The society has been involved with many famous exploratory expeditions, including those of polar explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton, naturalist Charles Darwin, explorers Stanley and Livingstone, and the first man to summit Mt. Everest, Sir Edmund Hillary. Work of the society's members today has expanded to include many applications of geography, including international economic development and climate change.

Career Development

The University's **PearsonVue Certified Testing Center** was officially reopened as of October 2nd. UMC's PearsonVue Certified Testing Center is authorized to offer a variety of licensing exams, more specifically and particularly important to UMC students - MTLE & NES exams.

Minnesota Teacher Licensure Examinations (MTLE) were developed in alignment with Minnesota regulations and content standards for teachers, including the Minnesota Board of Teaching Rules. MTLE tests are designed to measure a candidate's proficiency levels in basic skills, pedagogy, and a specific content area, based on Minnesota policies for each field.

National Evaluation Series (NES) is a teacher certification testing program. NES tests are aligned to professionally accepted, national subject and pedagogy standards. The test fields range from tests of essential academic skills in reading, writing, mathematics, and technology literacy to tests of a candidate's knowledge of pedagogy and specific content areas.

University of Minnesota System

Free webinars are scheduled during National Retirement Security Week open to all employees. The one-hour sessions cover personal finance, investing, and saving for retirement (including what to consider just before you retire). The webinars will be led by representatives from investment firms that participate in the University's voluntary retirement plans.
