

Campus



If there has been one overriding characteristic about the University of Minnesota-Duluth that hasn't changed in all of its 91 years - that characteristic is growth.

Before Minnesota-Duluth (founded as Duluth Normal School at the turn of the century) became a coordinate campus of the University of Minnesota in 1947, the site the present day faculty occupies was nothing more than brush and woods. By the early 1950s however, the campus was already taking shape with the Science Building (now called the Chemistry Building) and the Physical Education Building in place. Administrators had a far-reaching plan for Minnesota-Duluth's orderly development to 1970. The plan envisioned a student body of 3,500 students by 1970 - more than 5,000 students were actually enrolled by then.

Today, as indicated by this year's enrollment of over 7,800 students, Minnesota-Duluth continues its steady growth. New programs recently developed at Minnesota-Duluth include the first four-year computer engineering program in the state of Minnesota and two four-year degrees in industrial and materials processing engineering.

Minnesota-Duluth also offers more instructional programs then ever for both undergraduate and graduate students in six colleges and schools. Students choose from over 70 undergraduate majors leading to four associate (two-year) degrees and 10 bachelor's degrees, with teacher licensure offered in about 40 areas. Graduate students can earn five master's degrees in 14 fields, with the School of Medicine offering the first two years of graduate basic science.

The campus, located in the Arrowhead region of Northeastern Minnesota overlooking Lake Superior, has 35 buildings, some unique to college campuses: Tweed Museum of Art, Marshall W. Alworth Planetarium, Marshall Performing Arts Center, Sports and Health Center, and the nearby Glensheen Mansion.

Minnesota-Duluth's 91 years of continued growth, now under the leadership of sixth-year Chancellor Dr. Lawrence A. Ianni, is a prime example of the area's commitment to quality higher education.

The University of Minnesota-Duluth baseball program has enjoyed a tremendous amount of success under the expert guidance of veteran head coach Scott Hanna, who is in his 14th year with the Bulldogs. Since taking over the coaching reigns from Al Holland in 1979, Hanna has compiled an impressive 257-161 overall record (which includes 13 consecutive non-losing seasons) to go with a 133-89 mark in Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference play and directed the 1992 Bulldogs to their first NSIC title. For his efforts, Hanna was named the NAIA District 13 Coach of the Year in both 1990 and 1991.

Hanna, a native of Duluth, attended Duluth Central High School where he was a three-sport standout in football, hockey and baseball. Upon graduation in 1969, he enrolled at Minnesota-Duluth and continued both his football and baseball careers. As a member of Jim Malosky's football unit, Hanna earned All-Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic (MIAC) recognition as an offensive center in addition to being voted the Bulldogs' Outstanding Lineman (Glen Johnson Award) as a senior. He also was a starter with the Minnesota-Duluth baseball contingent during the 1972 and 1973 seasons.

For the past 15 years, Hanna, 42, has been an assistant football coach at Minnesota-Duluth and is also the equipment manager for the athletic department. He and his wife, Donna (also a Minnesota-Duluth athletic alumnus), have four children -- Kelly, Ryan, Tommy and John.



Mike Thomas is now in his 11th year as assistant coach at Minnesota-Duluth. Thomas, a 1977 graduate of William Kelley High School in Silver Bay, MN, was a foursport letterwinner for the Mariners, participating in baseball, football, hockey, and track and field. He attended Minnesota-Duluth for four years (1977-1981) and was a regular all four of those campaigns with the Bulldog football team. Besides gaining All-Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference honors in 1979 and 1980, Thomas was also bestowed with the E.L. "Duce" Rasmussen Award for scholastic achievement as a senior and was selected to the Associated Press' Little All-American team that same year. Thomas, 34, was graduated from Minnesota-Duluth in May 1981 with a physical education and psychology degree. He is married to former Minnesota-Duluth basketball and softball standout Kelli Ritzer.

Outlook

Pitching and defense are what usually win baseball championships. Minnesota-Duluth's **Scott Hanna** is one head coach who has experienced firsthand just how important those two ingredients are to a team's success.

In 1992, for example, the Bulldog pitching staff had a collective 2.86 earned run average, the second best figure in school history. The defense did the pitchers one better, fielding at a record .976 clip. The end result: a 21-10 overall record and Minnesota-Duluth's first-ever Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference baseball title.

Although a hefty total of some 15 lettermen return from last season's championship club, the Bulldogs will have a bit of work to do in terms of finding replacements for a few of their departed personnel. Among those are shortstop Mark Slattengren, the club's Most Valuable Player in 1992, and pitchers Brett Tucker (5-1 with a 1.87 earned run average) and Mike Lenarz (6-2 and 2.11) -- both of whom landed All-NSIC acclaim last spring. Replacing two pitchers of that quality is obviously one of Hanna's most pressing concerns as the Bulldogs embark on their 22nd season of Intercollegiate baseball.

"We had an outstanding rotation last year, "says Hanna. "You don't replace a Tucker or a Lenarz. We just have to hope that some of our other pitchers can step up and fill the void."


One hurler that Hanna and the Bulldogs should be able to count on this spring is junior Dave Thoreson. Thoreson stepped into the Minnesota-Duluth starting rotation last spring and responded by racking up a 5-1 record and a team-leading 1.40 ERA. Senior Brian LaShomb (the school's all-time save leader with 10) has been a fixture in the bullpen during his Bulldog tenure, but the versatile right-hander could be used more as a starter this season. After Thoreson and LaShomb, however, the Minnesota-Duluth pitching staff is a bit thin on game experience. Some of those somewhat untested commodities who will probably play bigger roles for the Bulldogs this spring are senior Dave Wallin (1-2 in 1992), sophomores Jeff Wallace and Pat Etter and freshman Damien Paulson. Newcomers include junior Robby Ott, a

transfer from Itasca Community College, and freshman **Jon Anderson**.

While pitching could be a question mark for the 1993 Bulldogs, the infield -- both offensively and defensively -- should be a strong suit. Anchored by a trio of juniors in second baseman Jon Dilley (a .282 batting average and, 22 runs scored in 29 games one year ago), third baseman Craig Frericks (.351, and 21 runs batted in), and first baseman Tony Hanten (.308), a 1992 All-NSIC pick, the Minnesota-



Duluth infield appears to be nothing shy of rock-solid. The only hole is at shortstop where the likes of sophomore Tom Wallin and Troy Seibert headline the list of applicants seeking to fill the vacancy left by Slattengren's departure. Junior first baseman/designated hitter Mike Berset (.272), junior third baseman Rod Teichroew, sophomore shortstop/third baseman Troy Loomis and senior catcher Jim Theis, who split catching duties with Brad Takkunen in 1992, provide the Bulldog infield with an abundance of depth and flexibility.

In the outfield, sophomore Jason Lukovsky (.310), the 1992 Bulldog Rookie of the Year, is the lone returning starter from a season ago. Part-timer Aaron Swanson, a junior, and sophomores Mike Walker and Tim Burns could all be bumped up to more regular playing duty as outfield mates of Lukovsky this spring. Junior Erick Anderson, a newcomer to the Bulldog program, is also being targeted for extensive deployment in the outfield.

"I think that overall we will have a better-hitting team this year," says Hanna, whose troops batted .279 in 1992. "It took us awhile to get on track with the bats last spring, and hopefully this time around it won't take so long. We'll have an experienced lineup and I think we can score some runs. The key for us will be if our pitching holds up."







Athletics

Now in its 60th year of existence, University of Minnesota-Duluth athletics continue to reign as one of the most well-balanced and competitive programs in the Upper Midwest. Minnesota-Duluth is a member of both the NCAA (Division II) except for hockey, which competes at the Division I level, and the NAIA (Division I). The Bulldogs belong to the seven-school Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in all sports with the exception of hockey which is aligned with the prestigious Western Collegiate Hockey Association, an NCAA Division I circuit.


During the course of the 1991-92 athletic season, Bulldog teams captured conference championships in baseball, men's basketball, softball, men's tennis, wrestling and women's volleyball. The men's and women's basketball contingents both advanced to the NAIA National Tournament last winter while the wrestling, volleyball, and men's and women's track teams sent representatives to NCAA II national and/or regional

events. In addition, Minnesota-Duluth laid claim to an unprecedented seventh straight NSIC all-sports title.

Overseeing the Bulldogs' 14-varsity sports (eight men and six women) program is Bruce McLeod, who is in his ninth full year as the Director of Intercollegiate Athletics. McLeod, 45, succeeded the late Ralph Romano in December 1983 after working his way through virtually the entire Minnesota-Duluth Athletic Department. He served, at one time or another, as the sports information director, the business manager, and assistant athletic director (a position he held from 1977-1983).

A native of Fort Francis, Ontario, McLeod first made his mark at Minnesota-Duluth as a standout left wing on the Bulldog hockey team. During his three-year collegiate ice career (1966-69), McLeod racked up 81 points in 77 games and was the Bulldogs' captain as a senior during the 1968-69 season.

McLeod, a 1969 graduate of Minne-
