MINUTES

May 10, 1956

A meeting of the Board of Regents was held in the Regents' Room, Administration Building, on Thursday, May 10, 1956 at one forty-five o'clock.

Present: Regent Quinlivan, presiding; Regents Bell, Cosgrove, Gainey, Griggs, Lawson, Neumeier and Olson, and Mr. Morrill.

Dean Walter W. Cook discussed with the Board the basic problems in education on the elementary, secondary, and college levels stressing particularly those problems arising from differences in intellectual capacity of students having the same chronological age.

Voted to approve recommendations of the Honors Committee, list filed supplement to the minutes, page 9288.

President Morrill and Vice President Middlebrook discussed with the Board the visit of and program for the Legislative Interim Building Commission scheduled for May 25-26, 1956.

President Morrill discussed with the Board the functions and relationships between the Association of Minnesota Colleges Committee on Continuing Study of Higher Education, and the President's White House Committee on Higher Education Beyond High School, and newly appointed Governor's Committee on Higher Education.

Voted to authorize employment of Ellerbe and Company in the preparation of the plans and specifications for the Masonic Memorial Hospital.

Voted on recommendation of the Minneapolis Park Board and University officials to authorize cooperation with the Minneapolis Aquatennial Association to make a portion of the River Flats available for the staging of a water show July 18 to July 30, 1956.

Voted to approve the following resolution designating the First National Bank of St. Paul, Minnesota, a depository for funds of the Regents of the University of Minnesota, not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) at any time:

WHEREAS, The Vice President, Business Administration has reported as to the desirability of designating the FIRST NATIONAL BANK of St. Paul as a depository for funds of this corporation,

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the First National Bank of St. Paul, Minnesota, is hereby designated a depository for funds of the REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA, not to exceed the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) at any time.

Be It Further Resolved, That the First National Bank of St. Paul, Minnesota, as a depository of this corporation shall secure the deposits of this corporation as provided by law of this State with reference to DEPOSITORIES OF STATE FUNDS, set forth in Chapters 7 and 9, 1949 Minnesota Statutes; that the repository of such collateral security shall be determined by the Vice President, Business Administration, or in his absence, the Treasurer of this corporation as a matter of administrative decision.

Be It Further Resolved, That the First National Bank of St. Paul, Minnesota, as a designated depository of this corporation, be and it hereby is requested, authorized and directed to honor all checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money drawn in the name of this corporation, including those drawn to the individual order of any person or persons whose name or names appear thereon as signer or signers thereof, when bearing the signatures of the following named persons, namely:

W. T. Middlebrook, Business Vice President
L. R. Lunden, Treasurer

provided said signatures may either be manual signatures or they may be facsimiles of the manual signatures of said persons, and said First National Bank may honor all such checks, drafts, or other orders and charge this corporation therewith, without liability to determine whether the person or persons affixing the facsimile signature or signatures thereon have or had authority to do so and regardless of by whom or by what means the facsimile signature or signatures thereon have been affixed thereto, and regardless of whether either or both of the persons whose facsimile signatures affixed thereto are then living or shall have died or shall have become incapacitated or shall have been retired or removed from such office prior to the time any such check, draft or other order was issued, if such facsimile signature or signatures resemble the facsimile specimens from time to time furnished to or filed with said

First National Bank of St. Paul, Minnesota, by the Secretary or any other officer of this corporation.

Be It Further Resolved, That the First National Bank of St. Paul, Minnesota, shall be entitled to rely on and act under the foregoing resolution at all times and under all circumstances until this corporation shall have delivered to said bank a certified copy of a new resolution by this corporation amending or terminating this present resolution.

Be It Further Resolved, That this resolution shall be in full force and effect as of the date hereof, and the Secretary is hereby authorized to send to the First National Bank of St. Paul a certified copy of this resolution and shall instruct said depository bank as to the date when the signatures or facsimile signatures of W. T. Middlebrook, Business Vice President, and L. R. Lunden, Treasurer, shall be honored when appearing on checks, drafts, or other orders drawn on this corporation for the payment of money, said date to be determined by the Secretary in accord with the necessary business transactions of this corporation, and the Business Vice President is hereby authorized to transfer funds and to take such other administrative action as shall be required within the intent of this resolution.

Be It Further Resolved, That any and all resolutions heretofore adopted by this corporation and certified to said First National Bank of St. Paul, Minnesota, as governing the operation of this corporation's account or accounts with it, be and are hereby continued in full force and effect, except as the same may be supplemented or modified by the foregoing part of this resolution.

Vice President Middlebrook presented a Report of Progress on Housing Development on the Earle Brown farm.

The President having indicated the desire of a staff member to run for a state elective office, voted to instruct the President to advise the staff member that it was the judgment of the Regents that such action would be prejudicial to the best interests of the University.

Voted to adjourn.

President Morrill and Vice President Middlebrook having discussed briefly with the Board the Constitutional Amendment (Amendment III) providing for a discontinuance of ten per cent (10%) of the iron ore tax to the Permanent University Fund, voted to request the administrative officers to prepare for Board consideration a statement indicating the effect upon the University—the approval or disapproval of the amendment to be considered at the June meeting.

Voted to approve the following action and news release with regard to the location of the Foundation houses of the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Congregational churches:

The Regents, having been faced by a most complex and troublesome situation, now announce that on the basis of administrative restudy of the land problem involving the location of student centers of the Congregational, Episcopal, and Presbyterian groups, a satisfactory solution has been reached that takes into account the needs and the interests of the University and the religious foundations alike.

In its land acquisition policy the University is motivated solely by the obligation to plan wisely and soundly to meet future needs for buildings and land that will permit it to serve the state effectively in the fields of instruction, research, and public service. No one questions that with increasing enrollments and with new emphasis upon research and service, these needs will each year become more insistent and pressing.

The Regents likewise are fully mindful of the high purpose and commendable programs of the religious foundations to meet the spiritual and related social needs of the many students of their particular faiths. They appreciate, too, the role student religious centers can play in assisting the University, on the one hand, to carry the enormous student load that is already developing; and on the other, to provide for the student the opportunity to develop into a well-rounded, well-balanced young man or woman by providing religious programs and activities in an environment that in a state university would otherwise not be available. The Regents are indeed grateful for the contribution to student welfare that the denominational groups are making, and recognize especially that well equipped, well staffed and centrally located student centers constitute a valu-

able asset in achieving the purposes held in common by the religious foundations and the University.

Sensitive to all of these common needs, the Regents in the present instance have agreed that the Westminster Foundation (Presbyterian), St. Timothy's House (Episcopalian) and the Pilgrim Foundation (Congregational) should be encouraged to construct their proposed new student centers on the property they now own, fronting on Fourth Street and on Seventeenth Avenue. It has been agreed, however, that the Westminster Foundation will sell to the University a maximum of 25 feet of frontage at the West edge of their property on Fourth Street. With this land available, the University will then be able to build on Fourth Street at some future date a structure of the average size of other University buildings. Likewise to the East of the Pilgrim Foundation property in the block between Seventeenth and Eighteenth Avenues, and fronting on Fourth Street, there will remain space for a major University structure. Thus the building needs of the foundations and the University appear to be harmonized to the satisfaction and in the best interests of all.

Having achieved this solution, the Regents feel an obligation to declare unequivocally that their needs for future building areas in the remaining North half of the blocks fronting on Fourth Street between Fifteenth Avenue and Nineteenth Avenue are so self-evident that they regard this land as definitely in the path of University expansion, and indicate that they will acquire it for University purposes as fast as resources permit.

Voted to revise resolution adopted February 10, 1956 to eliminate from condemnation lots one (1) and two (2), Block F, and to add certain other properties as follows:

- (2) Upon successful negotiations from the above loan, voted to authorize the acquisition by condemnation of certain lands for parking purposes and to this end approved the following resolution:

That pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota, the Regents of the University of Minnesota have duly determined that it is necessary to take in fee simple absolute, for the purpose of the University of Minnesota, as an addition to and for the use of the Minneapolis Campus of the University of Minnesota, those certain lands situated in the County of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, which are hereinafter described, and hereby request the Attorney General to institute and prosecute, in the name of the State of Minnesota, or in the name of the Regents of the University of Minnesota, or both, proceedings in the district court in accordance with the statutes in such case made and provided for the taking and condemnation of such lands, in fee simple absolute, under the power of eminent domain:

- (a) *All of Lots 3, 4 and 5 inclusive of Block "F" of Tuttle's Addition to Town of St. Anthony between Sixteenth and*

Seventeenth Avenues Southeast and south of Fourth Street Southeast consisting of five parcels owned by separate owners.

- (b) North one-half of Block 12, University Addition, being Lots 1 to 6 inclusive between Fifteenth and Sixteenth Avenues Southeast and south of Sixth Street Southeast consisting of twelve parcels owned by separate owners.
- (c) All of Block 5, Mower's Addition to St. Anthony between Seventh and Eighth Streets Southeast and Seventeenth Avenue Southeast consisting of eighteen parcels owned by separate owners.
- (d) *All of North 110 feet of Lots 1 and 2 and all of Lots 3 and 4 of Block "E" Tuttle's Addition to Town of St. Anthony between Fifteenth and Sixteenth Avenues Southeast and south of Fourth Street Southeast consisting of six parcels owned by separate owners.*

Voted to authorize the purchase of any portion of the land covered by the foregoing condemnation resolution provided the purchase price has the approval of the Chairman of the Board, the President and the Business Vice President.

Voted to approve the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Honorable Richard L. Griggs was named a Regent of the University of Minnesota by the Legislature of 1939; and

WHEREAS, Down through the years his conscientious, effective, and constructive participation in deliberations by the Board on all University problems and policies has contributed so greatly to the advancement of the institution; and
