




From The Director Of Admissions


It's decision time for you, and we at UMD invite you to take a very close look at all UMD has to offer.



Questions & Answers

Q: WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO APPLY FOR ADMISSION?

A: The sooner, the better. Based on the day we receive your application for admission, you can get an invitation to an early Orientation session. This will give you a good chance of getting the classes you want next fall.

Q: HOW CAN I GET AN APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION?

A: In Minnesota call our toll-free number 1-800-232-1339; other states call collect 0-218-726-7171 to request an application. High school students can pick up application forms in their counseling office.

Q: WHEN CAN I VISIT UMD?

A: The Admissions Office is open 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each weekday. We offer tours Monday through Friday at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. Special Saturday visits each month are held from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on November 3, December 8, January 12, February 9, March 9 and April 13.

Q: HOW BIG IS UMD?

A: Our campus has over 7500 students. UMD is large enough to provide a quality university-level education, yet small enough to remain friendly and personal.

Q: HOW CAN I GET MORE INFORMATION?

A: Admissions counselors will be out visiting high schools and community colleges this fall, so look for them. You may also obtain additional information by calling our toll-free number in Minnesota, or collect from other states.

Start Off Right

You want to meet new friends, get involved and try something new? The place to go is UMD.

UMD has the usual student organizations, such as student government, fraternities and sororities, and some unusual ones as well. Wisconsin, North Dakota And South Dakota Residents


Don't be confused about tuition rates at UMD; it's all very simple. If you are planning to attend UMD next fall, reciprocity forms will be available at your high school next spring.

Students living in Wisconsin and North or South Dakota are eligible to attend UMD and pay tuition at the same rate as if they attended a college or university in their home state.
