IN RE \$450,000 FIELD HOUSE BONDS
RESOLUTION BY BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

WHEREAS, the Senate Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics of the University of Minnesota, which Committee is organized and chosen according to rules approved and authorized by the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota, has, pursuant to authority heretofore duly granted to it by the Board of Regents, determined to issue \$450,000 par value of bonds, bearing interest at the rate of 4½% per annum, payable semi-annually, the payment of the principal and interest thereof to be secured by a pledge and mortgage and to constitute an absolute first charge on the net proceeds received from athletic events participated in by representatives of the University of Minnesota, all as more fully described in proceedings duly had and adopted by said Committee, the proceeds of said bonds to be used in erecting and equipping a field house near the Stadium at the University of Minnesota, and which Committee has entered into a contract for the sale of said bonds with Minneapolis Trust Company, The Minnesota Loan and Trust Company, Wells Dickey Company and Merchants Trust Company, at the price of 95% of the par value thereof and accrued interest, and all action of said Committee in reference to such project is subject to the approval of the Board of Regents as set forth in resolution adopted by the Board of Regents at its meeting on October 4, 1926.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota that the action of said Committee in authorizing the issuance and sale of said bonds and in entering into such contract for the sale thereof is hereby ratified and approved, and the form of bond and trust agreement and all the provisions thereof and of said contract for the sale of said bonds are hereby ratified and approved, and it is hereby determined that said bonds be delivered to the said purchasers in accordance with the contract for sale thereof, and it is further determined that the principal and interest of said bonds shall constitute an absolute first charge on the net proceeds received from all athletic events for which paid admission shall be charged at the University of Minnesota and from all net proceeds to the University of Minnesota received from Athletic events held at places other than

the University of Minnesota where representatives of the University of Minnesota are competing, all as more fully set forth in said bond form and trust agreement, provided, however, that nothing herein contained or in said bond form or trust agreement shall constitute a pledge of or lien upon the credit of the University of Minnesota or of the Board of Regents or of the State of Minnesota, or of any member of said Board or of any member of said Committee.

Voted to refer to the Buildings and Grounds Committee with power the acceptance of bids on the Law School building provided that the bids are within the allotment made.

Voted to approve the establishment of a Department of Speech in the College of Science, Literature, and the Arts.

Voted to approve preparation of budget for University Hospital during biennium 1927-29, at least, on basis of the following income: University Support—\$170,000, Hospital Reimbursement—\$100,000, and Hospital Income—from pay patients, X-Ray, etc.

Report was made of the granting by the Federal Radio Commission of the continuance of the license to broadcast on University Station WLB to July 31, 1927.

Voted to approve the following scale of pay for fellows in the clinical departments of the Medical School: \$800 the first year; \$900 the second year; and \$1,000 the third year.

Voted to approve Miller Hospital and Pokegama Tuberculosis Fellowships at the following rates of pay: For the first year, \$800; for the second year, \$900; and for the third year, \$1,000.

Changes in the 1921 Minnesota General Hospital Act made by House File No. 1193 were reported.

Voted to approve co-operative agreement between the American Petroleum Institute and the University of Minnesota for the conduct of research on the subject of "The Effect of Electric Discharge Upon Gaseous Hydrocarbons," in accordance with memorandum of agreement filed supplement to the minutes, page 507.

Voted to change the name of the School of Dental Nurses to the School of Dental Hygienists with the understanding that the degree shall be designated, Graduate Dental Hygienist.

Voted to authorize a women's gymnasium towel fee of \$1.50 per quarter for University High School girls, effective beginning 1927-28.

Voted to approve co-operative agreement between the American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers and the University of Minnesota for research on subjects relating to heating and ventilating, in accordance with the agreement filed supplement to the minutes, page 508.

Voted to authorize trip at University expense to Leeds, North Dakota, for the purpose of reporting on the desirability of purchasing the Lunell Herbarium.

Voted to refer to the President of the University with power the question of a trip to San Francisco by Dorothy Kurtzman to attend the meeting of the National League of Nursing Education.

Voted to retain Daniel Johnson, Laboratory Helper, School of Mines, on the payroll at half salary for a period of six months, beginning May 16, 1927, with the understanding that at the end of six months, a report on Mr. Johnson's condition is to be submitted to the President of the University.

The President of the Board made the following additional committee appointments: Agricultural Committee—Regent Lewison; Buildings and Grounds Committee—Regent Lewison; and Consulting Committee—Student Activities and Social Life—Regent Wilson, Bess M.

Representatives of the Shrine appeared before the Board requesting the use of the University Stadium for the proposed 1928 Convention. After discussions it was voted, Regent Partridge not voting, to adhere to the policy of not using the Stadium for purposes not educational in nature.

The President of the Board reported that William Henry Eustis had agreed that \$150,000 of the Eustis gift might be available for a hospital unit for crippled children.

Voted to continue Ella Whitney, Secretary Retired Presidents, \$720 per annum, on the payroll at the present rate with the understanding that her services were to be available whenever needed.

Voted to name Regents Snyder, Coffman, and Boeckmann a committee to co-operate in the selection of a Dean of Dentistry.

to the terms in his letter of May 7, 1927, filed supplement
