



From Facilities

It's fall and the mice are starting to look for a nice warm place to spend the winter. This means inside. We've had numerous reports of mice in offices in the last two weeks. To help avoid a mouse infestation please do not leave food items in your office. Mice do not need a very large opening to enter a space so leaving the food in a desk drawer or file cabinet is not a deterrent to mouse. If you do see a mouse please report it to your custodian or call the Facilities office (8483) so we can get traps set.

The heat is on!

- If you open a window to get some fresh air into a space please remember to close the window when you leave. As our temperatures move below freezing open windows could allow pipes to freeze causing a flood when the pipes split.

- If you are using a space heater, please plug it directly into a wall outlet, not a power strip, extension cord or an outlet in a cubicle partition. Plugging a space heater into anything other than a wall outlet creates a fire hazard. Please also turn off and unplug the space heater when you leave your office.

- Accessible doors--if you need to use the accessible doors please do so, however be aware that accessible doors take approximately 30 seconds to go to full open, hold, then close. A non-accessible door take approximately 7 seconds for a person to pull it full open, enter and have the door go to full close. There is a lot of air transfer that can occur in the additional 23 seconds and this can affect the comfort in areas that are located close to exterior entries.




