# THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA-DULUTH



If there has been one overriding characteristic about the University of Minnesota-Duluth that hasn't changed in all of its 92 years -- that characteristic is growth.

Before Minnesota-Duluth (founded as Duluth Normal School near the turn of the century) became a coordinate campus of the University of Minnesota in 1947, the site the present day facility occupies was nothing more than brush and woods. By the early 1950s, however, the campus was already taking shape with the Science Building (now called the Chemistry Building) and the Physical Education Building in place. Administrators had a far-reaching plan for Minnesota-Duluth's orderly development to 1970. The plan envisioned a student body of 3,500 students by 1970 - more than 5,000 students were actually enrolled by then.

Today, as indicated by this year's enrollment of nearly 7,800 students, Minnesota-Duluth continues its steady growth. New programs recently developed at Minnesota-Duluth include the first four-year computer engineering program in the state of Minnesota and two four-year degrees in industrial

and materials processing engineering.

Minnesota-Duluth also offers more instructional programs than ever for both undergraduate and graduate students in six colleges and schools. Students choose from over 70 undergraduate majors leading to four associate (two-year) degrees and 10 bachelor's degrees, with teacher licensure offered in about 40 areas. Graduate students can earn five master's degrees in 14 fields, with the School of Medicine offering the first two years of graduate basic science.

The campus, located in the Arrowhead region of Northeastern Minnesota overlooking Lake Superior, has 35 buildings, some unique to college campuses: Tweed Museum of Art, Marshall W. Alworth Planetarium, Marshall Performing Arts Center, UMD Sports and Health Center, and the nearby Glensheen Mansion.

Minnesota-Duluth's 92 years of continued growth, now under the leadership of seventh-year Chancellor Dr. Lawrence A. Ianni, is a prime example of the area's commitment to quality higher education.



# MINNESOTA-DULUTH ATHLETICS

Now in its 62nd year of existence, University of Minnesota-Duluth athletics continues to reign as one of the most well-balanced and competitive programs in the Upper Midwest. Minnesota-Duluth is a member of both the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The Bulldogs belong to the seven-school Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in all sports with the exception of hockey which is aligned with the prestigious Western Collegiate Hockey Association, an NCAA Division I circuit.

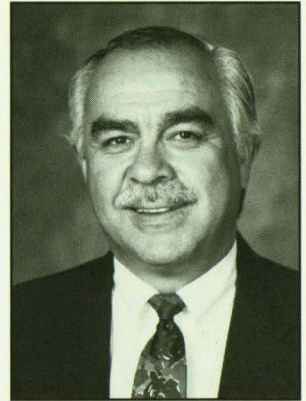
During the course of the 1992-93 athletic season, Bulldog teams captured conference championships in baseball, women's basketball, women's cross country, hockey, women's tennis, and men's indoor and outdoor track and field. The Bulldog women's basketball contingent advanced to the NAIA Tournament last winter while the hockey, wrestling, and men's track teams sent representatives to NCAA national and/or regional events. In addition, Minnesota-Duluth laid claim to the inaugural NSIC women's all-sports title and placed second in that same competition for men (after winning the previous seven crowns).

Overseeing the Bulldogs 14-varsity sports (eight men and six women) program is Bruce McLeod, who is in his eighth full year as the Director of Intercollegiate Athletics. McLeod, 45, succeeded the late Ralph Romano in December 1983 after working his

way through virtually the entire Minnesota-Duluth Athletic Department. He served, at one time or another, as the sports information director, the business manager, and assistant athletic director (a position he held from 1977-1983).

A native of Fort Frances, Ontario, McLeod first made his mark at Minnesota-Duluth as a standout left wing on the Bulldog hockey team. During his three-year collegiate ice career (1966-69), McLeod racked up 81 points in 77 games and was the Bulldogs captain during the 1968-69 season. As a sophomore, he finished second behind linemate Keith "Huffer" Christiansen in the WCHA scoring race.

McLeod, a 1969 Minnesota-Duluth graduate, is married to the former Sande Halstad of Two Harbors, MN. He has two daughters, Leah and Shannon.

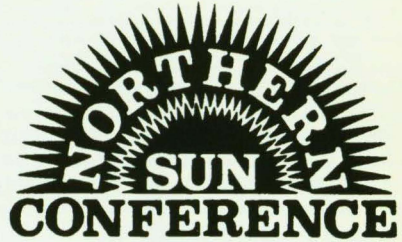

# THE NORTHERN SUN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONF.

Long recognized as one of the most distinguished athletic unions in the Upper Midwest, the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference traces its colorful roots back to 1932. Over the course of those six decades, the NSIC has undergone several facelifts, but despite the additions and subtractions, it remains one of the strongholds of college division athletics.

The NSIC, which was the new name given to the league following the merger of the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (men) and Northern Sun Conference (women) in the spring of 1992, currently includes seven schools -- Bemidji State University, the University of Minnesota-Duluth, the University of Minnesota-Morris, Moorhead State University, Northern State College, Southwest State University, and Winona State University. Bemidji State, Minnesota-Duluth, Moorhead State, and Winona State were charter members when six schools joined hands to form the original Northern Teachers College Conference in 1932. Mankato State University and St. Cloud State University were initial subscribers to the NTCC as well. In 1947, Minnesota-Duluth withdrew from the renamed NIC to link up with the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) but 11 years later Michigan Technological University was admitted to restore the NIC to a six-team circuit. In 1969, Mankato latched on to the North Central Conference and Minnesota-Morris joined the NIC that same year. The following year, Southwest State became a full-fledged member of the NIC family. Change, however, did not stop with the advent of the 1970s. Minnesota-Duluth rejoined the NIC in 1976 while Mankato State, after a brief reappearance in the NIC (1978-1980), hooked up with the NCC again prior to the 1981 campaign along with St. Cloud State. Michigan Tech, meanwhile, departed the NIC after the 1979-80 season to join the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Conference closer to home. In 1980, Northern State of Aberdeen, SD, officially became part of the NIC, bringing the league to its present seven-member unit.



The NSC, on the other hand, began operation just prior to the 1979-80 season with a conglomerate of some eight teams. Subsequently, Northern State aligned itself with the circuit in 1985, two years after St. Cloud State and Mankato State left to enlist with the North Central Conference.

Though the NSIC was conceived in 1932, this season will be the 59th for the conference in football as there was a three-year sabbatical during World War II (1943-45).

Besides football, the NSIC holds championships in eight other sports for men including baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis, and wrestling while the women stage league meets in those same sports with the exception of golf, wrestling and baseball and the addition of softball and volleyball.

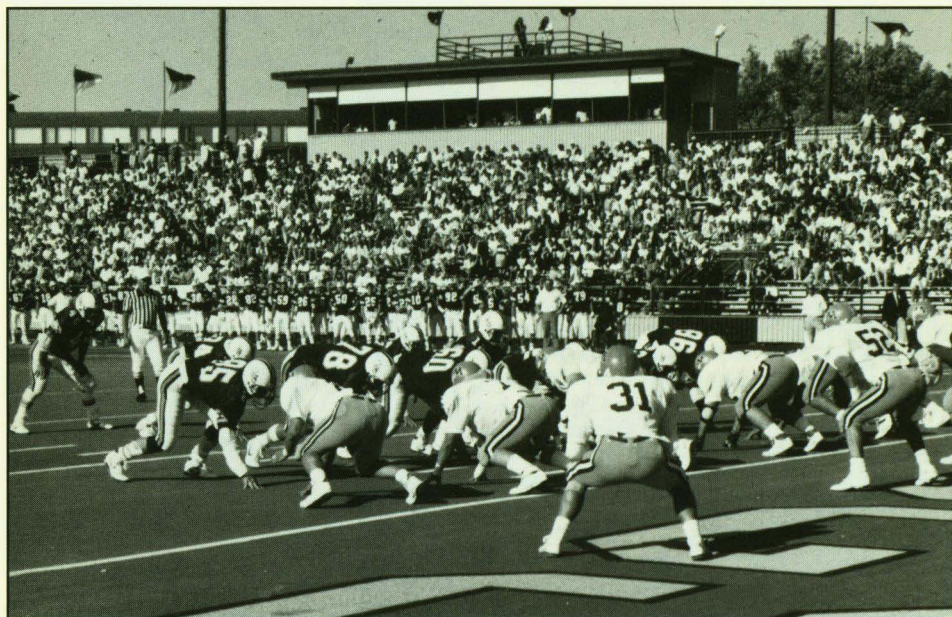

## GRIGGS FIELD - HOME OF THE BULLDOGS



Talk about a home field advantage. Since moving over from Public Schools Stadium in west Duluth to the on-campus confines of Griggs Field just over a quarter of a century ago, the University of Minnesota-Duluth certainly has made the most of its home field opportunities. In 124 lifetime appearances at Griggs Field dating back to the official opening of the facility on Oct. 29, 1966 against the University of St. Thomas, the Bulldogs have posted a 94-26-2 overall record for a .779 winning percentage. Equally as impressive is the fact that during those 25 years, Minnesota-Duluth has suffered just

one losing season at home (in 1968 when the Bulldogs registered a 2-3-0 mark at Griggs Field).

In 1985, Griggs Field underwent a major facelift of sorts as Super Turf II was installed (making it one of only two on-campus football facilities in Minnesota equipped with an artificial playing surface) along with an eight-lane all weather track, a modern scoreboard and new bleachers. In addition to housing the football and track Bulldogs, the 4,000-seat Griggs Field also hosts a number of high school football and track and field events throughout the year as well as university intramural events.

## HEAD COACH JIM MALOSKY

With close to three dozen years of Bulldog coaching now safely tucked away, Jim Malosky enters the 1993 football season as truly the elder statesman of the entire Minnesota-Duluth athletic staff.

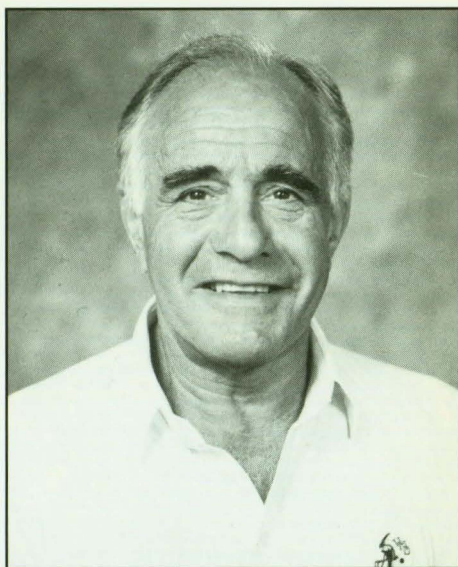
In his 35 seasons at Minnesota-Duluth, Malosky has racked up some mighty impressive numbers, including a 223-104-12 (.676) overall record which makes him the winningest active coach in the NCAA Division II ranks and the seventh winningest active head man in all of college football.

But perhaps consistency, even more so than winning, has been Malosky's foremost trademark. Since 1969, Malosky-coached teams have lost more than four games in a season only twice (1989 and 1992). His 1980 contingent, regarded by many as one of the finest football groups ever assembled at Minnesota-Duluth, turned in a perfect 10-0-0 record and finished the year ranked in the NCAA II top 10 poll. And, like a fine wine, Malosky just seems to get better with age. In the last 14 years alone, he's guided the Bulldogs to a 102-38-4 overall mark.

Malosky surpassed the longevity record of his predecessor, Lloyd Peterson, when he completed his 25th season with Minnesota-Duluth in 1982. Peterson directed the Bulldogs for 24 years, and except for six games coached by Frank Kovach in Minnesota-Duluth's inaugural campaign way back in 1930, he and Malosky have strolled the sidelines for every other Bulldog football contest since then.

Malosky, 64, first became known in Minnesota football circles when he captured All-State honors while quarterbacking Crosby-Ironton High School. He was recruited by the legendary Bernie Bierman at the University of Minnesota, and, during his collegiate career from 1946-49, the Gophers compiled a 25-11-0 record, including identical 7-2-0 marks in Malosky's junior and senior seasons when he was the club's starting signal-caller.

After receiving a B.S. degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1951 (he also earned an MEd degree there in 1957), Malosky began a stint in the U.S. Army. From there it was on to Morris, MN, where he taught and coached at Morris High School, leading the Tigers to the West Central Conference championship with an 8-1-0 record. In 1956 he



landed another prep coaching job at Morningside High School in Edina, MN, and, in his second year guided his troops to a unblemished 9-0-0 record, a Lake Conference championship and a No. 1 ranking among Minnesota High Schools by the Associated Press.

The following year, 1958, Malosky accepted Minnesota-Duluth's invitation to become only its third football coach in history. In only his third season as the Bulldogs' head man, Malosky directed Minnesota-Duluth to the MIAC title, a feat the Bulldogs repeated again in 1961.

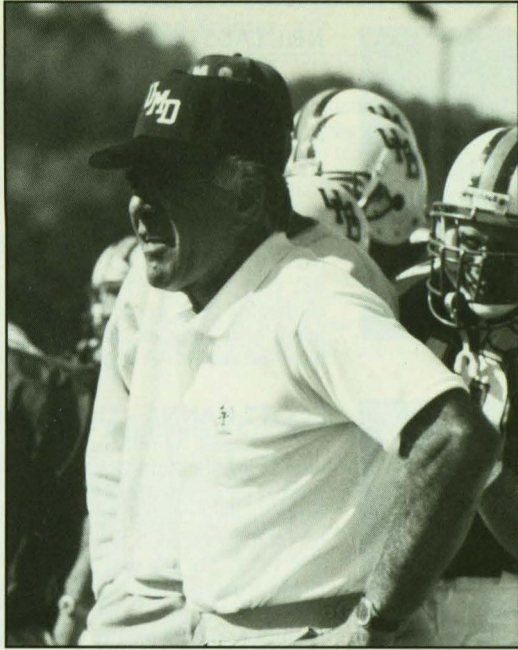
In all, Malosky has won or shared three MIAC titles (1960, 1961, and 1973), four NSIC championships (1979, 1980, 1985, and 1990), and has been named Coach of the Year by the MIAC, the NSIC and the NAIA District 13 on nine occasions.

Malosky, and his wife, Lilah, have four children -- Lisa (31), Linda (29), Jim Jr. (27, a former All-NSIC quarterback at Minnesota-Duluth and now a Bulldog assistant coach), and Tamme (25). In addition to his football duties, he is also an associate professor in the Department of Health and Physical Education.

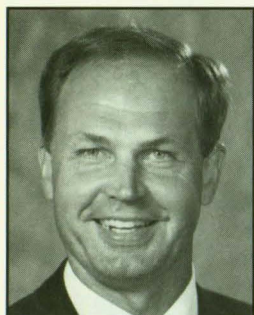

## THE BULLDOG ASSISTANT COACHES



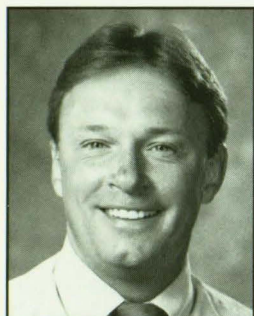
### NEIL LADSTEN - Offensive Line

The veteran of Malosky's assistant coaches, Ladsten is in his 23rd season with the Minnesota-Duluth football staff. During his senior campaign in 1968, Ladsten captained the football Bulldogs, winning All-MIAC honors for the second year in a row as an offensive tackle. For his football and classroom heroics, Ladsten was awarded the 1969 E.L. "Duce" Rasmussen Outstanding Scholar-Athlete Award. Ladsten, 46, an instructor in the Minnesota-Duluth Health and Physical Education Department, also has directed the Bulldogs' wrestlers the past 22 years. The Spring Grove, MN, native was bestowed with NSIC Coach of the Year laurels in 1982-83, 1987-88, 1989-90, 1990-91 and 1991-92 after guiding Minnesota-Duluth to conference titles in each those seasons. Since 1979-80, Ladsten-coached teams have compiled an 114-55-0 record in dual meets and his Bulldogs have secured NCAA Division II or NAIA All-American status 21 times.



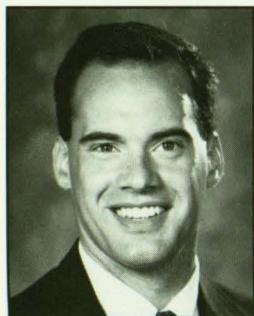
### SCOTT HANNA - Linebackers/Defensive Line

A former All-MIAC center with the Bulldogs, Hanna begins his 16th year as a Minnesota-Duluth assistant coach this fall. Hanna, a four-year football letterman with the Bulldogs (1969-73) was the recipient of Minnesota-Duluth's Outstanding Lineman Award in 1972. A native of Duluth (Central High School), he also played two years of collegiate baseball in 1972 and 1973. For the past 15 years, Hanna, 43, has also been Minnesota-Duluth's baseball coach, racking up a nifty 271-173 overall record. This past spring he skippered the Bulldogs to their second successive NSIC championship and their 15 year in a row with a .500 or above record. Hanna, the NAIA District 13 Coach of the Year in both 1990 and 1991 is also employed by the Minnesota-Duluth athletic department as an equipment manager. He and his wife, Donna, have four children: Kelly (17), Ryan (9), Tommy (6) and John (5).



### VINCE REPESH - Defensive Coordinator

The man credited with molding the Bulldog defense into one of the most revered units in NCAA Division II football, Repesh is in his 10th season as an assistant at Minnesota-Duluth. The 42-year old Chisholm, MN, native joined the Bulldogs in 1984 after a four-year stint as an assistant coach at nearby Wisconsin-Superior. Repesh, who worked as a Bulldog student assistant from 1977-79, played two years of football (split end/defensive back) at both Hibbing Community College (MN) and the University of North Dakota. After graduating from North Dakota in 1973, he remained with the Fighting Sioux football program as an assistant coach and later was the head football man at Mount St. Benedict High School in Crookston, MN. Repesh also is the co-director of the Minnesota-Duluth Athletic Academic Center. He and his wife, Lillian, have a daughter, Natalie (14).

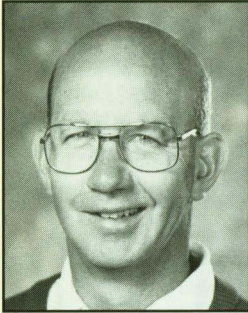


### JIM MALOSKY Jr. - Quarterbacks

The proud owner of a handful of Minnesota-Duluth football records, Jim Malosky Jr. returns for his sixth full season as a Bulldog assistant coach. He concluded his playing days with the Bulldogs in 1987 as the school's all-time leader in touchdown passes (41) and total offensive plays (781). Malosky, 28, was Minnesota-Duluth's starting quarterback as a sophomore, junior, and senior also established club single-season marks for total offense (1,770 yards), touchdown passes (20) and total plays (360) during his farewell campaign. The two-time All-NIC selection ranks second behind Bruce Grant in both career passing yardage (2,996) and total offense (3,690) at Minnesota-Duluth. The son of Bulldog head coach Jim Malosky, he earned a B.A. degree in physical education in 1988.

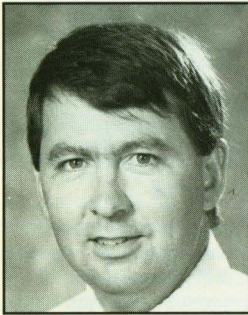

## DON ROACH - Head Trainer

A familiar face along the Minnesota-Duluth sidelines for over two decades, Don Roach begins his 25th season as the Bulldogs' head trainer this fall. Roach, a native of Los Altos, CA, attended Menlo College (CA) before completing his B.A. degree in physical education and life science at San Jose State University in 1965. After a one-year teaching stint at Lassen Union High School in Susanville, CA, Roach, 52, taught for two more years in the American Community Schools in Athens, Greece, before landing his present job at Minnesota-Duluth in 1970. Roach, who received an M.S. degree in athletic training at Indiana University, has also presided as the Bulldogs' men's tennis coach for 18 of the past 19 seasons (he took a year's leave of absence this past year). He has directed Minnesota-Duluth to 13 Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference titles and four berths in the NAIA National Championships (1986, 1987, 1990 and 1991). Roach has two sons: Steve (23) and Mike (18).



## RICK MENZ - Equipment Coordinator

A man whose value to the Bulldog athletic program is hard to appraise because of his thankless behind-the-scenes type of work, Rick Menz is in his 14th year with the Minnesota-Duluth football contingent as the equipment coordinator. A native of Duluth, Menz is a 1969 graduate of Cathedral High School. In the fall of 1979, he was named the equipment coordinator at Minnesota-Duluth in charge of buying, issuing, repairing and maintaining equipment for all Bulldog varsity sports. While at Minnesota-Duluth, Menz completed his undergraduate degree in history and geography. In 1983, 1989, 1990 and 1991, he was an equipment manager at the U.S. Olympic Festival and served in that same capacity for USA Hockey at the 1992 Select 17 World Tournament in Tokyo, Japan. The 41-year-old Menz and his wife, Sue, have a daughter, Lauri (12) and a son, Derek (9).

### On the 1993 Schedule

"The only thing I'm really not crazy about is that we have to play three of our first four games on the road. I do like the fact that that we've added a couple of new non-conference opponents this year in Wisconsin-Stout and Wayne State, a solid NCAA II team who we'll face in the Metrodome at the end of the year."

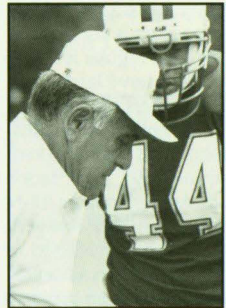
### On who he looks to challenge for the NSIC crown

"Northern State is my pre-season choice as the team to beat in the NSIC. They're the defending champs and, from what I have heard, have a lot of their key people from last season back. Southwest State, which is one of three teams in the league with a new coach this season, is another club you might want to keep an eye on. I also think you could see Winona State rise from the ranks of the so-called also-rans and make a serious run at the title. Where and when teams play each other should go a long way in determining the final outcome of the conference race. Our club, for example, has to face Northern State,

Southwest State and Winona State all on the road this year. Those all could be key ball games for us."

### On his what own football future holds:

"As a far as how much longer I'm going to stay in the coaching business, I can honestly say I don't give it a lot of thought. I don't think it (coaching) will ever stop being fun for me. Sometimes the administrative end of this position can be a hassle, but that comes with the territory. I suppose that when I feel I am no longer capable of doing the job, then that will be the time to call it quits. I don't want someone else to have to do that for me. More than likely, when I make my decision, I will do it after a season and not before one. I don't want to have one of those farewell tours. That's just not me."





## 1993 MINNESOTA-DULUTH PREVIEW

If the University of Minnesota-Duluth has any aspirations of improving on its 5-5-1 overall record of a year ago and returning to the top of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference heap where it last paid a visit in 1990, it will have to find a starting lineup it can stick with. That was not the case last fall when the Bulldogs, thanks in part to a combination of injuries and inconsistencies, used a school-record 35 different individuals in starting roles. As it begins its 61st year of intercollegiate football, Minnesota-Duluth welcomes back 29 previous letterwinners, including six starters both on offense and defense.

**Offensive strengths:** There is no shortage of talent or numbers in the backfield where 10 veterans return. Headlining the group is quarterback **Greg Valaskey**, who was the club's Most Valuable Player after having a hand in over nearly one third (1055 yards of total offense) of the Bulldogs entire offensive output (3,186 yards) last season -- his first as a starter. The sophomore halfback tandem of **Andy Cerratto** (612 yards) and **Andreas Gehring** (564 yards) placed one-two on the 1992 Bulldog rushing charts and may once again shoulder a good deal of the ball carrying load this season. A healthy **Scott Munger**, **Eric Siljendahl**, and **Gary Schoeller**, all of whom sat out the entire 1992 campaign with various injuries, along with holdover fullbacks **Paul Bisek**, **Jason C. Jones**, and **Scott Larson** provide the Bulldog offensive attack with plenty of ammunition.

**Offensive weaknesses:** While the backfield appears to be loaded the opposite is true up front where just two starters -- senior guard **Dave Emerson** and senior tackle **Paul Lombard** -- return. The tight end position is also in disarray with the departure of three-year regular Jeff Walker, a 1992 All-NSIC pick, and top reserve Jason Crane -- the Bulldogs' top two pass catchers last season.

**Defensive strengths:** The Bulldog linebacker cupboard is well stocked with seasoned veterans such as 1992 team tackles leader **Brian Potocnik**, **Marc Achterkirch**, an All-NSIC second team honoree last fall, **Dan Gotz**, **Andy Meschke**, and **Gary Daniels**. The front four will also remain pretty much intact from a year ago as senior left tackle **Mark Viellet**, junior left end **Jon Lamers** and junior right tackle **Jim Wagner** are back to assume their respective starting assignments.

**Defensive weaknesses:** While the linebacking and line corps collectively lost just one starter from last season (right end Mark Adler), the secondary has been stripped of all four its 1992 first team combatants. Finding replacements will be no easy mission for the Bulldog coaching staff, but having the likes of junior cornerback **Scott Coleman** and senior strong safety **Todd Erickson** around to lend a hand in this reconstruction project should make matters a little less discouraging.

**Special Teams:** Junior **Noble Rainville**, who completed his first tour of duty as Minnesota-Duluth's

No. 1 split end in 1992, is back to handle the club's placekicking chores for a third straight year. Rainville made good on 13 of 17 field goals and two of five three pointers as a sophomore, but didn't even attempt a field goal in the final six outings of the year. Senior quarterback Greg Valaskey will more than likely do double duty in 1993 as the Bulldogs' primary punter, a job he's held for the past two seasons. Sophomore Andreas Gehring, who averaged 41.3 yards on eight punts last year, could also be asked to use his right foot for more than just running this fall.

**Coach Malosky says:** "In order for us to be successful we have to consistently be able to sustain a ball-control style of offense. That's always been our whole philosophy here -- that the offense, by holding on to the football, takes a lot of pressure off the defense. Last year (when the Bulldogs gave up more points than they scored for the first time since 1965) our offensive unit didn't spend nearly as much time on the field as I would have liked. A lot of that though was because of all the inexperience we had, especially in the backfield.

"I like the fact that we have our starting quarterback (Greg Valaskey) back along with a pretty good number of halfbacks and fullbacks. That should give us some flexibility and allow to make adjustments when needed. I also think we are fairly well set at linebacker and on the defensive line.

"Although the defensive secondary is an obvious concern, another big worry is the offensive line in general and the center spot in particular. That's a key position for us and we are looking at having to start an untested player (**Matt Peterson**) there."

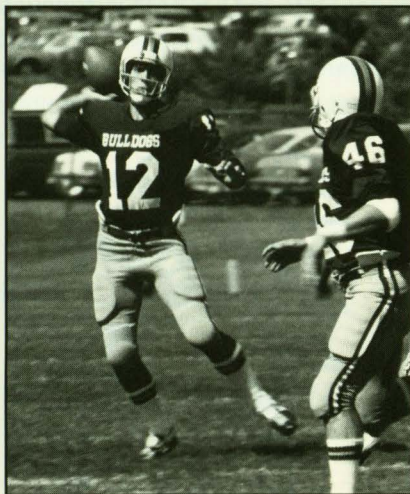


### DOME, SWEET DOME

There is something about the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome that just seems to bring out the best in Minnesota-Duluth football.

After all, in seven previous appearances in the NSIC Metrodome Classic, the Bulldogs have been nothing short of perfect. In addition to amassing a perfect 7-0-0 record at the annual event, Minnesota-Duluth has outscored its Metrodome foes by a combined total of 198-34 while surrendering a total of just three touchdowns. In all, the Bulldogs have posted four shutouts in those seven engagements, including a pair of blankings in their last two trips to Minneapolis (21-0 over Northern State in 1990 and 24-0 over Luther College in 1988).

On Nov. 13, Minnesota-Duluth will return to the NSIC Metrodome Classic after a two-year absence to take on Wayne State College the 1993 regular season finale for both clubs.

## SIX DECADES OF BULLDOG FOOTBALL

"Duluth State teachers College had its first team in 1930, and 28 players responded to Coach Kovach's call"

So records the 1930-31 yearbook, *The Chronicle*, depicting the origins of Bulldogs history when Minnesota-Duluth wasn't Minnesota-Duluth at all, but rather the Duluth State Teachers College (DSTC). "Coach Kovach" is Frank Kovach, an industrial arts specialist who organized and coached the first team that would later evolve into one of the most successful college programs in the land.

Appropriately enough, Kovach also became Minnesota-Duluth's first coach to direct his troops to an unbeaten season as the Bulldogs debuted in 1930 with two ties -- a scoreless tie against Itasca Junior College, and a 6-6 deadlock versus Duluth Junior College -- and three losses in their only five outings.

Following Kovach's baptismal year, he yielded the coaching gavel to Lloyd Peterson in 1931, beginning an era that would continue through the 1957 season. Peterson's (and DSTC'S) first victory ever came against Winona State Teacher's College, 7-0.

In 1932 the Bulldogs were jammed in a four-way tie for first place in the Northern Intercollegiate Conference, their first taste of championship football, and in 1934 DSTC captured it's first outright title. The latter part of the 1930s was one of the most successful eras in Bulldog history as from 1934 through 1939, DSTC constructed a 31-7-2 record with championships again in 1937 and 1938.

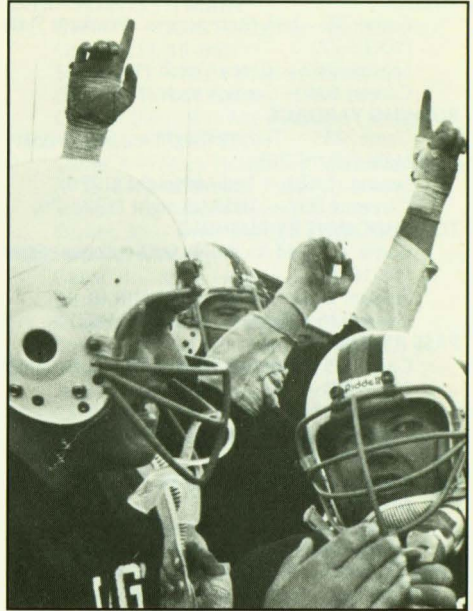
The pre-World War II days found the Bulldogs football program struggling and 1941 produced the worst campaign in the school's history to that point with a 1-6 record. When calm was restored, however, the Bulldogs made a quick comeback as they tied for the NIC crown in 1946 and again in 1948.

The Bulldogs played an independent schedule in 1949 and traded in their green and gold colors in 1950 to become the Maroon & Gold of the University of Minnesota-Duluth.

The Bulldogs aligned with the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) in 1950. The 1951 season boiled down to a showdown between Minnesota-Duluth and Gustavus Adolphus, and, in 17-degree wintry weather, the Gusties stopped the Bulldogs' drive to bring home their first MIAC championship. The following season was the most disastrous year Minnesota-Duluth has ever experienced as it suffered through an 0-7-1 season.

The mid-1950s were a period for slowly refueling the program with respectability. In 1957 Peterson stepped down after 24 years of coaching the Bulldogs. His replacement was a Crosby-Ironton native who had worked wonders at Morris and Morningside High Schools - Jim Malosky - and within three years, the Bulldogs had earned an MIAC championship.

Minnesota-Duluth successfully defended its

title in 1961, but the program slumped again in the mid-1960s with three successive sub-.500 seasons. The Bulldogs were nosed out for the crown in 1967 with a 7-1-1 record, but again fell below the .500 mark in 1968 and 1969, the last time a Minnesota-Duluth team failed to play .500 football.

After nearly a 30-year absence, Minnesota-Duluth rejoined the Northern Intercollegiate Conference in 1976. Since that time, the Bulldogs have yet to suffer a losing season on the field of play against league competition. During that span, Minnesota-Duluth has also amassed a 120-48-4 overall record, including a perfect 10-0-0 ledger in 1980 (which marks the only time a Bulldog football outfit has gone unbeaten and untied over an entire season).

Minnesota-Duluth has harvested several outstanding football players throughout its rich 60-year history including halfback Dick Pesonen, end Tom Adams, offensive tackle Vern Emerson, halfback Ted McKnight and defensive tackle Dave Viaene -- all of whom had playing stints in the National Football League -- and halfback Corey Veech, quarterback Bruce Grant and halfback/placekicker Terry Egerdahl. Another Bulldog product who gained national recognition as a respected collegiate and professional coach is Dan Devine. Devine, who captained and quarterbacked Minnesota-Duluth in 1947, went on to enjoy head coaching stays at the University of Missouri, the University of Notre Dame and the Green Bay Packers.
