The Coach

MEL FRATZKE

A continued revival of UMD basketball is assured this year as Mel Fratzke prepares for his sophomore year as head coach.

Fratzke came to UMD last year after one year on leave from LeTourneau College (Texas). During that year, he completed PhD work at Indiana University.

Following graduation and all-conference honors at Watertown High School in Minnesota, the second year Bulldog coach moved to Trinity College, Illinois, where his team won 68% of their games during his three year stay. He won all-conference honors at Trinity, where he served as team captain for two years.

He served as head coach at LeTourneau, located in Longview, Texas, for a total of five seasons after a short stint as assistant coach at Aurora College. At LeTourneau, Fratzke took an 8-15 slate for 1967-68 and built that into a 19-9 mark by 1971-72, earning the college a constant spot in the NAIA top twenty. His 1971-72 squad was third nationally in team free throw percentage and twelfth nationally in team field goal percentage. As a member of the Big State Conference, Fratzke's teams compiled 37 wins and 19 losses during his last two seasons of coaching. Only the presence of No. 1 ranked Sam Houston State and top ranked Stephen F. Austin in the same district, prevented LeTourneau from greater national recognition.

Although achieving only a 10-16 record last year, Fratzke helped the Bulldogs to a No. 24 ranking in NAIA free throw shooting. Also, the Fratzke-led squad placed No. 1 in free throw percentage as a team in the NAIA District 13 ratings. Several individuals also placed high in the District ratings for UMD.

"I have always wanted to return to Minnesota to coach," says Fratzke, "and I feel that Duluth is an outstanding community in which to settle and raise a family. I believe that there is a great opportunity for UMD to excel in basketball, and I like the challenge and the promise of success that my position as head coach offers. The MIAC is one of the finest small-college leagues in the country, gaining the national respect of many basketball-followers."

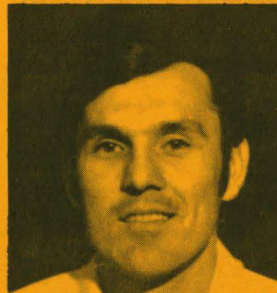

DAVE HOPKINS

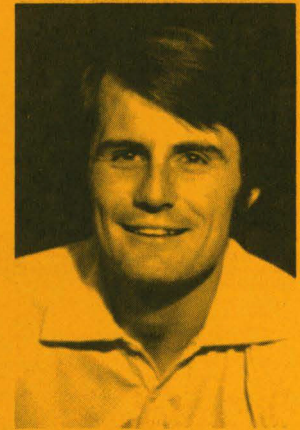
Dave Hopkins begins his second year as Fratzke's top hand. Hopkins, a native of Elyria, Ohio, and a former assistant basketball coach at the College of Wooster, Wooster, Ohio, also serves UMD as its new Intramural Director.

He is completing his doctorate work at UMD, which he started at the University of Indiana, where he also did scouting work for the Indiana basketball team. He graduated from Wooster in 1970 with a B.A., and earned a M.A. at Wooster in 1972.

While an undergraduate, Hopkins was a two year letterman in basketball and a three year all-conference

selection and MVP in baseball. Following graduation he was named assistant baseball and basketball coach at Wooster. Their 70-71 and 71-72 basketball teams with 23-1 and 19-4 records, respectively, were conference champions and represented the Ohio Athletic Conference in the NCAA Small College National Championships.

Aside from assisting Fratzke with his duties, Hopkins is responsible for coaching the varsity reserve team, and for the intercollegiate recruiting program. He also handles the coordination of the varsity defenses and press attacks.
