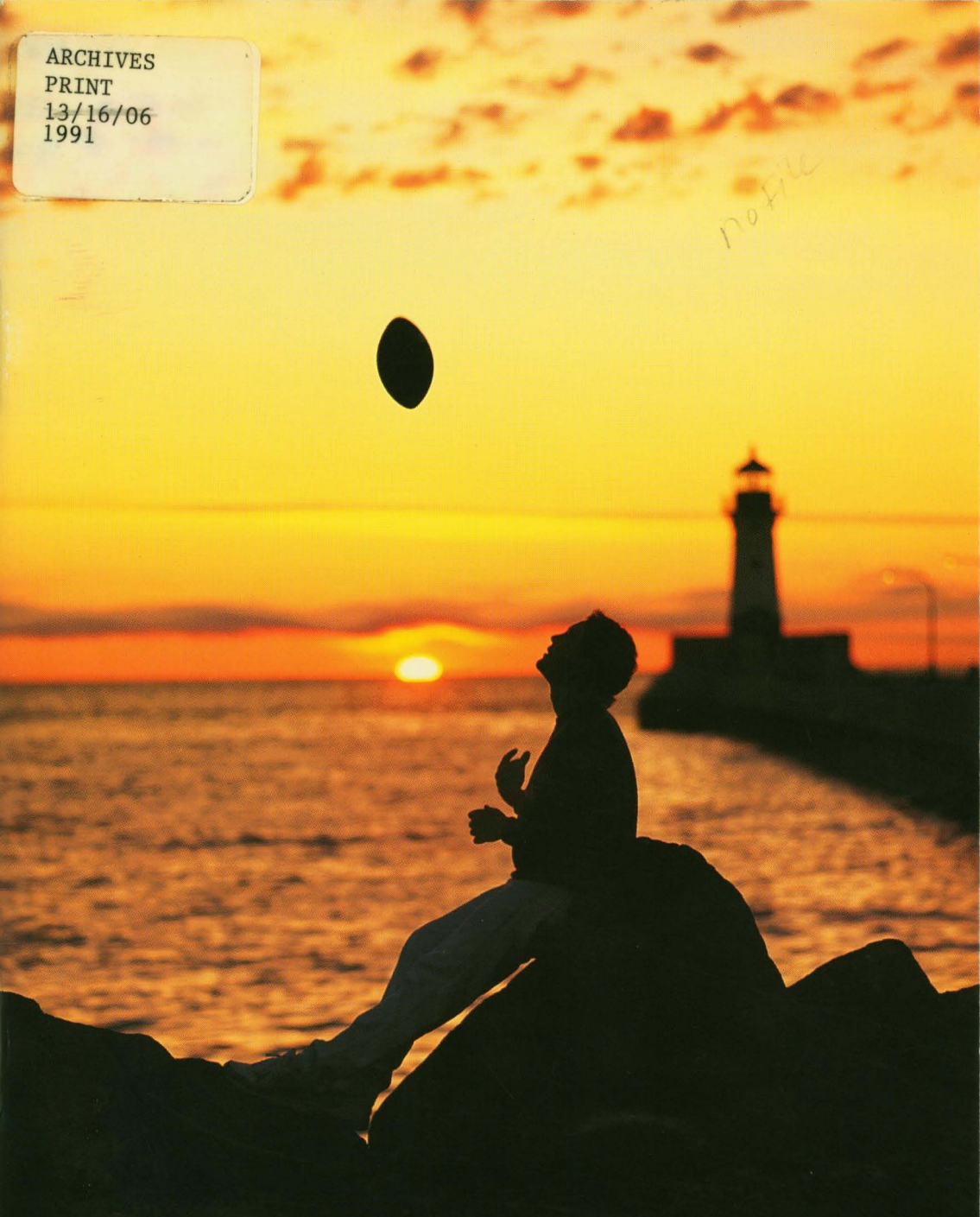

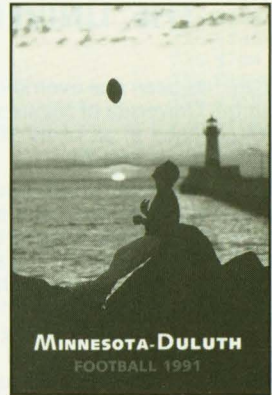

## ON THE COVER:

Finding a marquee halfback on the University of Minnesota-Duluth roster in any given year is usually as sure a thing as, well, the sun coming up in the morning. Folks like Ted McKnight, Terry Egerdahl, Corey Veech, Tom Stoll, Dick Pesonen, and Amory Bodin, just to name just a few, have all left lasting impressions as Bulldogs for the ways they could run with the football. That same fate could now very well be in store for one Eric Ivar Rajala. The senior from Grand Rapids paced the Bulldogs in rushing one year ago despite not seeing backfield time until the fifth game of the season. Rajala, a 1990 All-NIC selection, was also first among Bulldogs in scoring and earned Minnesota-Duluth's Most Valuable Player Award. Rajala's 5.7 yards per carry average, incidentally, is second only to McKnight's 5.9 yards per rush figure on the Bulldog career charts.

## THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA-DULUTH

There has been one overriding characteristic about the University of Minnesota-Duluth that hasn't changed in all of its 90 years — that characteristic is growth.

Before Minnesota-Duluth (founded as Duluth Normal School at the turn of the century) became a coordinate campus of the University of Minnesota in 1947, the site the present day facility occupies was nothing more than brush and woods. By the early 1950s, however, the campus was already taking shape with the Science Building (now called the Chemistry Building) and the Physical Education Building in place. Administrators had a far-reaching plan for Minnesota-Duluth's orderly development to 1970. The plan envisioned a student body of 3,500 students by 1970 — more than 5,000 students were actually enrolled by then.

Today, as indicated by this year's enrollment of over 7,800 students, Minnesota-Duluth continues its steady growth. New programs recently developed at Minnesota-Duluth include the first four-year computer engineering program in the state of Minnesota and two four-year degrees in industrial and materials processing engineering.

Minnesota-Duluth also offers more instructional programs than ever for both undergraduate and graduate students in six colleges and schools. Students choose from over 70 undergraduate majors leading to four associate (two-year) degrees and 10 bachelor's degrees, with teacher licensure offered in about 40 areas. Graduate students can earn five master's degrees in 14 fields, with the School of Medicine offering the first two years of graduate basic science.

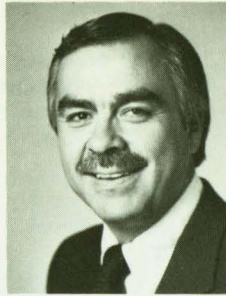
The campus, located in the Arrowhead region of Northeastern Minnesota overlooking Lake Superior, has 35 buildings, some unique to college campuses: Tweed Museum of Art, Marshall W. Alworth Planetarium, Marshall Performing Arts Center, Sports and Health Center, and the nearby Glensheen Mansion.

Minnesota-Duluth's 90 years of continued growth, now under the leadership of fifth-year Chancellor Dr. Lawrence A. Ianni, is a prime example of the area's commitment to quality higher education.

# MINNESOTA-DULUTH ATHLETICS

The University of Minnesota-Duluth offers one of the most balanced as well as competitive athletic programs for schools of its size in the country. Minnesota-Duluth is a member of the NCAA (Division II) except for hockey, which competes at the Division I level) and the NAIA. The Bulldog men are members of the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (again with the exception of hockey which is aligned with the prestigious Western Collegiate Hockey Association) while the Minnesota-Duluth women participate in the Northern Sun Conference.

In 1990-91, Bulldog teams captured conference championships in men's and women's basketball, men's tennis, wrestling, women's volleyball, softball and women's indoor and outdoor track and field and women's 50K. The men's basketball, wrestling, women's basketball, men's tennis, and softball contingents all advanced to golf NAIA national cham-

pionships last year while the men's and women's track and field teams and women's golf teams sent representatives to NCAA II national events. In addition, Minnesota-Duluth laid claim to its sixth straight NIC all-sports title.

Overseeing the Bulldogs' 14-varsity sports (eight men and six women) program is Bruce McLeod, who is in his eighth full year as the Director of Intercollegiate Athletics. McLeod, 44, succeeded the late Ralph Romano in December 1983 after working his way through virtually the entire Minnesota-Duluth Athletic Department. He served, at one time or another, as the sports information director, the business manager, and assistant athletic director (a position he held from 1977-1983).

A native of Fort Francis, Ontario, McLeod first made his mark at Minnesota-Duluth as a standout left wing on the Bulldog hockey team. During his three-year collegiate ice career (1966-69), McLeod racked up 81 points in 77 games and was the Bulldogs' captain as a senior during the 1968-69 season.

McLeod who is married to the former Sandee Halstad of Two Harbors, MN, is a 1969 graduate of Minnesota-Duluth, he has two daughters, Leah and Shannon.

# THE NORTHERN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONFERENCE

Long recognized as one of the most distinguished athletic unions in the Upper Midwest, the Northern Intercollegiate Conference traces its colorful roots back to 1932. Since those 59 plus years, the NIC has undergone several faceliftings, but despite the additions and subtractions, it remains one of the strongholds of college division athletics.

The NIC currently includes seven schools — Bemidji State University, the University of Minnesota-Duluth, the University of Minnesota-Morris, Moorhead State University, Northern State College, Southwest State University, and Winona State University. Bemidji, Minnesota-Duluth, Moorhead, and Winona were charter members when six schools joined hands to form the original Northern Teachers College Conference in 1932. Mankato State University and St. Cloud State University were initial subscribers to the NTCC as well. In 1947, Minnesota-Duluth withdrew from the NIC to join the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) but 11 years later Michigan Tech University was admitted to restore the NIC to a six-team circuit. In 1969, Mankato latched on to the North Central Conference and Minnesota-Morris joined the NIC that same year. The following year, Southwest State became a full-fledged member of the NIC family. However, change did not stop with the advent of the 1970s. Minnesota-Duluth rejoined the NIC in 1976 while Mankato, after a brief reappearance in the NIC (1978-1980), hooked up with the NCC



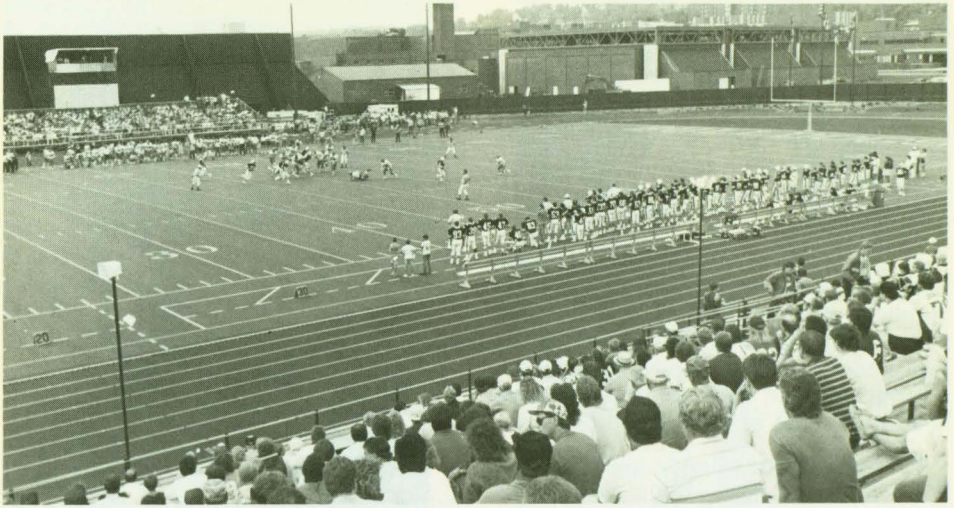
again prior to the 1981 campaign along with St. Cloud State, Michigan Tech meanwhile departed the NIC after the 1979-80 season to join the Great Lakes Conference closer to home. In 1980, Northern State of Aberdeen, SD, officially became part of the NIC, bringing the league to its present seven-member unit.

Though the NIC was conceived in 1932, this season will be the 55th for the conference in football as there was a three-year sabbatical during World War II (1943-45).

Besides football, the NIC holds championships in eight other sports for men including baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis, and wrestling.

## GRIGGS FIELD - HOME OF BULLDOG FOOTBALL

Talk about a home field advantage. Since moving over from Public Schools Stadium in west Duluth to the on-campus confines of Griggs Field nearly a quarter of a century ago, the University of Minnesota-Duluth certainly has made the most of its home field opportunities. In 113 lifetime appearances at Griggs Field dating back to the official opening of the facility on Oct. 29, 1966 against the College of St. Thomas, the Bulldogs have posted a 87-24-2 overall for a .779 winning percentage. Equally as impressive is the fact that during those 25 years, Minnesota-Duluth has suffered just one losing season at home

(in 1968 when the Bulldogs registered a 2-3-0 mark at Griggs Field).

In 1985, Griggs Field underwent a major facelift of sorts as Super Turf II was installed (making it one of only two on-campus football facilities in Minnesota equipped with an artificial playing surface) along with an eight-lane all weather track, a modern scoreboard and bleachers. In addition to housing the Bulldogs, the 4,000-seat Griggs Field also hosts a number of high school football playoff contests and track and field meets throughout the year.

# JIM MALOSKY

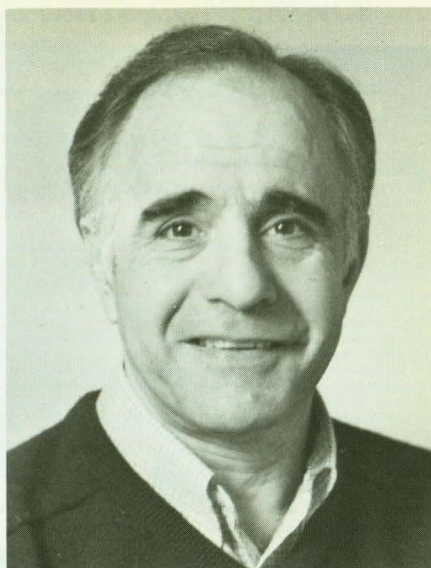
## Head Coach

Now with over three decades of Bulldog coaching behind him, Jim Malosky enters the 1991 season as truly the elder statesman of the entire Minnesota-Duluth athletic staff.

In 33 seasons at Minnesota-Duluth, Malosky has racked up some mighty big numbers, including a 212-95-11 (.684) overall record which makes him the winningest active coach in the NCAA Division II ranks and the sixth winningest active head man in all of college football.

But perhaps consistency, even more so than winning, has been Malosky's foremost trademark. Since 1976, Malosky-coached teams have lost more than three games in a season only four times (1983, 1984, 1988, and 1989). His 1980 contingent, regarded by many as one of the finest football groups ever assembled at Minnesota-Duluth, turned in a perfect 10-0-0 record and finished among the nation's top 10 NCAA Division II schools. And, like a fine wine, Malosky just seems to get better with age. In the last 11 years alone, he guided the Bulldogs to a 81-27-3 overall mark.

Malosky surpassed the longevity record of his predecessor, Lloyd Peterson, when he completed his 25th season with Minnesota-Duluth in 1982. Peterson directed the Bulldogs for 24 years, and except for six games coached by Frank Kovach in Minnesota-Duluth's inaugural campaign way back in 1930, he and Malosky have strolled the sidelines for every other Bulldog football contest since then.



Malosky, 63, first became known in Minnesota football circles when he captured All-State honors while quarterbacking Crosby-Ironton High School. He was recruited by the legendary Bernie Bierman at the University of Minnesota, and, during his collegiate career from 1946-49, the Gophers compiled a 25-11-0 record, including identical 7-2-0 marks in Malosky's junior and senior seasons when he was the club's starting signal-caller.

After receiving a B.S. degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1951, Malosky began a stint in the U.S. Army. From there it was on to Morris, MN, where he taught and coached at Morris High School, leading the Tigers to the West Central Conference championship with an 8-1-0 record. In 1956 he landed another prep coaching job at Morningside High School in Edina, MN,

and, in his second year guided his troops to an unblemished 9-0-0 record, a Lake Conference championship and a No. 1 ranking among Minnesota High Schools by the Associated Press.

The following year, 1958, Malosky accepted Minnesota-Duluth's invitation to become only its third football coach in history. In only his third season as the Bulldogs' head man, Malosky directed Minnesota-Duluth to the MIAC title, a feat the Bulldogs repeated again in 1961.

In all, Malosky has won three MIAC titles, four NIC championships and he has been named Coach of the Year by the MIAC, the NIC and the NAIA District 13 on nine occasions.

Malosky, and his wife, Lilah, have four children—Lisa (29), Linda (27), Jim (a former quarterback at Minnesota-Duluth and now a Bulldog assistant coach), and Tammy (23). In addition to his football duties, he is also an associate professor in Minnesota-Duluth's physical education department.

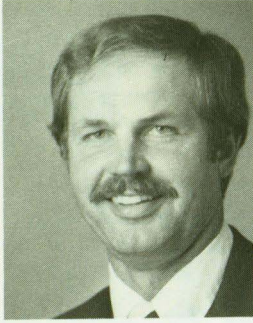

## THE ASSISTANT COACHES



### NEIL LADSTEN — Offensive Coordinator

The veteran of Malosky's assistants, Ladsten is in his 21st season with the Bulldog football program. Ladsten captained the 1968 Minnesota-Duluth grid squad as a senior, winning All-MIAC honors as an offensive tackle that season and after his junior campaign as well. For his football and classroom heroics, Ladsten was accorded the E.L. "Duce" Rasmussen Scholastic Achievement Award in 1969. Ladsten, 44, an instructor in the Minnesota-Duluth physical education department, also has directed the Bulldogs' wrestling team the past 20 years. The Spring Grove, MN, native was bestowed with NIC Coach of the Year laurels in 1982-83, 1987-88, 1989-90, and 1990-91 after guiding Minnesota-Duluth to conference titles. Since 1979-80, Ladsten-coached teams have compiled an 93-50-0 record in dual meets and Bulldogs have earned NCAA Division II or NAIA All-American recognition on eighteen occasions.



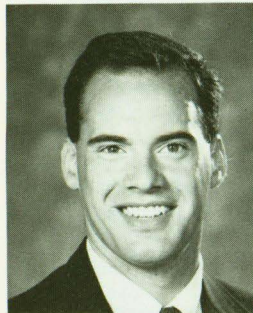
### SCOTT HANNA — Linebackers/Defensive Line

A former All-MIAC center with the Bulldogs, Hanna begins his 14th season as a Minnesota-Duluth assistant coach this fall. During that time, Hanna has helped develop a host of top-notch linebackers and defensive linemen. A Bulldog for four years (1969-73), Hanna was the recipient of Minnesota-Duluth's Outstanding Lineman Award. A native of Duluth, he also played two years of collegiate baseball in 1972 and 1973. For the past thirteen years, Hanna, 41, has also been Minnesota-Duluth's baseball coach, racking up an impressive 236-151-2 overall record. He is employed by the Minnesota-Duluth athletic department as an equipment manager. Hanna and his wife, Donna, have four children: Kelly (15), Ryan (7), Tommy (4) and John (3).



### VINCE REPESH — Defensive Coordinator

The man credited with molding the Bulldog defensive unit into one of the best in NCAA Division II football, Repesh is in his eighth season as an assistant at Minnesota-Duluth. The 40-year old Chisholm, MN, native joined the Bulldogs in 1984 after a four-year stint as an assistant coach at nearby Wisconsin-Superior. Repesh, who worked as a Bulldog assistant from 1977-79, played two years of football at both Hibbing Community College (MN) and the University of North Dakota as a split end and defensive back. After graduating from UND in 1973, he remained with the Fighting Sioux football program as an assistant coach and later was the head football man at Mount St. Benedict High School in Crookston, MN. Repesh also co-directs the Athletic Academic Center at Minnesota-Duluth. He and his wife, Lillian, have a daughter, Natalie (12).



### JIM MALOSKY Jr. — Quarterbacks

The holder of a handful of Minnesota-Duluth records, Jim Malosky, Jr. returns for his third full season as a Bulldog assistant coach. Malosky, 26, concluded his playing days with the Bulldogs in 1987 as the school's all-time leader in touchdown passes (41) and total offensive plays (781). Malosky, Minnesota-Duluth's starting quarterback as a sophomore, junior, and senior, also established single-season marks for total offense (1,770 yards), touchdown passes (20) and total plays (360) in 1987. The two-time All-NIC selection ranks second behind Bruce Grant in both career passing yardage (2,996) and total offense (3,690) at Minnesota-Duluth. The son of Bulldog head coach Jim Malosky, he earned a B.A. degree in physical education in 1988.

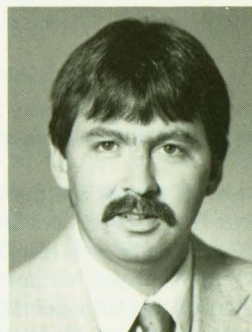
### **DON ROACH — Head Trainer**

A familiar face along the Minnesota-Duluth sidelines for over two decades, Don Roach begins his 22nd season as the Bulldogs' head trainer this fall. Roach, a native of Los Altos, CA, attended Menlo College (CA) before completing his B.A. degree in physical education and life science at San Jose State University in 1965. After a one-year teaching stint at Lassen Union High School in Susanville, CA, Roach, 49, taught for two more years in the American Community Schools in Athens, Greece before landing his present job at Minnesota-Duluth in 1970. Roach, who received an M.S. degree in athletic training at Indiana University, has served as the Bulldogs men's tennis coach for the past 17 seasons. He has directed Minnesota-Duluth to 10 straight Northern Intercollegiate Conference titles and a berth in NAIA national championships. He has two sons — Steve (21) and Mike (16).



### **RICK MENZ — Equipment Director**

A man whose value to the Bulldog athletic program is hard to appraise because of his behind-the-scenes type of work. Rick Menz is in his 11th year with the Minnesota-Duluth football contingent as the equipment coordinator. A native of Duluth, Menz is a 1969 graduate of Cathedral High School. In the fall of 1979, he was named the equipment coordinator at Minnesota-Duluth in charge of buying, issuing, repairing and maintaining equipment for all Bulldog varsity sports. While at Minnesota-Duluth, Menz completed his undergraduate degree in history and geography. In 1983 and 1991, he was an equipment manager at the U.S. Olympic Festival. The 40-year-old Menz and his wife, Sue, have a daughter, Lauri (11) and a son, Derek (8).



# A FEW MINUTES WITH JIM MALOSKY

## On the Bulldogs' 9-1-1 finish last season

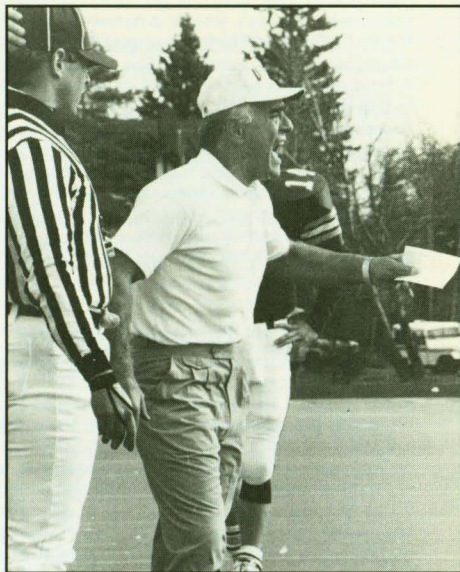
"I don't know if it was exactly a surprise. I honestly felt we had a chance to go 8-2-0 if we could stay away from injuries. The pleasing thing was that we beat St. Cloud State and Wisconsin-Eau Claire to start the season which gave us a tremendous boost. From then on, I felt we would be fine. I knew that it's awfully tough to go unbeaten during an entire year, so, yes, finishing at 9-1-1 was certainly gratifying."

## On the difference between 1990 and 1989 (when the Bulldogs posted a 5-5-0 record)

"Basically, I think there were two differences. First, in 1989, our starting quarterback Dale Gessell, who was coming off a terrific 1988 season, played hurt for a big part of the year. Second, last fall people like Eric Rajala and Chris Westberg gave us the long yardage plays, and both played consistently and stayed healthy which was a key factor in our success. Defensively, we were pretty much the same in both 1989 and 1990 -- it was the offense that turned things around for us."

## On the strengths of the 1991 Bulldogs

"I guess if you look at our depth chart you'll see that we don't lack experience at a number of positions. Our offensive line, for example, did not lose a starter from a year ago. If those guys up front can stay away from injuries, that should be one of our greatest strengths. Also we retain our starting quarterback Jeff Kaldor, our two halfbacks Troy Ausmus and Eric Rajal and our fullback Scott Stoyanoff. Likewise, we have everyone back at linebacker and in the defensive second ary. Our seniors on defense -- Dale Roehl, Troy Anderson, Sean Callahan, Clayton Handt and Joel DeMoulin -- are all veterans who will have to produce for us to be successful. The key here, as always, will be depth. After those starters, we are a little thin in some areas."



## On areas of concern for Minnesota-Duluth this season

"There is no doubt that our biggest worry has to be on the defensive line. We have to find replacements for three, three-year starters, all of whom were All-Conference caliber players. Not only do we lose a large chunk of experience there but we also lose a great deal of height. Tim Sitarz, Ron Viaene and Corey Jazdzewski were all close to the 6-4 range and right now the people we have in their spots average around 6-0. This could really be a problem. As I see it, this will really be our only major trouble spot. We'll look to Mark Adler, the only returnee from the defensive front four, for leadership. He will have to be a leader for us. Last year, our defense gave us a lot of opportunities and some pretty good field position when we took over the football. I'm a little worried whether they'll be able to do that for us this fall. I have confidence in our returning defensive players, however. I know they'll do their best. If we get beat, it will be because the other teams are more skilled, not because our players are making mistakes. There is also no question that we will really miss Chris

Westberg. He was an outstanding split end who really made some big plays for us last year. Hopefully, Eric Rajala will be able to step up and become that same kind of player this fall."

#### **On the 1991 schedule**

"It goes without saying that opening up with three straight games on the road will be no walk in the park. We start with Montana State, the first NCAA Division IAA opponent this school has ever played, go to Wisconsin-Eau Claire, who two years ago beat us down at their place, and then on to St. Cloud State, a club which holds its own in the NCAA Division II ranks. If we win even one of our first three games I will be pleased, because we are playing some really tough competition. The problem with all of those games away from home in a row is that our roster on road trips is limited. This doesn't enable us to get a look at as many people as we'd have like to. If we can survive the first third or so of the season we should be

okay, provided we can stay healthy. I think that once we get into conference play, everything will come together."

#### **On the large group of seniors on the 1991 roster**

"Yes, there are a lot of seniors on the roster (15) this fall -- quite a bit more than we normally have. Many of these guys have been starting since they were freshmen, which means that we will be losing a lot of experience next year."

#### **On this year's NIC race**

"I think that Southwest State has to be considered one of the pre-season favorites. They've got most of their personnel back from last year, including Jeff Loots, their All-Conference quarterback. Of course, Moorhead State is always a threat and Northern State should once again have something to say about who finished on top once November rolls around."

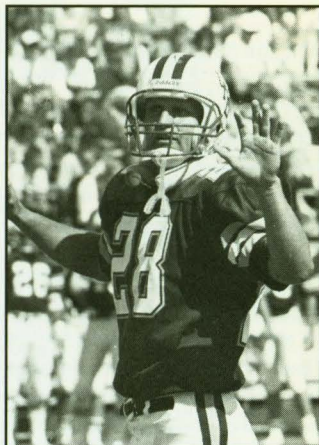
# 1991 MINNESOTA-DULUTH PREVIEW

With just four full-time starters gone from a year ago, the University of Minnesota-Duluth should have veterans a plenty as it embarks on its 59th year of varsity football in 1991.

A grand total of 40 lettermen, including some 22 players with previous starting experience, are back this fall with the Bulldogs, who posted a 9-1-1 overall record (marking its 21st straight year without a losing season) and won a share of its 10th Northern Intercollegiate Conference title with a 5-1-0 mark. The Minnesota-Duluth offense, which made a drastic turnaround last season after sputtering for most of the 1988 campaign, welcomes back 10 regulars from a year ago. Headlining that extensive list of returnees is senior halfback **Eric Rajala**, an All-NIC selection in 1990 who paced Minnesota-Duluth in rushing (759 yards on 136 carries) and scoring (44 points) despite not starting until the sixth game of the season. **Rajala** will be joined in the backfield by fellow senior halfback **Troy Ausmus**, a third-year starter, senior fullback **Scott Stoyanoff**, and sophomore **Gary Schoeller**, Minnesota-Duluth's 1990 Freshman of the Year and the only true Bulldog freshman to see playing time last season. Senior **Jeff Kaldor**, who received his first real taste of intercollegiate competition in 1990 (54 completions in 111 attempts and just one interception for 746 yards and nine touchdowns in eight starts), will assume the quarterback duties with sophomore **Greg Valaskey** waiting in the wings. Up front, All-NIC tackle **Paul Paczynski** anchors a seasoned group which includes fellow senior center **Kirk Swanson**, senior right guard **Chris Donahue**, junior left guard **Bob Dahl** and junior left tackle **Bob Schwartz**. Paczynski, Donahue and Dahl all have two or more years of starting tenure behind them. Juniors **Jeff Walker** and **Jason Crane** solidify the tight end position while **Ted Greely**, who battled knee ailments as a sophomore last year, will push Swanson for the starting nod at center. The lone question mark in the offensive scheme is at wide receiver where two-time All-NIC selection Chris Westberg has departed after topping the Bulldogs in pass receptions in 1990. Sophomore

**Loren Sposito** is among the numerous candidates seeking to fill Westberg's vacancy.

Over on the defensive side, there is both good news in bad news. The good news is that the Bulldogs retain eight starters from last year's NIC championship club. The bad news

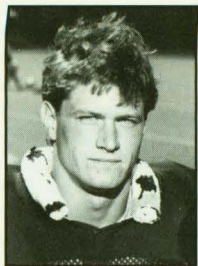
is that the three starters they lose were all three-year regulars on the defensive line (tackles Ron Viaene, Corey Jazdzewski, and end Tim Sitarz). The lone incumbent from the interior is junior right end **Mark Adler**. Senior strong safety **Dale Roehl**, who will serve as the Bulldogs' team captain in 1991, is embarking on his third year as a starter. He'll be flanked by junior free safety **Jason Wolf**, who tied Roehl for team honors in interceptions with six one year ago, junior **Lane Harstad** at right cornerback and either senior **Troy Anderson** or junior **Lance Sage** at left cornerback. Sage may also be transplanted over to wide receiver. The linebacker position is likewise loaded with talent and depth with the likes of seniors **Joel DeMoulin** and **Sean Callahan**, who ranked 1-2 in tackles last year, and **Clayton Handt** all back. The Bulldogs finished first in the NIC in total, rushing, passing and scoring defense and fourth in the NCAA Division II in rushing defense (73.5 yards per game) in 1990.

Leon Berg's 33-yard touchdown reception helped spark the Bulldogs to a 17-14 season-opening victory over St. Cloud State last year.



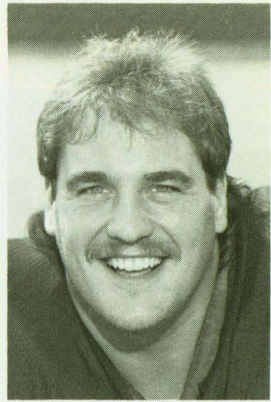

# 58 YEARS OF BULLDOG FOOTBALL

*"Duluth State Teachers College had its first team in 1930, and 28 players responded to Coach Kovach's call."*

So records the 1930-31 yearbook, *The Chronicle*, depicting the origins of Bulldogs history when Minnesota-Duluth wasn't Minnesota-Duluth at all, but rather the Duluth State Teachers College (DSTC). "Coach Kovach" is Frank Kovach, an industrial arts specialist who organized and coached the first team that would later evolve into one of the most successful college programs in the land.

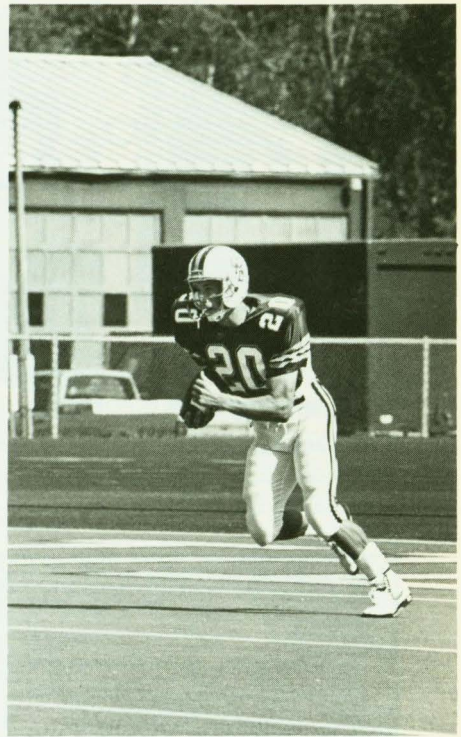
Appropriately enough, Kovach also became Minnesota-Duluth's first coach to direct his troops to an unbeaten season as the Bulldogs debuted in 1930 with two ties—a scoreless tie against Itasca Junior College, and a 6-6 deadlock versus Duluth Junior College - - and three losses in their only five outings.

Following Kovach's baptismal year, he yielded the coaching gavel to Lloyd Peterson in 1931, beginning an era that would continue through the 1957 season. Peterson's—and DSTC's—first victory ever, came against Winona State Teacher's College in a 7-0 affair; the first of Peterson's 84 victories.

In 1932 the Bulldogs were jammed in a four-way tie for first place in the Northern Intercollegiate Conference, their first taste of championship football, and in 1934 DSTC captured it's first outright title. The last part of the '30's was one of the most successful eras in Bulldog history as from 1934 through 1939, DSTC constructed a 31-7-2 record with championships again in 1937 and 1938.

The pre-World War II days found the Bulldogs football program struggling and 1941 was the worst in the school's history to that point with a 1-6 record. When calm was restored, however, the Bulldogs made a quick comeback as they tied for the NIC championship in 1946 and again in 1948.

The Bulldogs played an independent schedule in 1949 and traded in their green and gold school colors in 1950 to become the Maroon & Gold of the University of Minnesota-Duluth.



Fending off opposing quarterback's air attacks was never looked upon as just another passing fancy by Chris Westberg. The two-time All-NIC free safety holds a share of the Minnesota-Duluth single-season record for pass interceptions with nine in 1988 and also paced all NCAA Division II individuals in interception return yardage that same year (278 yards). In addition, his 144 interception return yards against Minnesota-Morris on Oct. 1, 1988 still stands as an NCAA II single game record.

The Bulldogs aligned with the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) in 1950. The 1952 season boiled down to a showdown between Minnesota-Duluth and Gustavus Adolphus, and, in 17-degree wintry weather, the Gusties stopped the Bulldogs' drive to bring home their first MIAC championship. The following season was the most disastrous year Minnesota-Duluth has ever experienced as it suffered through an 0-7-1 season.



One of the few NCAA Division II schools which has its home football games broadcasted live on local commercial television, Minnesota-Duluth has also been exposed through the air-waves on a larger scale. Take Sept. 18, 1982, for example, when ABC-TV included the Bulldogs' non-conference engagement with Mankato State on its regional telecast schedule. Minnesota-Duluth, incidentally, went on to upend the Mavericks 42-17.

The mid-'50's was a period for slowly refueling the program with respectability. In 1957 Peterson stepped down after 24 years of coaching the Bulldogs. His replacement was a Crosby-Ironton native who had worked wonders at Morris and Morningside High Schools—Jim Malosky—and within three years, the Bulldogs had earned an MIAC championship.

Minnesota-Duluth successfully defended its title in 1961, but the program slumped again in the mid-'60's with three successive sub-.500 seasons. The Bulldogs were nosed out for the crown in 1967 with a 7-1-1 record, but again fell below the .500 mark in 1968 and 1969, the last time a Minnesota-Duluth team failed to play .500 football.

After nearly a 20-year absence, Minnesota-Duluth rejoined the Northern Intercollegiate Conference in 1976. Since that time, the Bulldogs have yet to suffer a losing season on the field of play against league competition. During that span, Minnesota-Duluth has amass-

ed a 109-39-3 overall record, including a perfect 10-0-0 ledger in 1980 (which marks the only time a Bulldog athletic team has gone unbeaten and untied over an entire season). The Bulldogs have also now gone 21 years without enduring a losing season.

Minnesota-Duluth has harvested several outstanding football players throughout its 58-year history including running back Dick Pesonen; end Tom Adams; offensive tackle Vern Emerson; running backs Ted McKnight, who is the all-time leading rusher at Minnesota-Duluth with 2,957 yards and 1986 Associated Press Little All-American Corey Veech, quarterback Bruce Grant, the Bulldogs' career total offense and passing leader, defensive tackle Dave Viaene, a starter last fall with the New England Patriots, and offensive tackle Brent Griffith, a member of the Houston Oilers organization. Another Bulldog product who has gained national recognition as a respected collegiate and professional coach is Dan Devine, who captained and quarterbacked Minnesota-Duluth in 1947.
