). Third place is shared by Kris Manery (7-7) and Bob Falconer (8-6). Goalie Robbie Moore has established a 4.1 goals against average in the WCHA, while overall he has a 3.9 average.

"We're a young team," concluded Farrell, "but we're trying to turn the tide and come back after being down for the last three years."

Next Home Series

February 22 and 23 will give the Bulldogs another chance to topple the WCHA leader as Michigan Tech invades the Duluth Arena. Currently, the Huskies are riding the top spot with a 13-3-2 record, after turning back former leader Denver 7-5, 3-0 last weekend.

In UMD's first WCHA series of the 1973-74 season Michigan Tech posted 10-1 and 4-1 victories in games played at Houghton. The newly improved edition of the Bulldogs will no doubt be trying to reverse the scores with the Huskies.

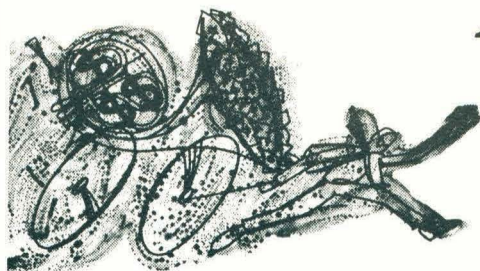
