The University

UMD has launched its 26th year of service to the citizens of Minnesota with a record number of new academic programs.

A new two-year School of Medicine, dedicated to training family physicians for non-metropolitan areas, opened in September with a class of 24 students. After spending two years at UMD, the students will transfer to the Twin Cities campus to complete their degree requirements.

The School of Social Work, which will graduate social planners for rural and regional positions, began operation August 28. Students will spend from one to two years, depending on their previous training and experience, earning a Master of Social Work degree. The first class has 23 students.

A two-year Dental Hygiene Program began classes in September with 16 students. The program seeks to meet the needs of state dentists for auxiliary personnel to handle such duties as examining and charting, taking x-rays, cleaning teeth, decay control treatment and patient education.

The complete range of courses for the new Master of Arts degree in speech pathology first offered in the fall. The program provides graduates with a body of knowledge as it applies to the clinical setting, clinical practicum and research.

Also beginning this fall was the new Secondary Teacher Education Program (STEP) which gives students more experience in area public schools before graduation plus increased independent study. The five-phase, performance-based program represents a major change in teacher

education at UMD, one which is designed to produce a more professional teacher.

Another new program is the two-year Associate in Vocational Teacher Education degree intended to produce teachers for vocational and technical schools. Students with previous skills experience or training can receive credit toward the degree and, if they choose, can continue study toward a four year degree.

Overall, UMD now offers 14 Master's degree programs, four baccalaureate degrees, and two associate degrees. Courses are offered for 50 major fields in 32 academic areas, 15 pre-professional programs and Air Force ROTC.

Arrangements have been made for student exchanges with both the College of St. Scholastica and the University of Wisconsin, Superior so that students can take advantage of unique offerings at neighboring campuses.

New thrusts in undergraduate programs include internships in urban studies, environmental research, law enforcement and allowing high school students to take UMD courses during their senior year. The new Indian Studies Program and the greater attention being given to all minority and disadvantaged students reflect new directions at UMD for service and education.

Students, themselves, are becoming increasingly involved both in the community and on campus with such programs as the Human Resources Bank for volunteer work in the city and region, the Student Tutorial Program, the free University, and the Students' College.

"During the next quarter century, UMD will continue to strive to provide the best possible education for the students of Northeastern Minnesota and the state as a whole," Provost Raymond W. Darland states. "It is our hope that we can continue to be responsive to the changing needs of both our students and the community so that the quality of our lives can be enhanced even further."

Ralph Romano

Athletic Director

UMD Athletic Director Ralph Romano, eyeing excellence and sportsmanship in UMD's 11-sport program, is in his fourth year as the head of the department.

A native of Thunderbay, Ontario, Romano moved to Duluth while in high school. He graduated from Duluth Central and continued his education at UMD. While at UMD, he was a goalie with the Bulldog's hockey squad.

Following graduation in 1956 he served as a navigator in the Air Force. Romano returned to his alma mater in 1959 as head hockey coach and sports publicity director. He soon took on the responsibilities of athletic ticket manager and athletic business manager as well as continuing the coaching. He relinquished his coaching job in 1967 while accepting a position as UMD assistant athletic director.

The retirement of Lloyd Peterson, a long time servant of UMD athletics, vacated the UMD athletic director's seat and Romano was the logical candidate for the job.

Among his most significant contributions to UMD was Romano's determined efforts in gaining entrance into the renowned Western Collegiate Hockey Association, considered the NHL of college hockey.

Romano and his wife Barb are the parents of five children: Ralph Jr., Elaine, Kevin, Jeff, and Paul.

Athletic Department

Bruce McLeod, a former UMD hockey captain, is the backbone behind the athletic department's business and publicity, doubling as the business manager and sports publicity director.

A native of Fort Frances, Ont., McLeod graduated from UMD in 1969. He completed his hockey career as one of the Bulldogs' all-time leading scorers.

McLeod handles the difficult financial dealings of the athletic department and is in constant correspondence with the news media and other colleges.

McLeod is assisted with press releases, brochures, programs and press box work by Tom Knutson, a senior physical education student at the university.

The secretarial chores of the department are handled by Kathy Erickson and Pat Bjorkland.

James Malosky

Head Coach

Jim Malosky, MIAC Coach of the Year in 1970, is in his 15th season as the head mentor of UMD's football team.

With a career record at UMD of 73-47-7, Malosky has the best won-lost percentage of UMD's three all-time coaches. He led the Bulldogs to MIAC championships in 1960 and 1961, and narrowly missed a conference title last year when the underdog Bulldogs tumbled to Gustavus Adolphus in the last league game of the year to decide the championship.

Malosky earned his reputation as a winning coach at Edina-Morningside High School and Morris High School. His 1956 Morris team won its conference championship and in 1957, Malosky's Edina Hornets were considered the number one high school team in the state after sweeping through the season undefeated.

Overall, Malosky's high school coaching credentials read 27 victories and just eight losses.

Malosky is a native of Crosby, Minn. and he was a standout football and basketball player at Crosby-Ironton High School. He was selected to the All-State teams in both sports.

Highly recruited by colleges across the nation, Malosky elected to attend the University of Minnesota, where he became Bernie Bierman's quarterback on the great Gopher teams of the late 1940's.

Malosky has produced several professional football players, including Dick Pesonen, who formerly played with the Vikings, Packers and Giants and now is an assistant at Idaho State University. Tom Adams, former Viking who now coaches at Greenway High School; and Vern Emerson, formerly of the Cardinals.

Malosky is also an assistant professor of physical education at UMD.

Assistant Coaches

Two veterans and a rookie will assist Malosky in 1972. Al Decker and Bill Lippitt, both former Bulldog Players, will return from last year's staff while trainer Don Roach is the newcomer to the coaching faculty.

Decker is a veteran of the Viet Nam war and was named an assistant coach last year following completion of his military duty.

Roach became UMD's first fulltime trainer in 1970 and is in his third year.

Prospects

When assessing the forthcoming strengths and weaknesses of the UMD football team, Coach Malosky is quick to point out that the Bulldogs have suffered 12 lettermen losses, "all of whom were very important to our success last year."

However, Malosky doesn't hide the fact that there are two critical positions to be filled.

Probably the most serious loss to the squad is Johnny Olson, simply because of his versatility. Olson was the Bulldog's leading halfback, a key defensive backfield player and one of the best punters in small college football.

His loss is coupled with the departure of the Bulldog's other halfback, co-captain Pete Furo. And to make the backfield a real question mark for 1972, the second "critical" vacancy to be filled is at quarterback, where last year's co-captain John Zupetz performed so well.

"Defensively we expect to be strong," Malosky said. "We have virtually everybody back and we have strong contenders for the few positions where there are openings.

"But on offense, we're just hoping at this stage of the game. It's tough to lose your veteran halfbacks and quarterback all at the same time."

Junior Eric Kaiser will undoubtedly man the fullback job where he was the Bulldog's leading rusher last season. However, Malosky said the rest of the backfield is open.

Steve Skildum, captain-elect for 1972, will be a key performer as a guard on offense and a linebacker on defense.
