

Prospects

1963 is a rebuilding year at UMD.

Coach Jim Malosky faces the task of moulding a challenger without 10 top performers from last fall's MIAC runnerup. Graduation's toll is being felt at end, guard, center and halfback. Center and end are of particular concern.

The departure of Fran Murphy, Gordy Johnson, Gus Kohlts and Al Hansen has created the problem on the flanks. Dave Nystrom and Jerry Wherley leave a huge gap at center. Ed Galarneault and Jack McDowell have graduated from tackle and guard spots respectively.

While Malosky is expected to search for answers until

the last moment, these are the current indications.

END-Sophomores Dean Hoglund and Bill Kuusisto are slated to go both ways, with Ron Murphy, a jack of all trades backing them up. Freshman prospects are good but time is needed before they will be ready for game action.

THE PROBLEM-Hoglund and Kuusisto are sophomores with little game experience while Murphy is new to the

position.

TACKLES-A solid position with Dick Carlson and Rob Galarneault as offensive starters and Dick Kosteliz joining Carlson on defense. Marty Rosen and John Sweeney provide good depth.

THE PROBLEM-None critical with experienced veter-

ans available.

GUARDS-Dave Schwartz is a fixture with the other position up for grabs. Senior Bob Tusler has the inside track with newcomer James Wollack in contention.

THE PROBLEM-Position lacks real strength and depth, due to lack of size of the top candidates and limited

game experience.

CENTER-Two converted guards, Bob Dahl and Pat Fahey man the position. Neither lettered last fall. This is a real problem spot.

THE PROBLEM-Neither man is at his natural position. Fahey saw limited action at guard last fall while

Dahl seldom played.

The departure of starting halfbacks John Nachtsheim and Bruce Johnson have created the backfield problem.

QUARTERBACK-Returning regular Bob Naslund and last year's top frosh, Ray Norsted provide a solid one-two punch.

THE PROBLEM-The search for a third man to back up

a talented pair is the only problem here.

HALFBACK-Dick LeBeau, Rick Thomson and transfer Roger Halverson are the top candidates. LeBeau, the MIAC 100 yd. dash champion, and Thomson are the likely first game starters.

THE PROBLEM-A real lack of game experience. LeBeau has carried the ball 41 times, Thomson only 4, while Halverson is in his first season. Speedster LeBeau has averaged almost 7.4 yards per carry and is the key to success.

FULLBACK-Starter Ken Schloer is the best fullback ever at UMD. He is backed up by letterman Norm Mattson,

who appears to have shaken his injury woes.

THE PROBLEM-If Schloer stays healthy there are none. Otherwise the lack of depth caused by the move of Dick Fisher (to end) could be a factor.

HEAD COACH JAMES MALOSKY

In his sixth season as head coach at UMD...came to Duluth from Edina-Morningside...also did high school coaching at Morris, Minnesota...prep teams had 27-8 record and two titles in four seasons...led Edina to the mythical state prep title and an undefeated season prior to replacing Lloyd Peterson at UMD...Malosky enjoyed allstate honors in both football and basketball at Crosby-Ironton in 1945 and '46...held the No. I quarterback spot for Minnesota's Gophers (1946-49)...received B.S. and M.A. degrees from Minnesota...34 years old...married...one daughter Lisa.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR LLOYD PETERSON

Has served at UMD and its predecessor, Duluth State Teachers College since 1931. . .appointed athletic director in 1955...coached football from 1931-57. . .gave up coaching duties to concentrate on athletic directorship. . .received BA degree from Minnesota in 1925—MA in 1929. . . served as athletic director and football coach at University high in Minneapolis (1926-31). . .did initial coaching at Owatonna High School (1925). . .played football with Gophers as a fullback. .led Duluth teams to Teachers College Conference championships in 1934 and 1937 and shared four other titles. . .native of Wilmar. . .father of five. . .son Jim earned letters in 1950 and 1954 as a regular back. . .all four daughters, Jeanne, Mary, Nancy and Sigie were honored as Homecoming queens.

NORM OLSON

Has assisted Malosky since his arrival...came to UMD as head basketball coach in 1953...his cagers have won four MIAC titles...received MS degree from the University of Wisconsin, and completed advanced work at the University of Indiana...two daughters, Karen and Camilla.

GALARNEAULT, ROBERT...senior tackle from Aitkin... will man one of starting spots along with Carlson...paired with brother Ed last fall and did solid job...rangy (6-2, 225 pounds) performer.

HOGLUND, DEAN...sophomore end from Cambridge...one of top frosh last season...slated to go both ways at right end this fall...established defensive performer, but a question on offense...grabbed one pass for 13 yards in 62...has gained strength with 15 pound weight gain to 200 pounds...stands 6-2...teamed with quarterback Norsted at Cambridge.

KOSTELIZ, RICHARD...junior tackle from Gilbert...may start as defensive right tackle...has improved steadily... brother Ron was an all-conference performer as Bulldog tackle...another of the 6-footers among line candidates.

LEBEAU, RICHARD. . .junior halfback from Duluth East . . .scheduled for starting lineup as offensive halfback and defensive safety. . .MIAC 100 yard dash champion with 9.9 clocking in conference meet. . .voted outstanding track performer by teammates. . .lacks experience at halfback. . .has carried ball only 41 times in two seasons.
