

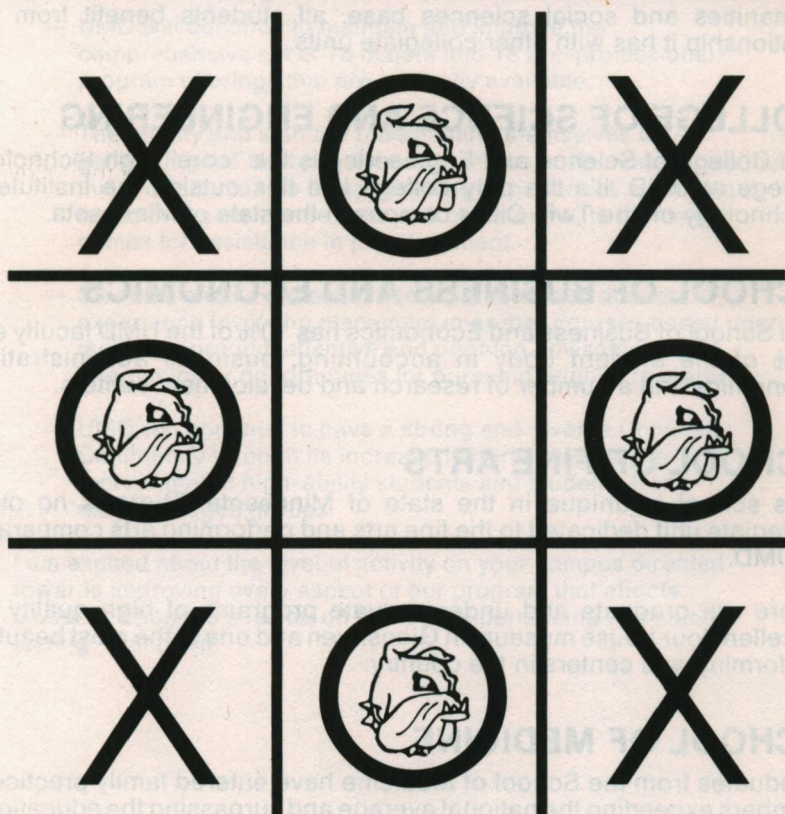

UMD QUALITY CHOICE

Quality choice is what you receive from UMD. UMD has a six-unit collegiate structure. These six-units are the College of Education and Human Service Professions, College of Liberal Arts, College of Science and Engineering, School of Business and Economics, School of Fine Arts, and the School of Medicine. No matter if you have decided on a major or if you are undecided, UMD gives you the Quality Choice. Below is a brief description of each collegiate unit.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICE PROFESSIONS

This college educates professional human service and technology personnel for varied education, social leadership, technical roles and positions.

COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

The primary focus of the College of Liberal Arts is to offer a strong liberal arts education. Since students in other collegiate units need a strong humanities and social sciences base, all students benefit from the relationship it has with other collegiate units.

COLLEGE OF SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

The College of Science and Engineering is the "core" high technology college at UMD. It's the only college like this outside the Institute of Technology on the Twin Cities campus in the state of Minnesota.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS

The School of Business and Economics has 10% of the UMD faculty and 11% of the student body in accounting, business administration, economics and a number of research and development centers.

SCHOOL OF FINE ARTS

This school is unique in the state of Minnesota. There is no other collegiate unit dedicated to the fine arts and performing arts comparable to UMD.

There are graduate and undergraduate programs of high quality, an excellent tour house museum in Glensheen and one of the most beautiful performing arts centers in the country.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

Graduates from the School of Medicine have entered family practice in numbers exceeding the national average and surpassing the educational goal of the school. This is one of the three medical schools in the state.

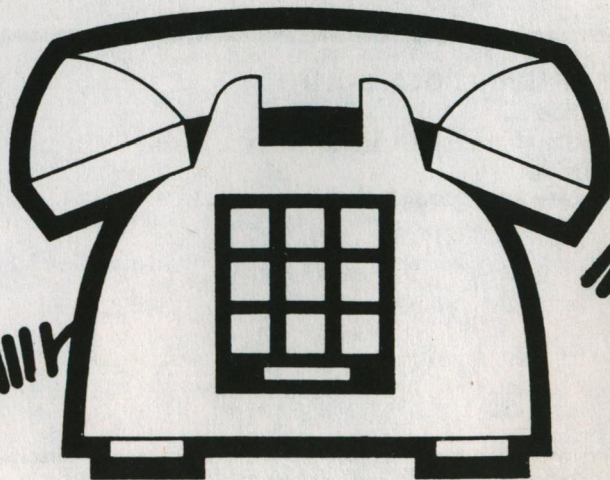

ADMISSIONS QUESTIONS?

Q: When should I apply for admission to UMD?

A: Now is the time to apply for admission. The earlier you apply, the better the chance to attend the Orientation/Registration session of your choice next summer.

Q: Where can I get an application for admission?

A: Application forms are available from your high school counselor or guidance office. You could also obtain an application by calling **1-800-232-1339** and requesting one.

Q: How do I apply?

A: Fill out the application and return it to your counseling office along with a \$20.00 check or money order payable to UMD. The counseling office will forward your test scores and transcripts. (You will need either PSAT, SAT or ACT test score.)

Q: Who will be admitted?

A: High school graduates are automatically admitted if they rank in the upper half of their graduating class. If they rank in the lower half of their graduating class, they may be **selectively admitted** through the Supportive Service Program (SSP), an extra-advisement program designed to help students in areas where they may be weak in order to get their skill levels up to college levels.

Q: When will I know if I have been admitted?

A: We will send you a reply four to six weeks after you have completed the appropriate admissions procedures.

LIVING ON CAMPUS?

It's time to apply for UMD housing. On your application for housing, you must choose an area where you want to live and a meal plan which best suits you. UMD has approximately 2,300 quality housing spaces available on campus.

There are five different residence halls to choose from: Griggs Hall (co-ed), Lake Superior Hall (co-ed), Burntside Hall (women), Vermilion Hall (men), and Torrance Hall (co-ed). There are also furnished apartments with cooking facilities available.

Housing assignments are based on the date the application is received. Assignment preference and roommate preference requests will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. Specific housing assignments are usually given to students at their Orientation sessions. Don't delay—mail your housing application in today!
