**MINUTES**

April 25, 1974

The third regular meeting of the Twin Cities Campus Assembly was convened in the auditorium of Nicholson Hall on Thursday, April 25, 1974. Checking or signing the roll as present were 74 voting members of the faculty, 14 voting members of the student body, 2 members of the Administrative Committee, and 5 nonmembers.

Vice Chairman John P. Navins presided.

The following items were considered, and action was taken as indicated.

**I. ASSEMBLY AND CAMPUS COMMITTEES, 1973-74**

**II. REPORT OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE**

**Reported for Information**

Submitted and approved by the Twin Cities Student Assembly, April 11, 1974.

**Preamble**

The Student Services Fees Committee shall review budget requests submitted to it by campus organizations seeking funding from student fees. The Committee's budgetary jurisdiction shall include only mandatory student fees and shall not include tuition funds or optional or special interest student fees such as MPIRG (Minnesota Public Interest Research Group).

1. The Student Services Fees Committee shall consist of 18 members, 12 students, 3 faculty, and 3 administrators. The faculty and administration members shall serve without vote. A majority of the voting members shall constitute a quorum.
  - (a) The student members shall be elected by the Twin Cities Student Assembly in accordance with its procedures. They shall serve for a two-year term, with 6 students elected each year. Vacancies shall be filled by the student assembly with the members so elected serving the remainder of the term.
    - (1) In order to be eligible for election and for serving on the committee, students must be currently enrolled and currently paying fees.
    - (2) No student holding an executive office (as defined by the organiza-

- tion's constitution) in a fee-supported organization shall be a member of the committee.
- (b) The faculty members shall be selected by the Faculty Assembly in accordance with its procedures. They shall serve for a term of two years with 2 elected in one year and 1 elected in the alternate year.
  - (c) The administration members shall be appointed one each by the Vice Presidents for Academic Administration, Student Affairs, and Finance, Planning and Operations, and shall serve at the discretion of the respective Vice Presidents.
  - (d) The student and faculty members shall be subject to removal from office in accordance with procedures established by the respective Assemblies.
  - (e) There shall be a chairperson of the Student Services Fees Committee. The chairperson will preside over the meetings, shall confer with the Student Organization Finance Office about all dealings with finances and fees and in general do all duties normally associated with the position of chairperson. The chairperson shall be elected from the membership of the committee by the Twin Cities Student Assembly. There shall also be a secretary who shall handle bookkeeping, minutes, send meeting notices to committee members and the student body-at-large as well as performing other secretarial duties.
2. All meetings of the Student Services Fees Committee shall be public. Minutes of all meetings shall be kept and shall be available for inspection.
  3. All organizations seeking fee support must submit a proposed budget annually to the Student Services Fees Committee. They must also submit an annual report for the previous year showing actual expenditures as compared with the budget. The Fees Committee shall set standards for the form and content of the budget and shall develop appropriate measures to deal with organizations failing to submit satisfactory budgets, including recommending loss of fee support. The budget for each organization shall show the purpose of proposed expenditures as well as their accounting classification. Salaries and consultants' fees shall be listed individually in the previous year's report, showing the names of the persons compensated and the nature of their services. Capital expenditures above an amount to be determined by the Fees Committee shall also be listed individually. All proposed budgets must be fully in accordance with the law, e.g., bonded debt must be properly retired, tax regulations governing political contributions must be observed, and anti-discrimination laws must not be violated.
  4. The recommendations of the Student Services Fees Committee shall be submitted to the Student Assembly for review. The Student Assembly shall adopt a final proposal for the allocation of student fees and shall submit its report to the President who will forward the report with his recommendations to the Board of Regents for their approval. If either the Student Services Fees Committee or the University administration wish to recommend changes to the Student Assembly proposal, they shall submit supplementary reports to the Board. Final approval shall rest with the Board of Regents.
  5. All student fee funds shall be handled through the Student Organization Finance Office.
  6. Student attitudes toward existing and proposed fees shall be periodically polled.

#### 2. Reported for Action (15 minutes)

The Committee on Business and Rules recommends amendment of the Constitution, Article VI, Section 1, to read:

Amendments to this Constitution shall be approved either by a two-thirds majority of all voting members of the Twin Cities Assembly at a regular or special meeting, or by a majority of all voting members of the Assembly at two meetings, the second of which shall be the next regular meeting, and provided the proposed amendment has been distributed, in writing, to the persons and in the manner provided in Article II, Section 5, for distribution of the Twin Cities Assembly agenda, at least 10 days prior to the date of the vote on the approval of the proposed amendment. Such amendments after adoption shall then be submitted to

the University Senate and Regents for approval.

This amendment would make the amendment procedure for the Assembly Constitution the same as that for the Senate Constitution.

### 7. Academic Standing

The Assembly Committee on Academic Standing shall consist of eight members of the faculty, three representatives of the student body, and ex officio representation from the following administrative units: Vice President Academic Administration: Vice President, Student Affairs. The faculty and student members of the committee also shall serve as the Twin Cities Campus Assembly representatives on the Senate Committee on Academic Standing and Relations.

The Assembly Committee on Academic Standing shall concern itself with policies on academic standing that are needed on a campus-wide basis. The committee shall study problems related to admission, scholastic standing, and grading as they affect Twin City collegiate units and bring recommendations to the Assembly as appropriate.

## VI. ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON STUDENT AFFAIRS

### Reported for Action (15 minutes)

The following amendment to Section 9 of the University Grading Policy (adopted by the Assembly on April 27, 1972) has been approved by the Assembly Committee on Student Affairs (amendment underlined):

9. The new official transcript will be implemented as the University's record-keeping is converted to computer and as transcripts are computer produced. It is not feasible to maintain manually (the current method) an official transcript and supplementary operational records. Computer-produced transcripts are tentatively scheduled for new freshmen in fall, 1972, for new advanced standing students in fall, 1973, and for all students in the University by the end of 1974-75. During the transition period, some official transcripts will be under the new system, some under the old. Under the old, supplementary symbols as well as grades of accomplishment will be part of the officially released transcript. Until the new system is fully implemented, students registered prior to the Fall of 1972 may have their grades which were received during and after Fall, 1972, transferred to the new system by payment of a conversion fee. Of course each transcript will be clearly identified as to the procedures under which it was produced.

## VII. REPORT OF THE ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

### Reported for Information

- I. The Big Ten Conference liberalized its rules under which the Commissioner may, upon submission of a petition, waive the application of the rules which specify the number of competitive events which are deemed to constitute one season of competition and thereby decrease the number of seasons during which a student is eligible. The new policy is as follows:
  1. The Commissioner may approve a petition for not more than one additional season of eligibility for football in behalf of a student who is injured prior to his 3rd competition so that he is prevented from further competition in that season. In sports other than football, the Commissioner may grant one additional season of eligibility to a student who is injured prior to his 4th competition so that he is prevented from further competition in that season.
  2. A 3rd competitive participation in football in a given season or a 4th competitive participation in other sports, no matter how brief shall debar any extension of eligibility by the Commissioner. A petition shall not be approved if the injury or illness occurs during the second half of the season of the sport involved. This new policy with respect to football is subject to institutional review. The Assembly Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics voted not to file an objection to the rule change and is reporting its action for your information. As you know, the Assembly Committee reports all items under institutional review for your information and asks for Assembly guidance when items may result in major program changes.
- II. The Assembly Committee has reviewed and approved the following ticket price schedules. Two changes from past practice—elimination of reduced single game tickets sold at the gate and elimination of separate Friday and Saturday hockey tickets—have been reported in the *Minnesota Daily*. Allocation of tickets for basketball will continue to be divided equally between public and student-staff tickets.
- III. Three members of the Assembly Committee have served on a screening committee charged with the task of recommending several candidates for Faculty Representative to President Moos. Final selection had not been announced at the time this report was written.

## Appendix 1

### ABSTRACT OF DISCUSSION

The meeting was called to order at 3:40 p.m. by Jack Navins, vice chairman. Noting that it appeared a quorum was lacking, he explained there were three alternatives open to the body: to adjourn; to set another time for an extension of the meeting; and to take steps to get a quorum. A motion to adjourn and continue the meeting in 10 minutes was seconded and approved. Following the arrival of several senators, the meeting was continued.



*Assembly and Campus Committees, 1973-74* — Betty Robinett, professor of linguistics and chairman of the Committee on Committees, presented the name of a student replacement on a committee, which was approved.

*Steering Committee* — a document outlining the establishment of the Student Services Fees Committee was presented for information.

*Nominating Committee* — Mr. Navins listed, for the Faculty Assembly, the names of four faculty members as nominees to fill two vacancies for 3-year terms on the Committee on Committees. Following a written-ballot election, Ms. Robinett, current chairman, and Barbara Stuhler, professor in Continuing Education and Extension, were announced as elected members.

*Business and Rules Committee* — Nominated from the floor to fill the office of vice chairman of the Assembly for next year were George Shapiro, professor of speech-communication, and David Winegar, biological sciences senior and member of the Assembly and the Consultative Committee. Mr. Shapiro was elected on a written ballot.

A second item was introduced by Russell Hobbie, professor of physics and chairman of the committee. It was another attempt to bring the Constitution in line with the Senate Constitution by easing the requirements for amending it. Noting that there were not enough members present to provide the two-thirds approval requirement, Hyman Berman, professor of history, moved to table the amendment. His motion was approved.

*Committee on Committees* — Ms. Robinett introduced an amendment to the bylaws calling for a new committee, a Committee on Academic Standing, which she explained was needed to deal with the Twin Cities Campus. The proposal had the support of both the Senate Academic Standing Committee and the Committee on Committees. The vote of 86-0 was 3 short of the required majority of elected members.

A second item was the list of membership for Assembly and Campus committees. Rick Nelson, student assemblyman and chairman of the Student Affairs Committee, asked about the omission of Robert Morris, who was eligible for reelection. Ms. Robinett indicated that his name had been one of two names submitted to the President's office. Mr. Nelson's proposal to name him to the committee in place of those listed on the docket was ruled out of order by the chair. He then moved to remove the nominations for the entire committee from the agenda. That motion was approved, and the nominations for all other committees were approved.

*Student Affairs Committee* — Mr. Nelson introduced an amendment to the University Grading Policy which had been approved by the Assembly in 1972. He explained that, under that policy, 1972 freshmen and 1973 advanced standing students had had supplementary symbols removed from their official transcripts as record keeping was converted to a computerized system. He felt that there should be a way for students who do not now have computerized transcripts to have them changed manually, providing for the elimination of all supplementary symbols received since fall 1972 upon payment of a fee. Leonid Hurwicz, Regents' professor of economics, was concerned that a fee might work a financial hardship on some students. The response was that the fee would be in the \$5 to \$10 range. The amendment was then approved.

*Intercollegiate Athletics Committee* — David Giese, professor in General College and chairman of the committee, presented his report for information.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:20 p.m.
