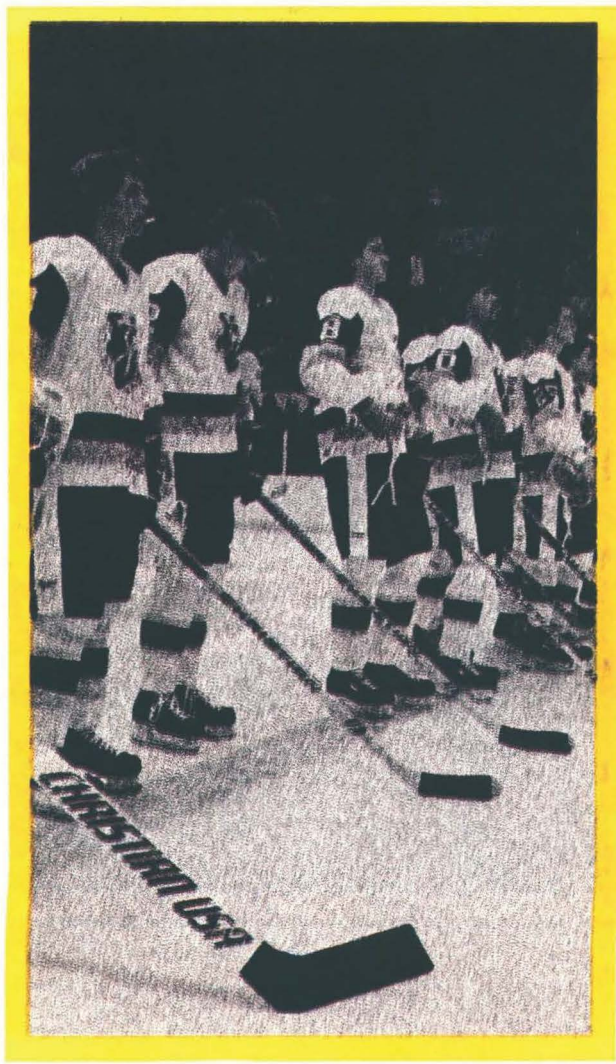


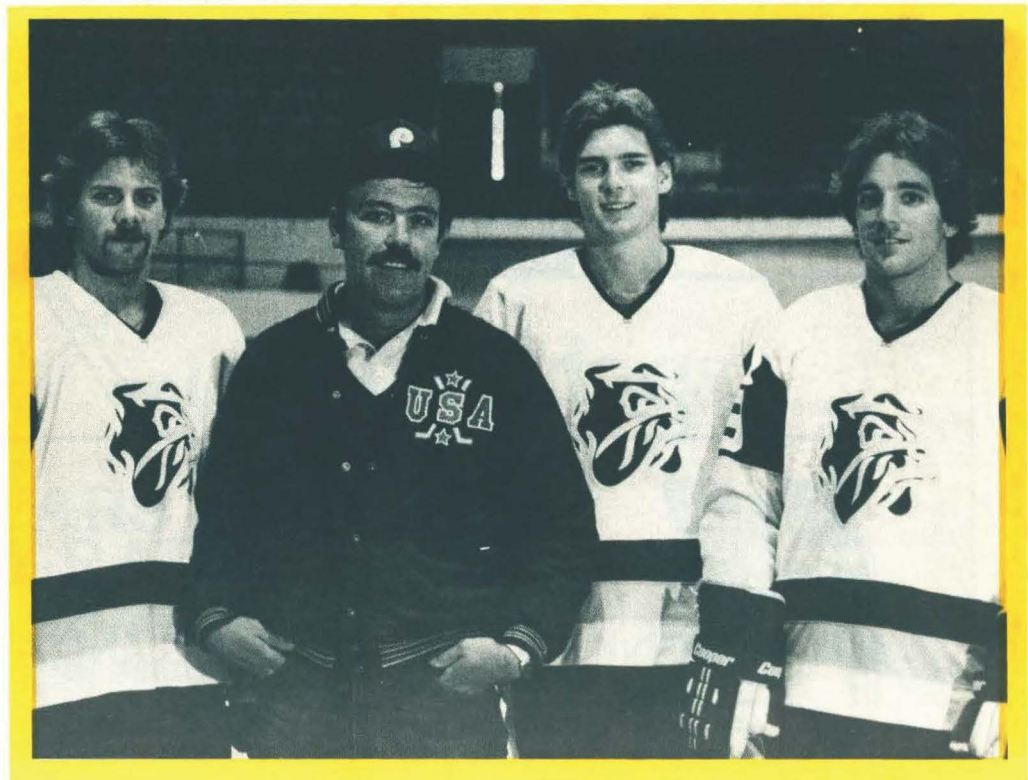

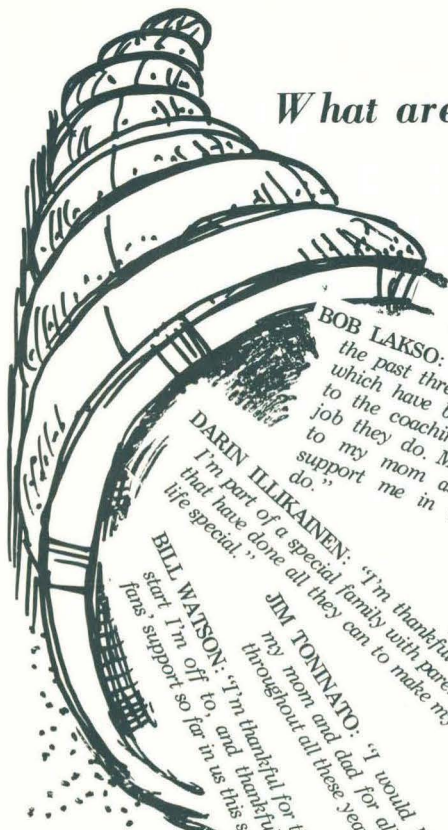

SKEETER MOORE: "I'm thankful for a healthy year so far along with my family and very special relatives, and my friends in Duluth."

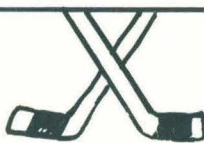

about UMD

There has been one overriding characteristic about the University of Minnesota, Duluth (UMD) that hasn't changed in all of its 36 years — that characteristic is "growth."

Before UMD became a coordinate campus of the University of Minnesota in 1947, the site of the present day campus was nothing more than brush and woods. By the early 1950s, though, the campus was already taking shape with the Science Building (now called the Chemistry Building) and the Physical Education Building in place. Administrators had a far-reaching campus plan for UMD's orderly development to 1970. The plan envisioned a student body of 3,500 by 1970. More than 5,000 students actually were enrolled by then.

Today, as indicated by this year's enrollment of 7,500 plus students, UMD continues its steady growth. This year marks programmatic developments for the school as well. In the past state legislature session, funds were approved for the establishment of up to three four-year engineering degree programs at UMD as well as the creation of a natural resources research center. The first of the engineering programs, computer engineering, is expected to enroll students in the fall of 1984.

The school also offers more instructional programs than ever for both undergraduate and graduate students in five colleges and schools with major fields of study in everything from natural sciences and social sciences to the humanities and fine arts. UMD offers two years of basic science in the School of Medicine, with students transferring to the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities School of Medicine following satisfactory completion of UMD's program.

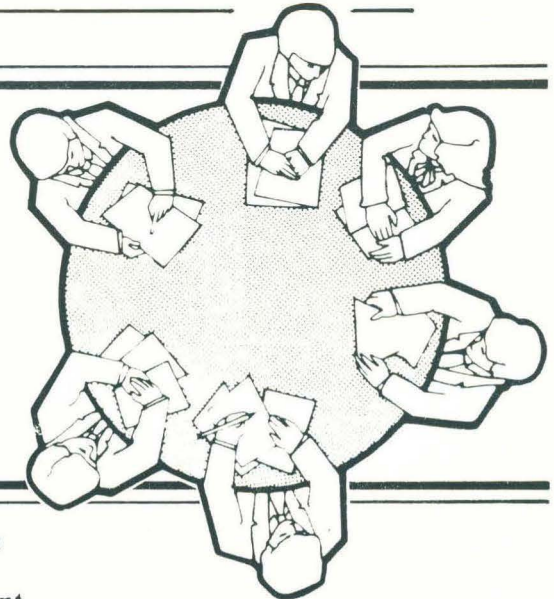
Students choose from 75 undergraduate majors and courses. UMD offers four associate (two-year) degrees, 10 bachelor's degrees, six master's degrees in 17 fields and has programs leading to teacher licensure in 41 areas.

The campus, situated in an appealing residential area overlooking Lake Superior, has facilities that are unique to the area with 35 major buildings in all, including the renowned Tweed Museum of Art, the modernistic Marshall Performing Arts Center and the Marshall W. Alworth Planetarium.

UMD's 36 years of continued growth is a prime example of the area's commitment to quality higher education.

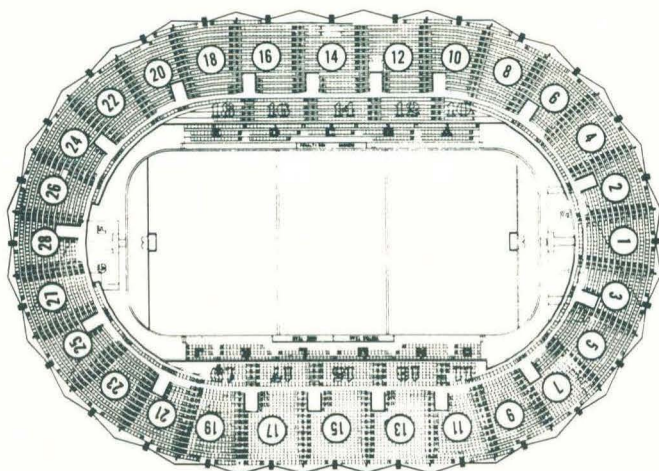
FIRST AID AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE: In case of illness or an accident, contact the nearest attendant or police officer.

"WILL CALL" TICKET BOOTH: The "Will Call" ticket booth is located in the main lobby of the Arena.

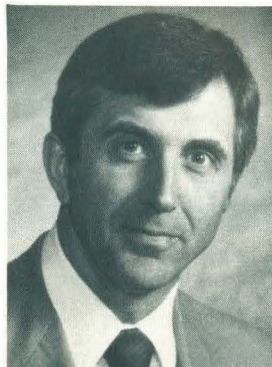
PUBLIC ADDRESS: Personal announcements are made over address system only in cases of gravest emergency.

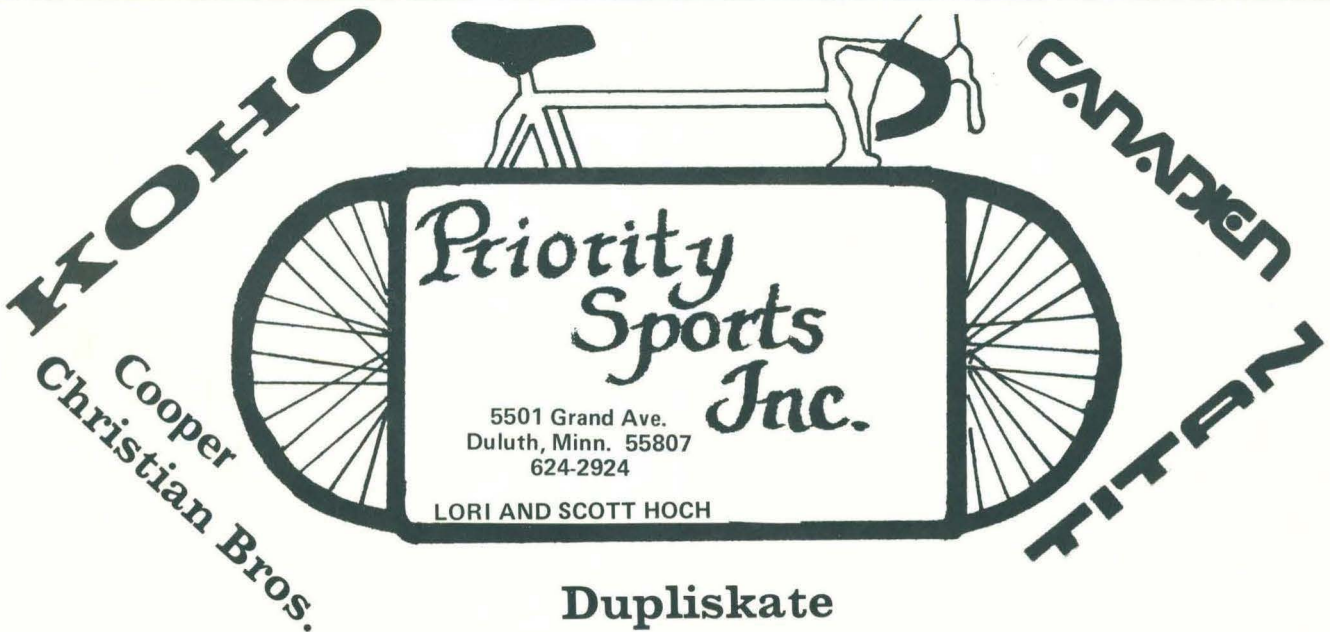

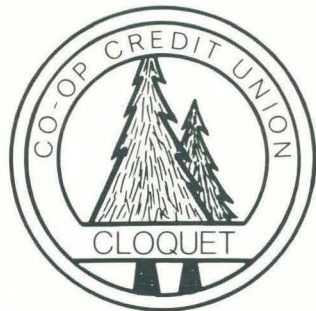

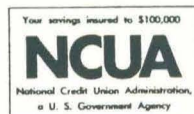

the athletic staff

UMD operates a 15-sport athletic program under the jurisdiction of Athletic Director Ralph Romano. Thirteen of those sports compete at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II level while the hockey team is a Division I member and the men's basketball team plays in the National Association for Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

UMD has a history of outstanding achievements in its program. For example, the Bulldog football program has the 10th best record of all NCAA II teams in the country over the past decade. The volleyball team won six straight state tournaments and has qualified for national post-season play on numerous

occasions. The hockey team was one of only eight teams in the nation to be invited to the NCAA National Tournament last year. And many Bulldog individuals have been accorded national All-American honors.

Romano's leadership has been the catalyst for the success of the Bulldog athletic program. A native of Fort William, Ontario, he migrated to Duluth while in high school and later was a three-time letterman as a goalie with the UMD hockey team. He served as a navigator during a three-year stint in the Air Force, and worked on the sports staff of the Duluth Herald & News-Tribune before returning to UMD in 1959 as ticket manager, business manager, sports publicity director, and head hockey coach.

In his nine years as hockey coach, Romano is credited with developing the UMD program into Division I-caliber status as well as gaining the Bulldogs induction into the WCHA. He is regarded by his peers today as one of the most respected college athletic leaders in the country, and serves on national committees.

Romano gave up coaching in 1968 to become UMD's assistant athletic director, and he was promoted the following year with the retirement of his predecessor, Lloyd Peterson.

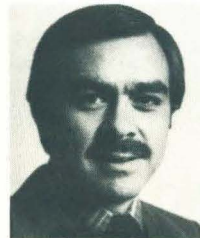
One of his first moves in 1969 was to pluck Bruce McLeod from the graduating class at UMD to become his business manager. Since then, McLeod, who was a Bulldog hockey star in the late '60's, has served in various capacities in the Department, and he is now the assistant athletic director.

Linda Larson is the Coordinator of Women's Athletics at UMD, handling many of the operational responsibilities that has brought the UMD women's athletic program to the forefront. She is also the women's head basketball coach.

Dukes Knutson has assumed some administrative duties this year after joining the staff last year as sports information director. A former teacher and coach at Denfeld High School in Duluth, Knutson still oversees the sports information office, which now includes a newcomer to the staff, Bob Nygaard, a 1983 graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. Nygaard was a student sports information assistant both at UMD and UW-Eau Claire while going to school.

Kathy Nelson is in charge of managing the ticket sales at UMD. She was hired five years ago as secretary, moved into the business office, and has now taken over the responsibility of sale and distribution of all tickets.

The newest member of the UMD Athletic Department family is Sue MacDonald, who was hired as the business manager in October.



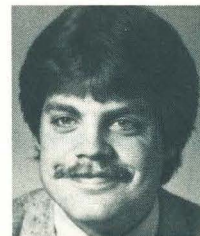

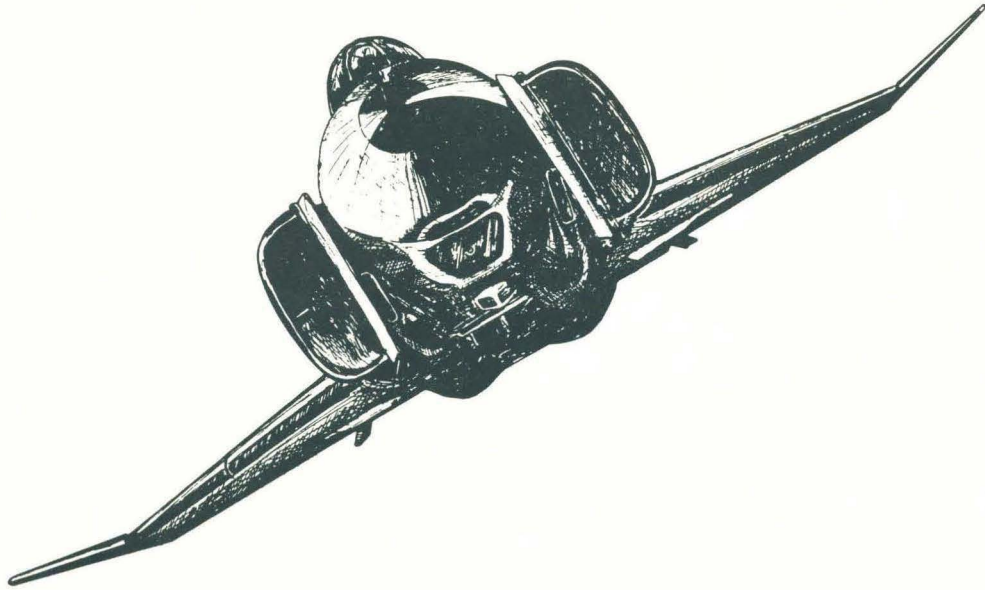

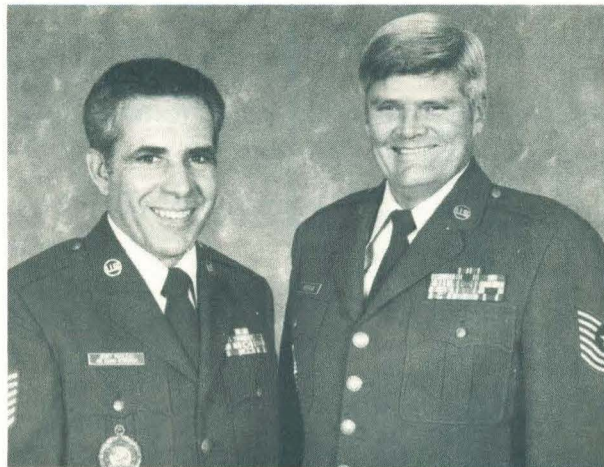

March 19, 1983. The Bulldogs' "Cinderella season" had just come to an end as Providence College completed a two-game sweep in the NCAA championship quarterfinals.

After the team exchanged customary handshakes, the Bulldogs lined up at center ice and hoisted their sticks into the air in an international salute of good will. The partisan Providence fans stood, somewhat dazed by such an extraordinary act of sportsmanship following such a bitter defeat, and reciprocated the Bulldogs' gesture with a standing ovation.

The Bulldogs' salute was more than a class act. It represented a genuine attitude that had carried a team which had only two winning seasons in 19 previous WCHA campaigns to its best season in modern history and its first invitation to the NCAA championships. It was indeed an act of thanksgiving.

And despite the stinging blow of that last defeat in 1982-83 on Providence ice, there in the middle of the line with a proud smile on his face was Coach Mike Sertich.

When Mike Sertich was named the Bulldogs' 10th head hockey coach in the spring of 1982, he insisted that

his reign be characterized by two things. "If there's anything I've learned in life, I've learned the importance of having pride—pride in oneself, and in our case, pride in our team. And I also want each person associated with our program—the players, coaches, administration, and the fans—to have fun. I think the two go hand-in-hand. If you have pride in yourself and in what you're doing, you're bound to have fun, too."

That's the philosophy that made Mike Sertich the Coach of the Year in the WCHA in 1982-83, his first opportunity to serve as a head coach after 14 seasons as an assistant, seven at Grand Rapids High School and seven at UMD. As the '82-83 season wound down, the talk circulating around the league was that Sertich was a shoe-in for Coach of the Year laurels, even though the Bulldogs finished fourth in the six-team WCHA, and Wisconsin won both the league and NCAA championships. His contribution to UMD hockey—and to college hockey in general—was that evident to everyone close to the game.

In typical Sertich fashion, he almost apologetically accepts the Coach of the Year tag. "It's the kids," he persists. "They're the ones who do the work on the ice. It was their effort that made our success possible last year."

Sertich's handling of the last year's squad can be described as "father-like," and he's had plenty of practice in that role model. He is truly a family-oriented man and he and his wife, Audie, have three children—Scott, 15; John, 13; and Lori, 6.

As a player himself for the Bulldogs from 1966-1969, Sertich was used some as a forward but more as a defenseman. In again bringing out one of Sertich's most noticeable and respected qualities—a tremendous sense of humor—he often jokes about his scoring prowess at UMD—history records that the only goal of his career came against Tony Esposito, one of the best goalies ever to play in the National Hockey League!

Following his graduation from UMD, Sertich landed his first teaching and coaching job at Grand Rapids, where he and head mentor Gus Hendrickson built a dynasty in the early '70's. In 1975, UMD officials persuaded both Hendrickson and Sertich to try their magic at the collegiate level, and Sertich was put in charge of recruiting.

He seriously considered leaving hockey after the 1981-82 season, and in fact had submitted his resignation. However, when the head coach position was opened up in the spring of 1982, Athletic Director Ralph Romano had just one man in mind to fill that vacancy, and Sertich was lured back.

His first campaign was completed with all the pride and fun that Sertich had hoped for, and last spring he was rewarded with a three-year contract. He quickly points out, however, that 1982-83 was a foundation, and not an end.

Jim Knapp knows he was a fortunate fellow when he landed a position as UMD's assistant hockey coach in 1982 after he was laid off as a teacher and coach at Aurora-Hoyt Lakes High School. But Knapp's fortune has turned into UMD's fortune as he has blossomed into Coach Sertich's "right-hand man."

Knapp received his hockey baptismal as an All-Conference and All-State defenseman at International Falls School under legendary Larry Ross. From there, he ventured to UMD where he was a steady and consistent performer on the blueline. As a senior, Knapp was honored with a Goldie Wolfe Most Inspirational Player Award.

Following graduation, Knapp accepted the position at Aurora-Hoyt Lakes, where he transformed the Blackhawk program from the depths of the Iron Range Conference cellar to a legitimate State-contending program.

His primary duties at UMD are to assist Coach Sertich at practices and behind the bench at games. He is also a physical education instructor at the university.

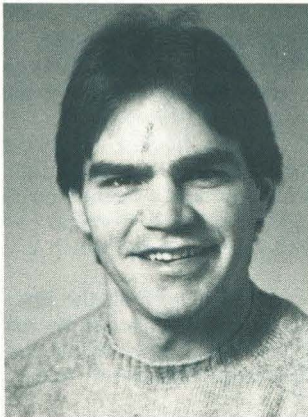

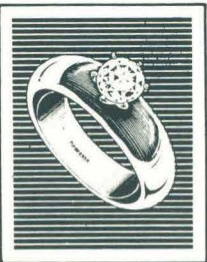

He won Most Improved and All-Around Team Player awards at Michigan State, where he was primarily a wing but sometimes a defenseman.

He is also an alumnus of Grand Rapids High School, and he led the Indians to the State Tournaments in 1973 and 1974.

Before coming to UMD last season, Tim coached the Bloomington Junior Stars for one year and spent two years as an assistant coach at Ferris State before joining the Bulldog program. His concentration at UMD is to assist with recruiting and to coach the reserve players.

alook at the huskies

The hockey world mourned the passing of one of its greatest contributors last March when John MacInnes, who piloted the Michigan Tech hockey program for 26 years to become college hockey's all-time winningest coach, died at the age of 57.

It was because of that man that Michigan Tech fans grew accustomed to quality hockey—and winning! MacInnes-coached teams won three national titles and seven WCHA crowns as he compiled a 555-295-39 career log.

For Jim Nahrgang, the proverbial cliché—"it's a tough act to follow"—certainly applies. But now in his second season as MacInnes' successor, Nahrgang has assured that the same quality hockey program at Michigan Tech will continue.

Nahrgang is himself a MacInnes protege, having played at Tech as a defenseman. He won Outstanding Freshman, Outstanding Senior Athlete, All-WCHA honors (1972, '73, and '74), Most Valuable Player, All NCAA Tournament (1974), and All-American (1974) honors.

After a cup of coffee with professional hockey, the personable 31-year-old Nahrgang has settled down in Houghton as the boss of the Huskie program, and as he delves into his sophomore season, he's confident the program is continuing its traditional standards of excellence.

"We had a good solid recruiting year, and I'm really pleased with the way the players have been working this year," Nahrgang said. "We're much more work-orientated this year."

The Huskies, who finished last season with a 22-17-1 record, are off to a good start in 1983-84, and although Ohio State has darted out in front of the rest of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association pack, Tech could make a run for the playoffs by year's end.

"We're playing much better defense," Nahrgang analyzed. "Defense is an attitude thing, and once the players see how important it is, they start concentrating more on defense, and I think we've been doing a much better job this year."

An improved defense has been spearheaded by some outstanding goaltending, particularly from freshman Dave Roach, who was leading the CCHA with a 1.57 goals against average and .944 saves percentage.

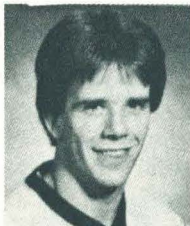
Veteran netminder Mudge Tompsett has been tabbed by Nahrgang to start at least the first game against the Bulldogs, and either Roach or Pierce will likely play Saturday.

Chris Cichocki has been the Huskies' leading scorer this season, and Nahrgang said the line of Kurt Pearson-Mark Maroste-Cichocki "has been the most consistent line we've had this year."

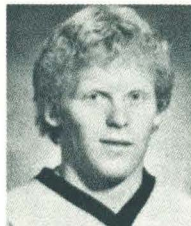
Going into last weekend's crucial two-game set with Ferris State, the Huskies had won 7, lost 3 and tied 1 and were stationed in fourth place in the CCHA. Cichocki had scored 10 goals in 10 games, and he had 13 overall points.

The Tech defense is solid with veterans Dave Reiersen, Brian Clark, Mike Nepi, and Scott Compton firmly entrenched in the lineup. "I'm still unsettled on the regular six," Nahrgang explained, "and I'll probably use seven different defensemen in Duluth. Thanksgiving is my cutoff date for making some of these kinds of decisions, and I think after the Duluth series, we'll have to decide on six."

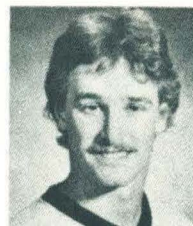

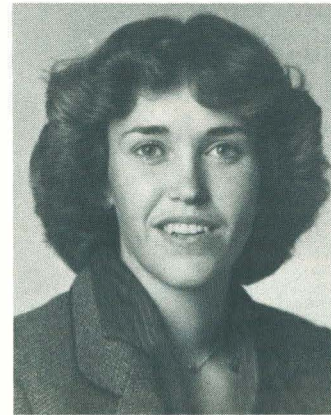
rick menz EQUIPMENT COORDINATOR

"Val" joins Coach Sertich's coaching staff this year as he completes his studies at UMD and following a playing career that saw him score 42 points in 80 games. A true Iron Ranger, Val was born in Virginia before moving on to Hoyt Lakes, where he became a top scorer for the Aurora-Hoyt Lakes Blackhawks. He was coached by former University of Minnesota assistant coach John Perpich and then by UMD assistant coach Jim Knapp at A-HL. His fiery and pesky style of play finally earned him a spot in the Bulldog starting lineup, and last year he tied a school record by playing in all 45 games. Although he was always one of the smallest players on the ice at 5-9, 170, he never let his stature hinder his development and rather used it to intimidate opponents. Mike was also a two-time letter-winner in baseball for the Blackhawks. He is concluding his studies in physical education at UMD with minors in health and psychology. He enjoyed his best season at UMD last year as he netted 17 goals and 33 total points.
