# Romano Gymnasium

Distinct home-court advantages are essential to any winning program, and the University of Minnesota Duluth's Romano Gymnasium is no exception for the Bulldogs' volleyball squad.

Since 1977, UMD has won 85.5 percent of its games in Romano Gymnasium compiling a mark of 248-42. The Bulldogs have recorded

six perfect home seasons (1979, 1980, 1989, 1991, 1993, and 1994) and have lost just one match a season on 11 other occasions. Only once in 25 years have the Bulldogs failed to be above .500 at home (1992).

Romano Gymnasium opened with a 73-72 men's basketball triumph against Gustavus

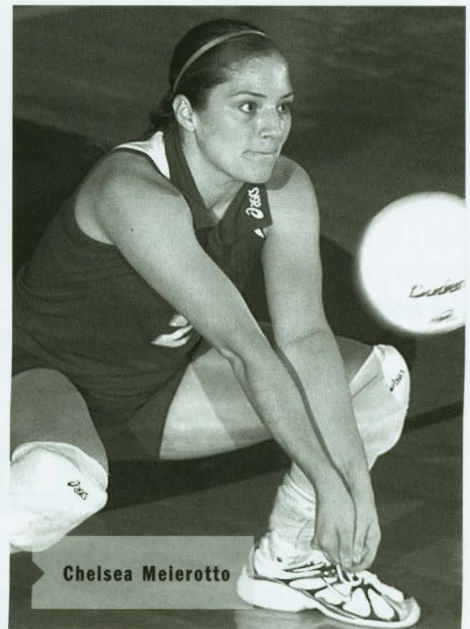
Adolphus College on December 12, 1953. The 2,759-seat facility underwent an extensive \$2 million facelift following the 1986-87 season and was renamed in February 1988 in honor of the late Ralph Romano, Minnesota Duluth's Director of Intercollegiate Athletics from 1969 to 1983.

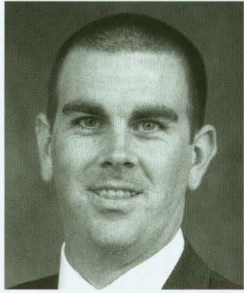

# The Minnesota Duluth Coaching Staff

## Jim Boos, Head Coach



Jim Boos, who has the best three-year start of any Bulldog volleyball coach, will embark on his fourth season with the UMD volleyball program this fall.

In his first three years at the Bulldog helm, Boos has guided UMD to a 82-13 overall record (for an impressive .863 winning percentage), two straight conference championships

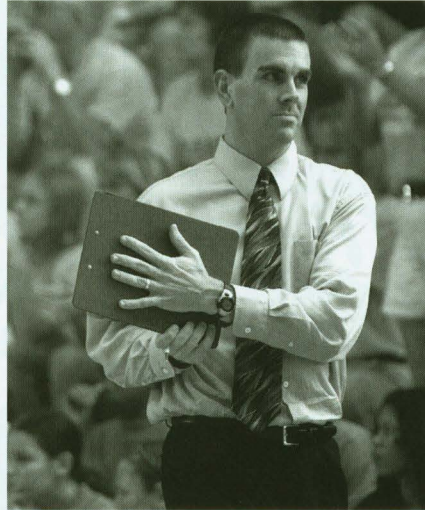
and the team's first-ever trip to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight.

His debut season was arguably one of UMD's finest as the Bulldogs posted a 29-3 overall record and a perfect 18-0 mark in Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) play while securing their first-ever No. 1 ranking in an American Volleyball Coaches Association poll (October 15, 2002). For his efforts, he was bestowed with the 2002 NSIC Coach of the Year award.

After his first two seasons, Boos and the team made the switch to the North Central Conference in 2004. Boos led the team to an NCC championship in their first season in the league and their third-straight trip to the NCAA Tournament. He guided the Bulldogs to the team's, and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Elite Eight appearance in Miami Shores, Florida, where they advanced to the semi-finals before losing to Barry University, the 2004 NCAA Champions.

For his efforts, Boos was named the American Volleyball Coaches Association North Central Regional and National Coach of the Year in 2004.

Boos, 32, was named to his current position on July 24, 2002, becoming the school's fourth head volleyball coach since the 1976 season.



Boos replaced Pati Rolf (1988-2001) who resigned in June of 2002 to take over the volleyball program at Marquette University.

For three years Boos was an assistant at then North Central Region rival North Dakota State University. In 2001, Boos helped lead the Bison to their seventh-straight NCAA Tournament and a No. 5 national ranking. In his three years at NDSU, the Bison compiled an overall record of 80-21, won two NCC titles, and advanced to the 1999 NCAA Division II Elite Eight. Under his assistance, NDSU produced three AVCA All-Americans and one NCC Player of the Year.

Before arriving at NDSU, Boos served as an assistant women's volleyball coach for the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh from 1992-98. During his stay at UW-Oshkosh, the Titans advanced to four NCAA Division III national tournaments finishing as high as second in 1994. The Titans won Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference crowns in 1994 and 1995 and were ranked in the AVCA Division III Top 15 from 1993-97. Boos assisted in the development of three NCAA Division III All-Americans, including the National Player of the Year in 1996. In 1995, Boos served as head coach of the Oconomowoc High School girls' volleyball team.

A native of Delafield, Wisconsin, Boos earned his bachelor's degree in biology from UW-Oshkosh in 1994 and followed up with a master's degree in educational leadership in 1999. While enrolled in school, and assisting the women's volleyball team, Boos established the men's club program at UW-Oshkosh in 1992, and contributed to the development of the Wisconsin Volleyball Conference. Boos, who guided UW-Oshkosh to a national club championship as a player/coach in 1996, was named to the Wisconsin Volleyball Conference Hall of Fame in 2002.

Boos resides in Duluth with his wife Jenn, and their one-year-old son Mason.

## Christyn May, Assistant Coach

Christyn May is starting her second season as assistant coach for UMD after spending the 2001-2003 seasons as a volunteer assistant coach.

May, 29, came to the Bulldogs after spending four seasons at her alma mater, the University of Nebraska-Omaha serving as a student assistant, graduate assistant, and volunteer assistant coach. During the spring of 2004, she served as the head coach for the Esko (Minnesota) 17's Junior Olympic volleyball team.

A native of Imperial, Nebraska, May is a graduate of Hayes Center High School and moved on to a four-year career (1994-97) at



Nebraska-Omaha. During that stretch, she was a starting outside hitter on Maverick Clubs which advanced to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight her junior (when they claimed the national title) and senior years and walked off with a pair of NCC championships. May, a member of the Elite Eight All-Tournament Team in both 1996 and 1997, played one year (1998-99) of basketball following the conclusion of her volleyball playing days and was elected the Mavericks' team captain.

She is a certified strength and conditioning specialist and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in education (with a specialization in exercise science) from Nebraska-Omaha in 1999 and is currently pursuing a master's degree. May and her husband, UMD Strength and Conditioning Coach Justin May, make their home in Duluth.

# UMD and the Duluth Community



## Like Nowhere Else

Hiking amid the dense white pines that grow down to the rocky coast, one can hear the cry of seagulls and the distant wail of a foghorn as the mighty waves crash against the shore, covering the lush green vegetation with a fine mist. A scene out of a remote spot in the Pacific Northwest right? No, it's Duluth.

Straining against the incessant tug of gravity, you make your way up the steep cobblestone sidewalks of the bustling downtown. The air is filled with the honking horns of cars, cabs and busses. Mingling with the sea air is the wafting scent of freshly baked bread coming from one of the ethnic grocery stores, restaurants, and bakeries in the tightly-packed neighborhood. You're walking the streets of San Francisco, right? No, it's Duluth.

The boardwalk is simply alive today. Down the street from the casino, and in front of hundreds of waterfront hotel rooms, there is every mixture of people enjoying the gentle breeze off the water. Tourists mingle with businessmen on their lunch break, and in-line skaters zoom past a mime entertaining the kids as couples check out the galleries and coffeehouses that line the sun-splashed strip. Is it Atlantic City, Miami Beach, or Santa Monica? No, it's Duluth.

## A Meeting Place

Centuries before the first Native Americans pitched their teepees and launched their primitive canoes in the waters of the massive lake they called "Gitchee Gumme," there were countless meetings in the place that would come to be known as Duluth. The crashing waves of Lake Superior came here to meet the churning waters of the St. Louis River.

Those meetings of natural forces formed a 10-mile long strand of sand where, on warm summer days, you will find thousands of modern-day Twin Ports visitors shedding the wraps of winter and meeting the rays of the sun.

And that stretch of beach, now known as Park Point, provided a huge natural harbor where tiny canoes, then larger boats, and

today, immense ocean-going ships, can find shelter from the wind and waves of the great lake. Around this natural harbor where the lake met the river, cities grew.

Today, Duluth and its Twin Ports partner, Superior, are viewed as meeting places more than ever.

It is here that small-town truckers in jeans and feed caps haul loads of grain down to the giant elevators next to the docks. More than 1,000 miles from the salt waters of the nearest ocean, they meet sea captains from ports from every corner of the globe, who will haul that wheat, corn and barley east through the Great Lakes and the St. Lawrence Seaway, then across the Atlantic Ocean to foreign ports.

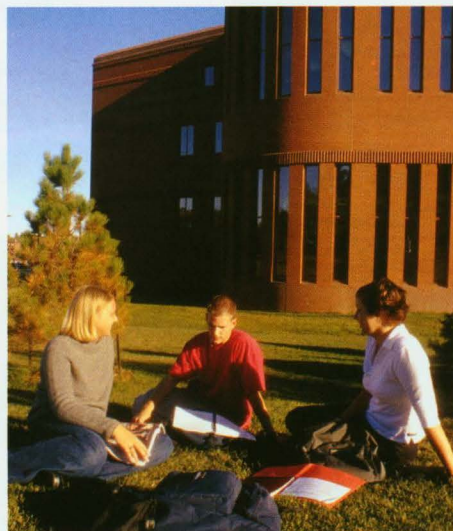
Mile-long trains loaded with iron ore and taconite pellets from the mines of Minnesota's Iron Range come to Duluth to have their contents emptied into ships (commonly called lakers) which will haul their goods to the steel mills of Indiana, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. There, the ore will be used to make the structural steel for buildings of the future and for the automobile frames being designed for use in the new century.

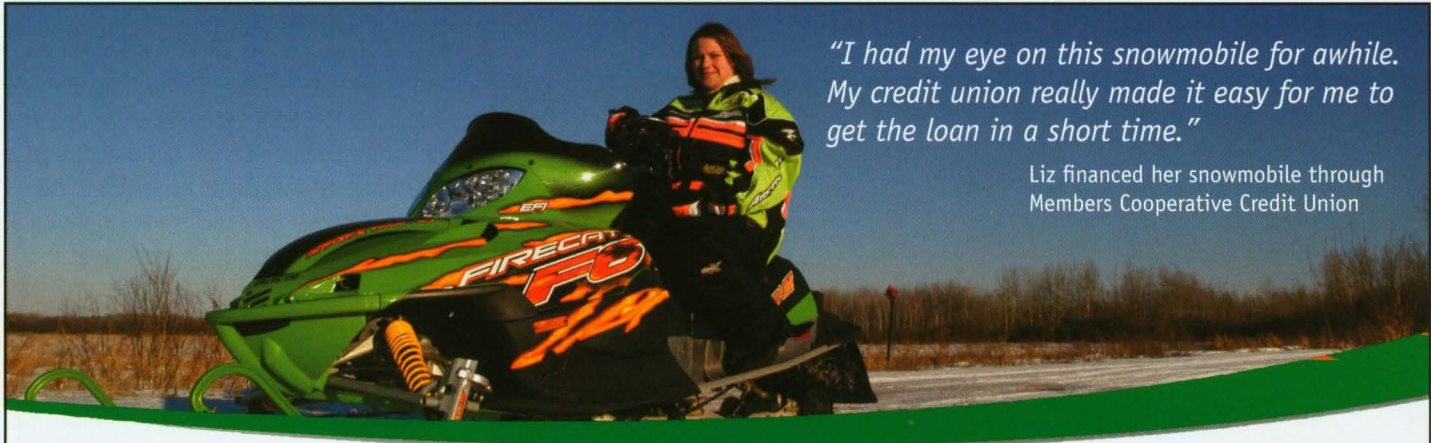
Tourism brings in countless people from throughout the Midwest to shop, eat, relax, and be entertained by the endless variety of things to see and do in and around the Twin Ports. Goods are for sale in every variety, from tiny galleries where local artisans display seagull figurines carved from the driftwood found along the shore of Lake Superior, to sleek modern shopping malls filled with the latest designer fashions.

Diners choose from options like grabbing a quick burger and a soda on their way to the game, or sitting down to hot coffee, warm apple pie and a bowl of steaming chowder, or savoring prime rib and fine wine at a linen-covered table in a four-star restaurant.

For active visitors, Duluth and the surrounding area offer every kind of outdoor recreation imaginable, from hiking, kayaking, sailing, and biking along the rugged shore of the lake, to first-class downhill and cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, and dog-sledding that takes advantage of the area's common lake-effect snows to provide the finest winter recreation

conditions between the Adirondacks and the Rockies.

Dozens of parks and open spaces in and around the city are complemented by a lake-walk which stretches for miles from Canal Park up the North Shore, passing countless parks, monuments, and places to sit and ponder the inland ocean, and providing ample opportunities for walkers, bikers, skaters, or those who favor a horse-drawn carriage ride.

When it comes to staying up to date on what's happening around town, around the region, and around the globe, Duluthians are blessed with four local television stations, several print media outlets and more radio stations per capita (in every available format) than nearly any community in the nation. Duluth's television and radio stations—which, in terms of geographic reach, are located in one of the country's largest markets—cover news, sports, and weather in the Twin Ports, northern Minnesota and northwestern Wisconsin.

And, for those who like to take their entertainment sitting down, Duluth, quite literally, offers something for all interests. Broadway entertainment and dozens of movie screens bring the stars of the East and West Coasts to the

Twin Ports. National recording artists perform by the shore of the lake during concerts, including the region's annual Blues Festival. For the sports fan, Duluth is home to a Northwoods Baseball League franchise, one of the nation's largest marathons each summer, a major dog

before public higher education came to the north woods with the opening of the Duluth Normal School in 1895. Renamed Duluth State Teacher's College in 1921, the school became a coordinate campus of the University of Minnesota in 1947.



The \$13.1 million Sports and Health Center expansion project is expected to be completed in November 2006 and will include an 8,500-square foot weight/strength training area for intercollegiate athletics.

The modern-day UMD has a campus community of over 10,000 undergraduate and graduate students pursuing bachelor's, master's, and doctorate degrees in 75 majors and close to 20 graduate programs. In addition to the two-year program at the School of Medicine and a College of Pharmacy program, UMD offers six co-operative programs through the Minne-

Complimented by a faculty staff of 500, UMD's students come to Duluth and call it their home during their college careers and beyond. Unlike the sprawling commuter schools of the Midwest's metropolitan areas, where parking spaces out-number library periodicals, UMD is a community where close to half of the undergraduate population resides in the many on-campus housing options available, or in the historic neighborhoods surrounding the campus.

**A Great University on a Great Lake**

For more than 100 years, the modest teachers college that has grown and evolved into the University of Minnesota Duluth has been offering students of all ages, and all interests, a window into the opportunities that come with knowledge.

The University of Minnesota system (which today has campuses in Minneapolis, St. Paul, Morris, and Crookston, as well as Duluth) was started by an act of the Territorial Legislature in 1851, seven years before Minnesota achieved statehood. It took another 44 years

Comprised of more than 50 buildings and set on 250 acres of residential land with scenic views of Lake Superior, the UMD campus is a city unto itself, with housing, dining facilities, a theater, a planetarium, research laboratories, athletic facilities, parks, wilderness areas, radio and television studios, a newspaper, the latest computer technology, medical facilities, shopping, entertainment, and a new library which merges the print and digital worlds, providing students with the region's most advanced gateway to information. Dedicated in August 2000, the UMD library is a \$25 million project which provides the campus with nearly

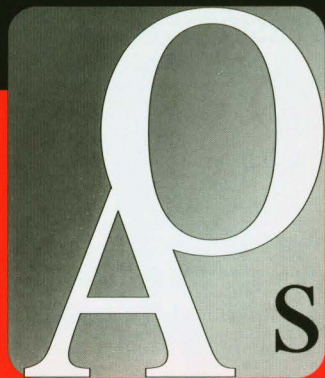

168,000 square feet of new space and room for more than 200 laptop and desktop computers.

Here, where the ability to transport goods over water created an economy and several communities, transportation is in abundant supply.

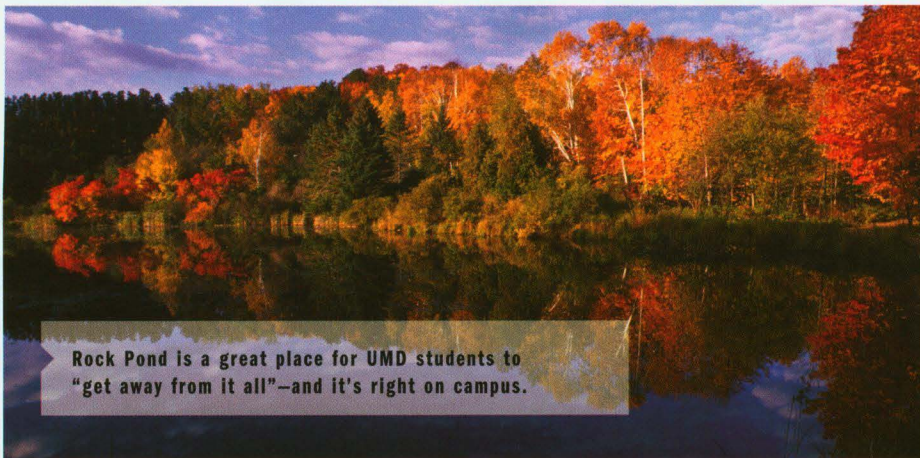

# UMD Bulldog Athletics

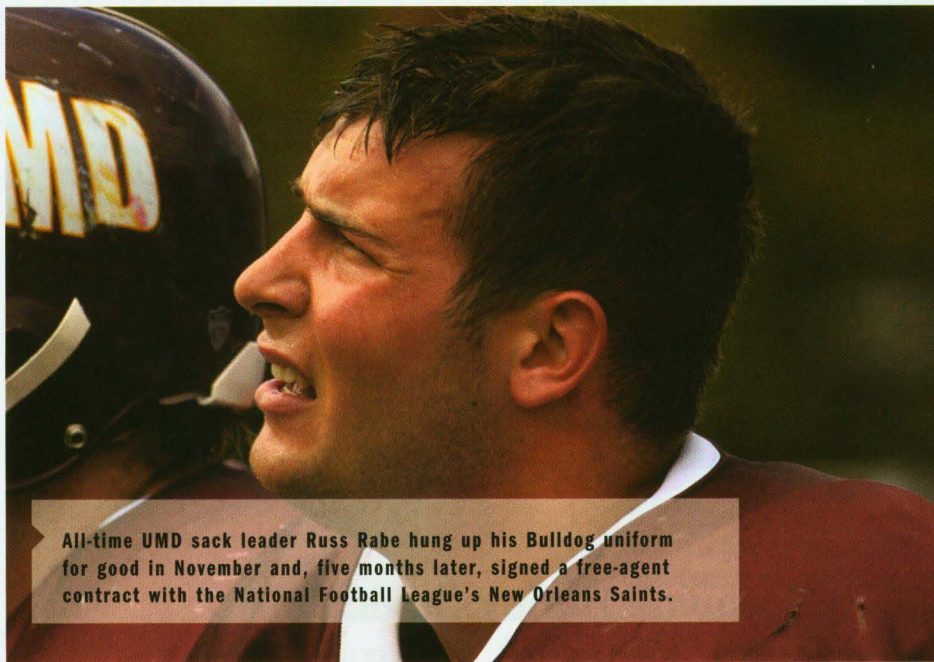
The 2005-06 season marks the 75th anniversary of University of Minnesota Duluth athletics.

From its humble beginnings back on September 20, 1930 (a football game at Northland College), Bulldog athletics has evolved into one of the most competitive and well-balanced programs of its size in the nation. Fourteen of UMD's 16 intercollegiate teams – baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, women's soccer, softball, women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball – will begin their second year of competition in the North Central Conference this season. Arguably one of the country's top Division II alliances, the NCC has produced no less than 41 NCAA II championship teams and 260 national individual titleholders since it joined the NCAA ranks 56 years ago. The UMD men's and women's ice hockey programs, meanwhile, are aligned with the prestigious Western Collegiate Hockey Association, an NCAA Division I circuit.

During the course of the 2004-05 season, the Bulldogs advanced to the NCAA Division II national championships in both volleyball (for the first time ever) and men's cross country (for the second straight year). In addition, four track and field performers and one cross country runner represented UMD at national events. The Bulldogs also qualified for NCAA regional postseason play in women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, women's ice hockey, and volleyball.



Tim Garceau joined a select group of UMD athletes in 2004-05 when the junior designated hitter became just the second Bulldog to ever receive All-American baseball recognition.

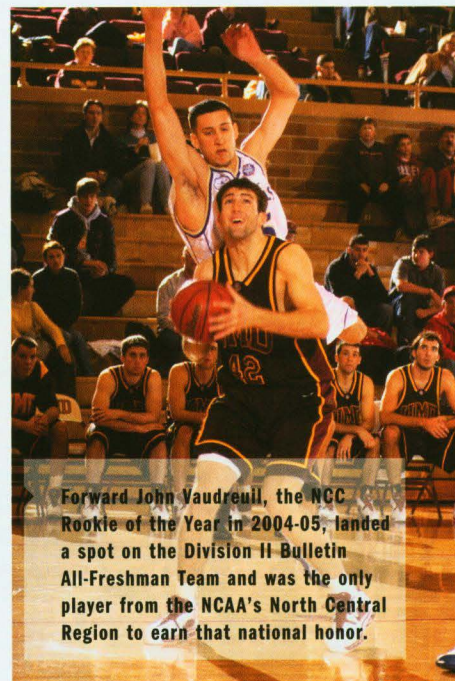


All-time UMD sack leader Russ Rabe hung up his Bulldog uniform for good in November and, five months later, signed a free-agent contract with the National Football League's New Orleans Saints.

Individually speaking, 2004-05 was a banner year for UMD athletics. A school-record 10 Bulldogs attained All-American status in their respective sports, including senior Nate Beerling (track and field), junior Lindsey Dietz (basketball), sophomore Sara Frederickson (cross country), junior Tim Garceau (baseball), senior Dayna Groom (softball), senior Heather Hamilton (track and field), senior Caroline Oullette (hockey), senior Russ Rabe (football), senior Robb Winterfeld (track and field), and senior Callie Zwettler (volleyball).

The man in charge of supervising the Bulldogs is Bob Nielson, who became the school's director of intercollegiate athletics on December 1, 2003 following a successful five-year head coaching run with the football Bulldogs. In his half-decade of service, Nielson helped take UMD football to unprecedented heights. In 2002, his Bulldogs posted their only perfect 11-0 regular season record and advanced to their first ever NCAA Division II playoffs. One year earlier, UMD made its inaugural postseason appearance (the Mineral Water Bowl in Excelsior Springs, MO) and rolled up a 9-3 overall mark. In 2000, the Bulldogs went 7-4 – their first winning season since 1996. He concluded his UMD coaching career with an overall record of 38-19 for a .667 winning percentage – the best figure in school history.

Nielson, the 2002 NSIC Coach of the Year and a runner-up for the *American Football Monthly* magazine NCAA II Coach of the Year award, joined the UMD staff after guiding the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire to the semifinal round of the 1998 NCAA Division III playoffs. He was also an associate athletic director and a member of the Wisconsin-Eau Claire Department of Kinesiology teaching staff.

# Where They Play the Game



The Duluth Entertainment Convention Center, which played host to the 2003 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, is home to both the Bulldog men's and women's hockey teams.

The University of Minnesota Duluth is fortunate to have some of the top facilities in the upper-midwest for use by student-athletes.

The venerable Duluth Entertainment Convention Center (DECC), considered among the most historic complexes in the country, has served as home for men's Bulldog hockey since 1966.

Located on the waterfront near Duluth's famous Aerial Lift Bridge and Canal Park, the DECC houses a 190-by-85 foot hockey rink with a 5,333 seating capacity (and approximately 75 standing room), and six locker rooms, including the newly-remodeled structure (to the tune of \$2 million) occupied by the Bulldogs men and women.

Griggs Field at Malosky Stadium, Northern Minnesota's premier outdoor athletic venue,

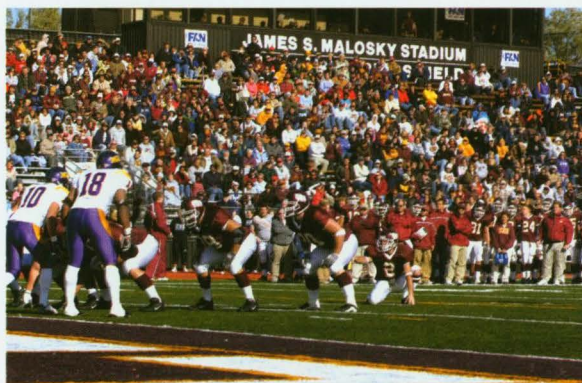
has been the home of Bulldog football for the past 39 seasons. In the summer of 1999, Griggs Field received a \$1.6 million facelift with the installation of a new football playing surface (which was replaced one year ago) along with an eight-lane all-weather track. In addition to housing the football, women's soccer, and track and field Bulldogs, the 4,000-seat Griggs Field also hosts a number of high school and junior college football and track events throughout the year, as well as various university intramural activities.

Romano Gymnasium has housed UMD men's basketball for over a half-century and women's basketball and volleyball since the early 1970s. The 2,759-seat facility, which underwent an extensive \$2 million renovation following the 1986-87 season, was renamed in honor of the late Ralph Romano, Minnesota Duluth's Director of Intercollegiate Athletics

from 1969 to 1983.

The UMD baseball team plays its home games at Bulldog Park. Originally constructed in 1988, Bulldog Park's grass field, considered by many to be the best in the area, was reconditioned in 2000. Junction Avenue Field, meanwhile, is home for UMD softball. This natural grass complex, which is lighted for night play, was built in 1987.

UMD also utilizes the Ward Wells Field House, which was constructed in 1975. It contains an indoor running track and room for tennis, volleyball, and basketball courts.



In July 2004, Griggs Field at Malosky Stadium received a makeover of sorts as the old artificial playing surface was replaced with state-of-the-art A-Turf.



Romano Gymnasium provides the basketball and volleyball Bulldogs with a lively on-campus atmosphere and an indisputable home-court advantage.

## WHY THE BULLDOG?



When the University of Minnesota Duluth (which was then known as Duluth State Teacher's College)

launched its intercollegiate athletic program back in September 1930, the institution's four sports teams (football, hockey, basketball, and track and field) used the nickname "Peds," which was short for Pedagogues. Uniforms at the time were adorned in green and gold — the original school colors. In the spring of 1933, DSTC student-athletes voted on a new school mascot and chose the Bulldog. Subsequently, official team colors were changed to the current maroon and gold.

Legend has it that a member of the football team, a short and squat lineman by the name of Jack O'Hehir, was the inspiration behind the new mascot. O'Hehir, who would go on to become team captain the following year (1934), supposedly not only looked like a bulldog, but talked and acted like one as well.

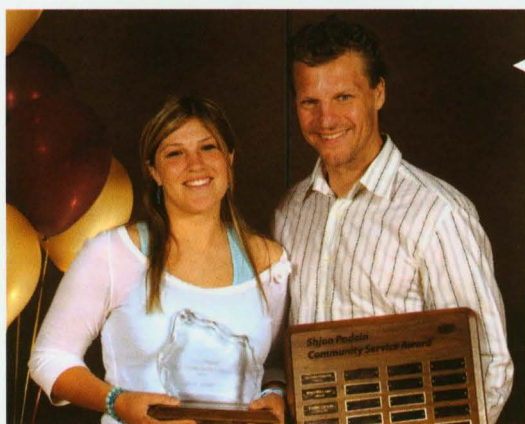
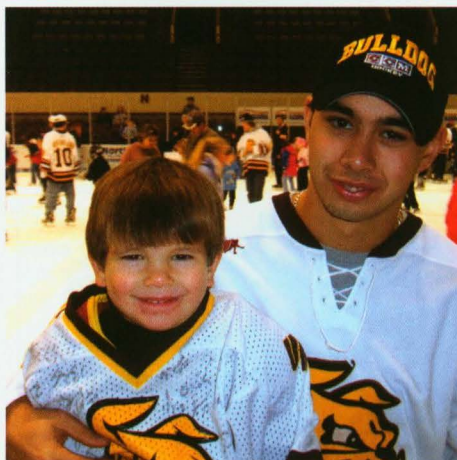
Being a student-athlete at the University of Minnesota Duluth means more than just academics and sports. It's about learning some of life's simple lessons, such as it is always better to give than to receive.

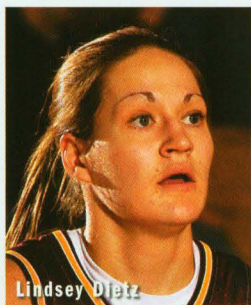

# Making the Grade

The University of Minnesota Duluth has a strong tradition of academically preparing its student-athletes. Since 1985, the Athletic Academic Support Center (AASC) has helped all student-athletes progress toward a degree from freshman orientation to graduation.

Over the past 20 years, nearly 94 percent of those athletes who participated in a varsity sport for at least four years have graduated.

In 2004-05, 34 UMD student-athletes secured North Central Conference All-Academic honors and 13 Bulldogs (four men and nine women) were named to the WCHA All-Academic team. In addition, the Athletic Academic Support Center listed 189 student-athletes – out of a group of 389 – with grade point averages of 3.00 or better for the fall semester. Of that group, 119 achieved grade point averages of 3.40 or above and 14 individuals finished with a perfect 4.00 GPA. This past spring, 186 student-athletes eclipsed the 3.00 GPA barrier, including 19 who attained

4.00 marks. Overall, UMD student-athletes maintained an average cumulative GPA of 2.91. The women's basketball Bulldogs posted the best overall GPA as a team with a 3.36 figure.

On the individual front, three Bulldogs – senior Nate Beerling (cross country/track), junior Lindsey Dietz (women's basketball), and senior Heather Hamilton (cross country/track) – all attained *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America first team honors while junior Caroline Oullette (women's hockey/at-large) was a second team selection. Dietz, a second team member in 2003-04, also was named the Academic All-America of the Year by *ESPN The Magazine*. Hamilton, who became the first Bulldog to receive national Academic All-American status on three occasions (she made the first team one year ago and the third team the season before that), was the recipient of the North Central Conference's prestigious 2005 Stan Marshall Award, which is presented each year to one

male and one female senior student-athlete who distinguish themselves through academic performance, athletic ability, and community activities. Beerling (cross country/track first team), Dietz (basketball first team), Hamilton (cross country/track first team), Oullette (women's hockey/at-large first team), sophomore Sara Frederickson (cross country/track first team), senior Dayna Groom (softball second team), senior Lindsey Lundeen (softball second team), sophomore Ritta Schaublin (women's hockey/at-large first team), and senior Callie Zwettler (volleyball second team), all were bestowed with CoSIDA Academic All-District V acclaim this past season. Beerling and Oullette were also chosen UMD's Top Scholar Male and Female Athletes (the E.L. Duce Rasmussen Award) for 2004-05.

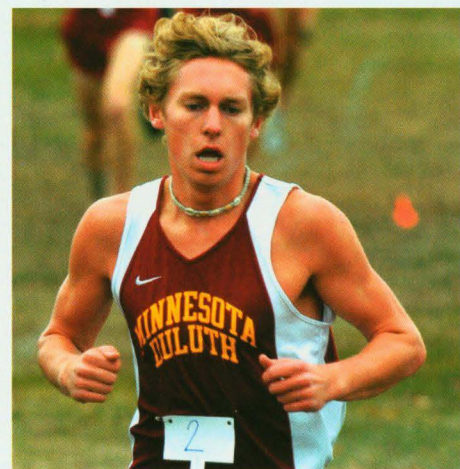

# A Championship Tradition

A new chapter in University of Minnesota Duluth intercollegiate athletics unfolded in 2004-05 as the Bulldogs hooked up with the North Central Conference after a 28-year

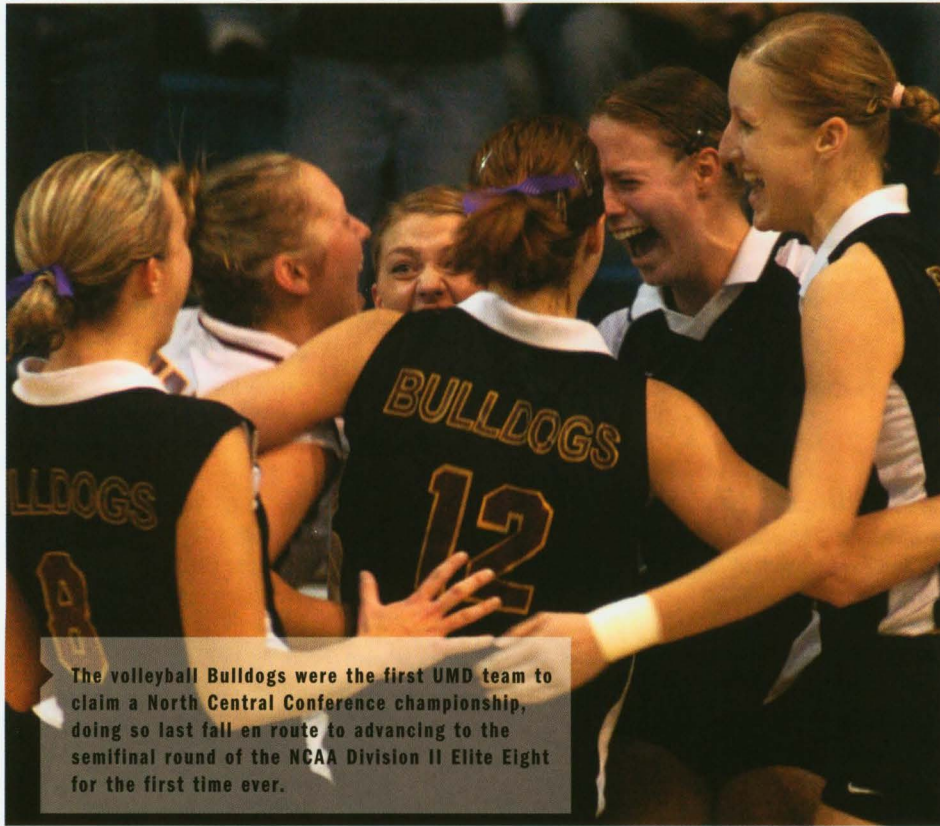
affiliation with the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference.

The move meant the end of a dominating NSIC run for UMD. Just how dominant were the

Bulldogs? For openers, since 1990 all 14 of UMD's NCAA II teams (men's and women's track and field have both indoor and outdoor events each season) won at least four conference titles and, in UMD's final five years of league membership, took home at least one crown. No other NSIC school can make that claim. In addition, UMD reigned as the NSIC All-Sports champion for 13 straight seasons.

Last year in their debut season with the NCC, the Bulldogs captured one regular season league championship (women's volleyball) while finishing second in both women's basketball and men's cross country.

But the recent successes have not been limited to just the NCAA II sports at UMD. Women's ice hockey, for instance, was added to the Bulldog athletic program in 1999 and has appeared prominently on the national radar screen ever since, winning an unprecedented three straight Frozen Four titles from 2000-03. On the men's side, the Bulldogs returned to NCAA I prominence two years ago when they made their first visit to the Frozen Four tournament in 19 seasons and produced the school's fourth Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner in Junior Lessard along the way.



The volleyball Bulldogs were the first UMD team to claim a North Central Conference championship, doing so last fall en route to advancing to the semifinal round of the NCAA Division II Elite Eight for the first time ever.

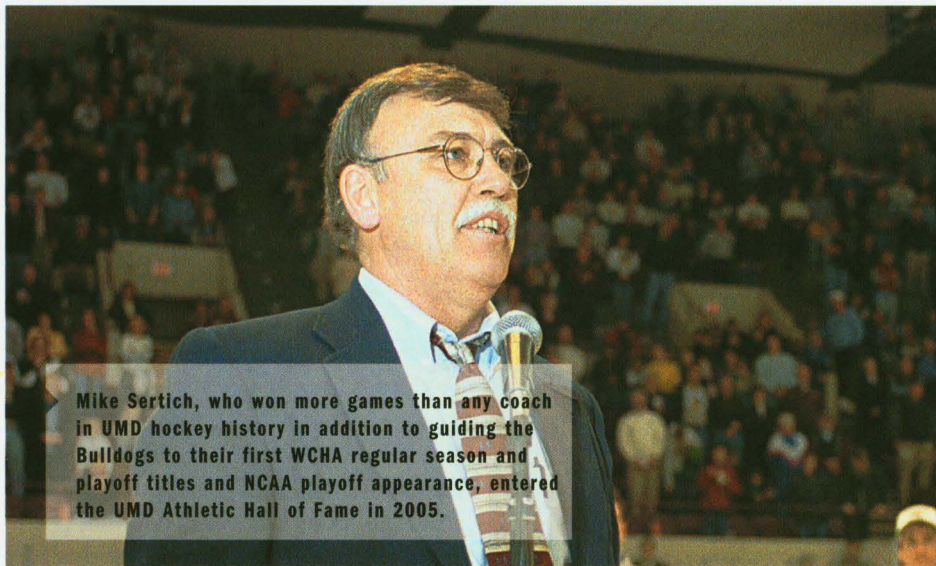

# The UMD Athletic Hall of Fame



Mike Sertich, who won more games than any coach in UMD hockey history in addition to guiding the Bulldogs to their first WCHA regular season and playoff titles and NCAA playoff appearance, entered the UMD Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

The University of Minnesota Duluth Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 1991 and enshrined its first class exactly 61 years to the day after the first Bulldog varsity athletic event took place (a football game at Northland College on Sept. 20, 1930). It now consists of 70 distinguished members.

# North Central Conference

In the fall of 1921 in Chicago, a meeting was held to lay the groundwork for a new league in the Midwest similar to the Western Conference (Big Ten). Present at the meeting were South Dakota State College, the University of North Dakota, North Dakota Agricultural College, the College of St. Thomas, Creighton University, and Michigan A and M. In February 1922 another meeting was held, and after an attempt to lure some of the teams into another league, the North Central Intercollegiate Conference, commonly known as the "Big Nine" formally became a conference. The members of the new conference were South Dakota State College, College of St. Thomas, Des Moines University, Creighton University, North Dakota Agricultural College, University of North Dakota, and Morningside College. By the spring of 1922 the University of South Dakota and Nebraska Wesleyan came on board as charter members of the nine-team conference.

During the Spring of 1922, the first competition began in Brookings, South Dakota—the initial Track and Field meet was held—with the University of South Dakota claiming the title. In the fall of 1922 the first football championship featured

South Dakota State beating Creighton 25-14 on November 18. In the spring of 1926 Des Moines University withdrew, and this was followed by the departure of St. Thomas and Creighton in the Spring of 1928. On December 6, 1934, Iowa State Teachers College and Omaha University were admitted to membership. By 1942, Augustana College was admitted to membership and they, along with five other originals, are still part of the current ten-team conference.

On April 13, 1946 Omaha University withdrew. Two years later, in April of 1948, the NCC officially joined the NCAA and NAIB. In 1964 the Holiday Basketball tournament became a reality that lasted until 1989—one of the biggest showcases in conference history. The tournament was held annually in Sioux Falls.

Jack McClelland became the first conference commissioner on July 1, 1968 with his office established in the Curtis Hotel in Minneapolis. In November of the same year, Mankato State joined the conference for the first time. On March 11, 1976 the University of Nebraska, Omaha was added to the conference (they had been a member previously as Omaha University). In August of

1976 Mankato State dropped football and was forced to withdraw from the conference.

Northern Iowa withdrew from the conference at the end of the 1977-78 season to join the Mid-Continent Conference in Division I of NCAA.

The University of Northern Colorado was admitted to membership on July 21, 1978. A decision was made to phase in women's athletics over the next three years. By the 1981-82 school year, women's athletics were fully underway. On April 14, 1981 Mankato State was readmitted to the NCC and this was followed by St. Cloud State being admitted on June 25, 1981. The conference has remained stable for the past 15 years. All institutions except St. Cloud State, Morningside, and Northern Colorado made a commitment to have their women's programs be an official part of the conference. The Stan Marshall Award for the top student athlete was established on April 20, 1982.

Effective for the 2004-05 season, the University of Minnesota Duluth joined the NCC for the first time. They replaced South Dakota State and North Dakota State who left the conference after the 2003-04 campaign.

The Bulldogs placed fifth at the 1980 AIAW Division II National Championships and overall posted a 5-8 mark in their three trips to that national event (0-3 in 1977, 1-2 in 1979, and 4-3 in 1980).

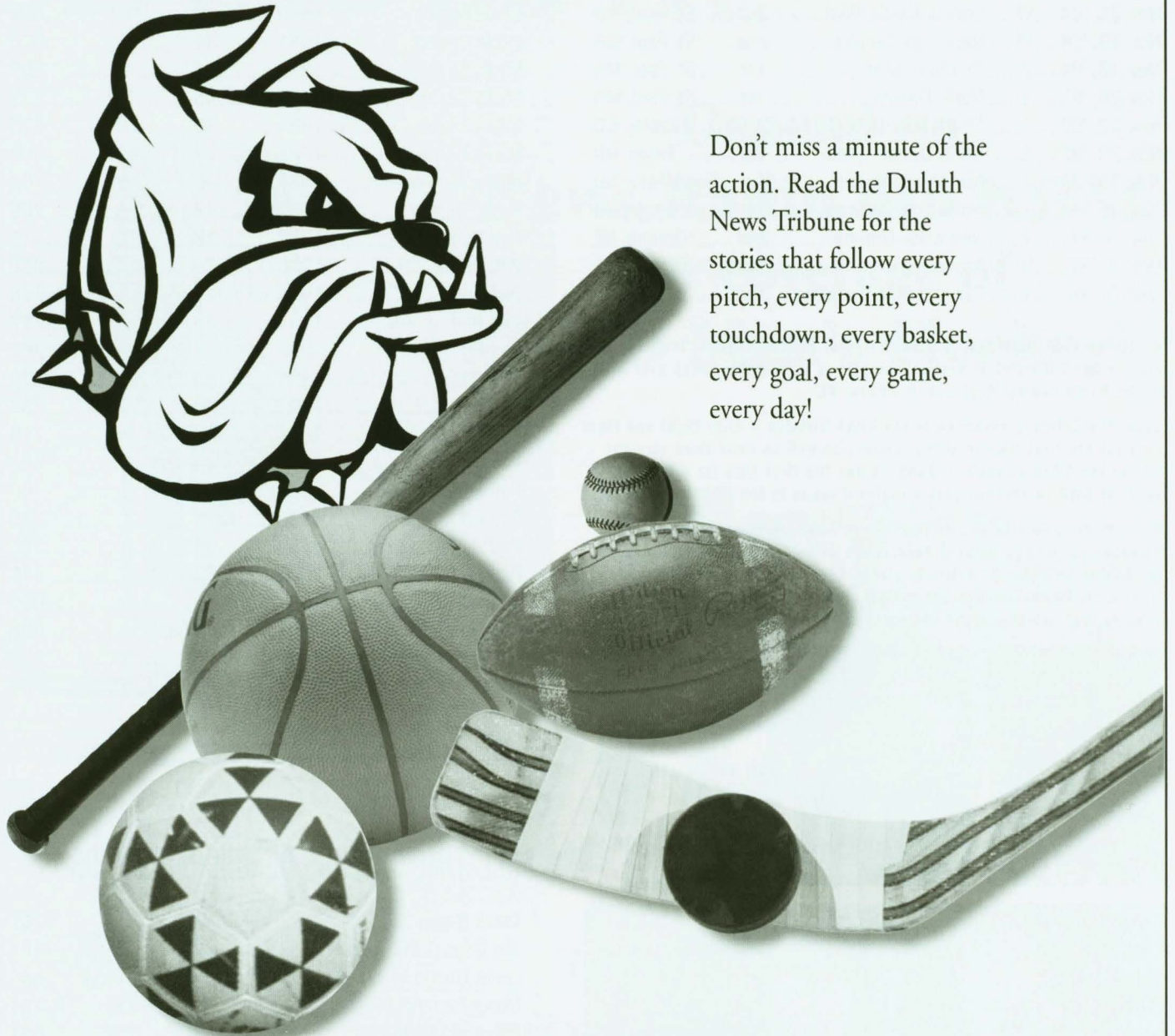

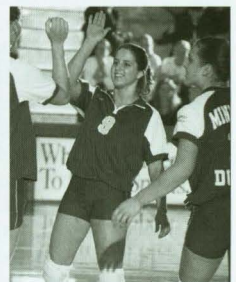

# NCAA Rules for Bulldog Supporters

The University of Minnesota Duluth is responsible for insuring that its coaches, student-athletes, faculty and staff, alumni, donors, and friends abide by NCAA regulations. Under these guidelines, alumni, donors, and friends are categorized as "representatives of athletics interests" of the University of Minnesota Duluth, and this must abide by NCAA policies and guidelines.

This page is a quick reference to "some of the most important" NCAA rules which apply to our "athletic representatives." The University appreci-

ates your interest in consideration that an uninformed or inappropriate interaction with a recruit or student-athlete might jeopardize their eligibility or the sport they represent.

The University is dependent on your loyal support and continued interest in its athletics programs. As we strive for continued excellence in athletics, as well as in academics, we must always seek the highest standard of ethical conduct. Your valued cooperation can be of assistance in accomplishing these common goals.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS REGARDING THE RECRUITMENT OF PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

### Who is a prospective student-athlete?

A prospective student-athlete is defined as a person who has begun classes at the ninth (9th) grade level.

### May I telephone a prospective student-athlete?

DO NOT telephone a recruit. You may only speak with a recruit if they have initiated the call and the call cannot be prearranged by the athletics department.

### May I observe a contest in which a prospect is engaged? What if face-to-face conduct is unavoidable?

Do feel free to attend high school and community college athletic events. You simply cannot have any contact with the prospective student-athletes or relatives. Should you find yourself seated next to parents of a prospect, DO NOT initiate conversation with the relatives. If conversation is initiated with you, respond in a civil manner but DO NOT discuss University of Minnesota Duluth athletics. If they raise questions about UMD athletics, remind them that the NCAA prohibits you from discussing those programs. They should be advised to direct their questions to the UMD Athletic Department.

Do continue established family relationships with friends and neighbors. Contacts with sons or daughters of these families certainly are permitted as long as they are not made for recruiting purposes and are not prompted by UMD coaching staff members.

### Can I place an advertisement or congratulations to a prospect in a high school game program, yearbook, newspaper, or recruiting publication?

You may NOT advertise for any reason in a program, media guide, newspaper, etc.

### May I purchase a gift for a prospect or treat a prospect to dinner?

You may NOT purchase a gift for a prospect and you may NOT purchase a meal for them.

### How may I assist in the recruiting process?

You may send the UMD coaching staff any newspaper clippings or other information about prospects which you think would be of interest. The coaching staff will then contact the prospect on behalf of the University. Remember, only coaches are permitted to contact a prospect for recruiting purposes.

You may assist members of the UMD coaching staff who are recruiting in your community in regards to meals, lodging, and transportation.

## NCAA RULES REGARDING CONTACTS WITH CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENT-ATHLETES

DO NOT provide a student-athlete, his or her family or friends, any benefit or special arrangement. The NCAA considers these "extra benefits" and they are specifically prohibited. These include any transportation, meals, clothes, entertainment, preferential loan terms, or other benefits offered to a student-athlete that you do not make available to the general student population.

DO NOT provide them cash or arrange for payment of room, board, or any type of transportation for a student-athlete or their family or friends.

DO NOT use the name or picture of an enrolled student-athlete to directly advertise, recommend, or promote sales or use of a commercial product or service of any kind. Even the SALE of a picture of an enrolled student-athlete would constitute a violation. Any use of the name, picture, or appearance of a student-athlete must be cleared through the UMD Athletic Compliance Office.

DO NOT provide any payment of travel expenses or loan an automobile to a student-athlete.

DO NOT provide any type of gifts, tickets, money, or awards to a student-athlete for any reason. All awards MUST conform to NCAA regulations and be approved by the University of Minnesota Duluth Athletic Department.

DO NOT allow a student-athlete, their family, or friends to use your telephone to make free long distance calls.

DO NOT invite a student-athlete, their family, or friends to your summer home to go water skiing, etc.

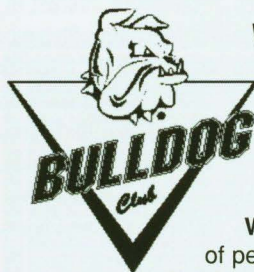
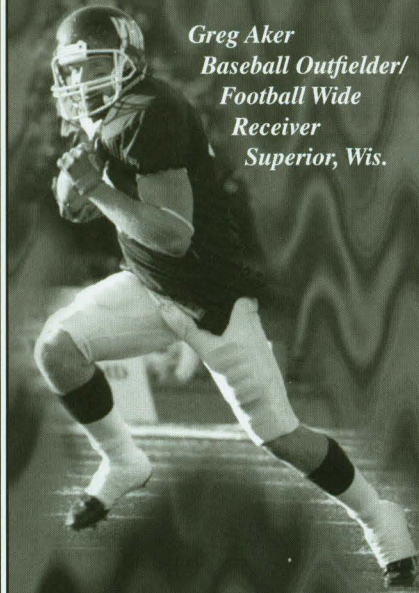

## What Is the Bulldog Club?

The Bulldog Club is an all-sport booster organization dedicated to providing advice, assistance, financial support, fan support, and community leadership to the University of Minnesota Duluth Intercollegiate Athletic Program.

**Who manages the Bulldog Club?** A board of trustees, composed of people who reflect the diverse nature of UMD athletics, heads the Bulldog Club. Membership is open to anyone interested in supporting and advancing UMD Athletics. Members undertake various activities and projects through subcommittees which report to the board.

**Ways to contribute.** Although monetary contributions are the most common method of supporting the Bulldog Club, other ways, including gifts-in-kind, deferred or planned gifts, gifts of insurance policies, stocks, or securities, and group gifts are welcomed. All monetary donations are deposited into and monitored as part of the Rasmussen Fund, which was established in 1962 to provide scholarships for UMD athletes who qualify on the basis of character, academic achievement, and athletic skill. 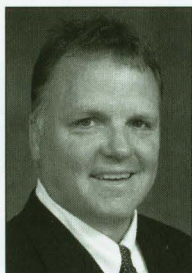
**Must I pay in full?** No. You may pay in quarterly installments.
