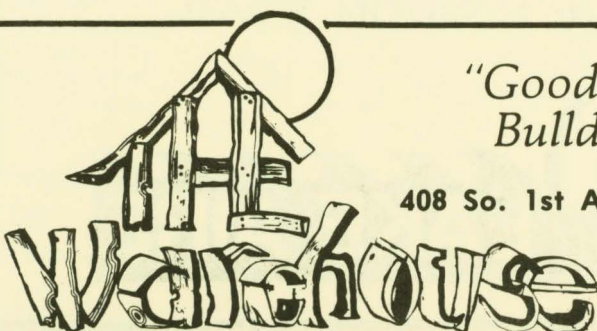

Playing It By Ear

As far as the Northern Intercollegiate Conference championship race is concerned, last Saturday's 28-14 setback to Winona State took the Bulldogs out of the driver's seat and more or less made them an anxious backseat rider.

With just three weeks to play in this, the NIC's 51st season, UMD finds itself in a most uncomfortable position. At 2-1 in the conference, the Bulldogs can ill afford another defeat. Not only must they be concerned about winning their remaining games, they must now hope either Southwest State or Moorhead can muster up enough cranking power to drive over unbeaten (4-0) Winona State in the Warrior's final two NIC affairs of 1983. UMD can no longer determine its own fate—the highest it can finish, without anyone's help, is second. While this may not seem like such a terrible, dreadful position to be in for some, others, including UMD Head Coach Jim Malosky, liken it to the second-best seat in the house.

"It's not a situation we wanted to be in," admits the 26th-year veteran, "because now we have to look for help."

But before anyone starts doing any looking, local matters, says Malosky, must be attended to.

"Right now though we're more concerned with what we're going to do. Winona may lose one of its last two games, but it won't do us much good if we follow suit. Winning our own ballgames is a number one priority."

Minnesota-Morris, also 2-1 in the NIC, is back in the conference title picture after a somewhat shakey start. The Cougars will be UMD's first obstacle in its quest for the NIC crown, and vice-versa. Both schools are hungry to regain the NIC championship trophy it captured a few years ago. UMD won or shared the conference crown in 1980 and 1979 while Morris last took home the NIC hardware in 1978.

Following today's game, UMD will wind up its NIC schedule with a road encounter against Northern State and a home engagement with Bemidji State. Morris, meanwhile, will play host to Southwest State before closing out the conference campaign at arch-rival Moorhead State.

The only other contestant in the race for the NIC title, two-time conference champion Moorhead State, can, at best, tie for the top spot. If Morris and UMD are in the NIC's backseat, Moorhead is in the trunk.

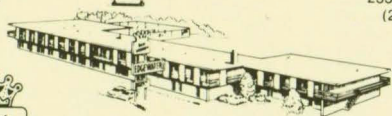
All of this makes for a very interesting ending to a very interesting season. The final chapters are slowly being etched in. The question is now—who will enjoy the happy ending?

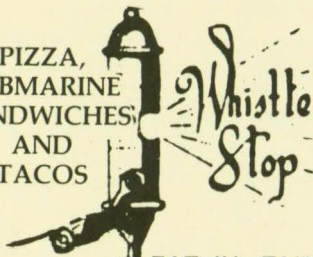

In The Beginning



Frank Kovach

One of the truly remarkable things about the UMD football program is that in just over 50 years of competition only three head coaches have strolled the Bulldog sidelines.

Two of those mentors — current head man Jim Malosky and the legendary Lloyd Peterson — come quickly to mind because of their coaching longevity. Malosky is presently midway through his 26th season as the Bulldog skipper while Peterson presided over the UMD grid for the 24 years prior to Malosky's reign.

A lot of digging through record books is required, however, to come up with the third UMD head coach.

In 1930, just two years after the Duluth State Teacher's College began admitting male students, a young fellow by the name of Frank Kovach took it upon himself to become the school's first football coach. Since the school had just converted over to a coed institution, aspiring players weren't to be found in bountiful quantities. While Malosky today enjoys the luxury of selecting from a field of 90-100 prospects each fall, Kovach had but a mere 12 football hopefuls to work with.

"We had to take what ever came out," recalls Kovach, who still resides in Duluth. "And a lot of those who came out never played the game before."

In that inaugural campaign, DSTC struggled through five games without once tasting victory losing three and tying two. (UMD records for that period are very sketchy and list DSTC's record as 0-0-2 but Kovach contends his contingent dropped successive games to Virginia, Hibbing and Eveleth Junior Colleges.) DSTC, incidentally, played all of its home games that year at Chester Bowl.

Kovach, who later launched the school's first hockey and basketball teams, lasted one season as the football skipper before being supplanted by Peterson in 1931.

Last fall, the Industrial Education Building was dedicated to Kovach, a long-time industrial ed. teacher, and Gordon Voss. Kovach, still quite spry at 87 years of age, admits he has not been able to attend a UMD football game in several years because of his wife's poor health.

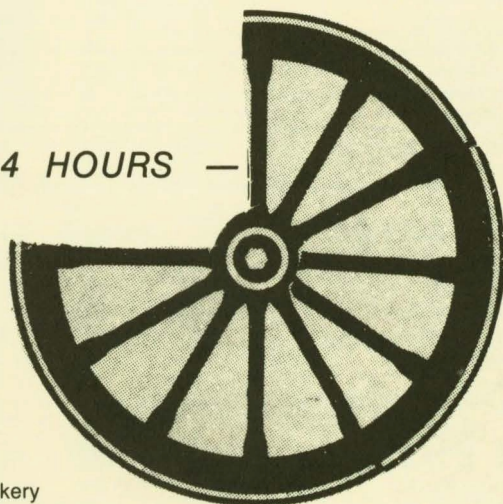
