The early morning rain didn't dampen the spirits of 50 regional artists who arrived shortly after 6:00 am on Saturday, August 18<sup>th</sup>, to set up their tents, shelves and tables displaying distinctive, carefully crafted masterpieces.

From copper art and hand-blown glass vessels to wheel-thrown pottery, beaded jewelry and "your favorite lake carved into a plaque of solid oak," abundant creative talent found a home on Glensheen grounds for one windy, cloud-covered summer day.

Hundreds of visitors arrived as soon as the gates opened at 9:00 am and didn't hesitate to make their purchases. Musical performances by John Downing, a Grand Rapids singer and songwriter, and the Court Jesters, a local volunteer band made up mostly of St. Louis County employees, added to the inspirational ambiance.

With the aroma of *Kettle Korn* in the air, even gusty winds couldn't prevent artisans, over 1500 patrons, Glensheen staff and volunteers from enjoying a day filled with artistic vision and a whole lot of fun.

## Education & Volunteer Column

This year's exhibits have followed the overall theme of getting better acquainted with the Congdon family. Spring was "Clara Congdon: Laces and Needlework". Summer was "The Congdon Children: Pets and Pastimes". And the Fall exhibit is "Chester Congdon: A Man of the Land".

The Fall exhibit shows numerous personal items belonging to Mr. Congdon which demonstrate his love of the land. Included are mementoes from his mining enterprises, agricultural and horticultural pursuits, camping experiences, and legislative involvement with the tonnage tax and state redistricting. Many of the items were loaned by the Congdon family members for this exhibit.

In addition to changing exhibits, our educational program has included developing a new public tour called the "Bedroom Slipper Tour". In this tour visitors are taken behind the ropes to view the rooms close up. Tour guides wear gloves to open doors and cupboards and peek inside. Everyone wears slippers to protect the carpets and wood floors. This tour is offered every Saturday afternoon to only 12 people at a time for \$15 per person. These tours have become wildly popular, with some Saturdays including 3 tours to accommodate the demand. This new tour has added several thousand dollars to our income in the last year!

Our volunteers have been kept very busy at Glensheen helping put these new exhibits together, helping with the new "Bedroom Slipper Tours", plus all the regular tours, working in the museum shop, doing living history interpretations, and helping in the Volunteer Office. We had two volunteer recognition events this summer to thank the volunteers for all they do at Glensheen. In July we had an indoor picnic in the Winter Garden, complete with an all-volunteer Talent Show. Then in August we had a Student Sleepover with bonfire on the beach and games and movies afterwards. When our students return to school in September, we will need more volunteers to help out. Look for more volunteer training opportunities to recruit additional helpers to carry on the many programs and events at Glensheen!

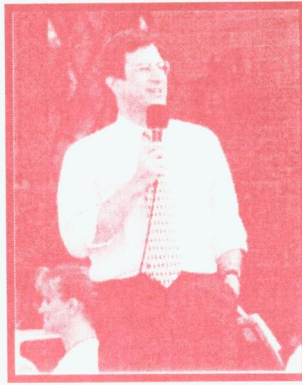
## From the Director
