

Upper Division Economics Policy-p. 22 and 26- For students admitted to the Carlson School Fall 1986 or later the first U of MN economics class used to fulfill the CSOM upper division economics requirement (i.e., Econ 3101, 3102, 3105 or 3701) is treated the same as an upper division Carlson School class for all purposes (residency and all GPA calculations) whether taken before or after admission to the Carlson School. No other non-CSOM courses are treated this way.

Speech 1101-p. 23- Speech 1101 has been added to the list of courses which will fulfill the CSOM speech requirement.

Grading System Change-p. 25- Effective Fall 1991 the Carlson School of Management will implement a pilot plus/minus grade base system. The grades and associated points will be:

A	=	4.0
A-	=	3.7
B+	=	3.3
B	=	3.0
B-	=	2.7
C+	=	2.3
C	=	2.0
C-	=	1.7
D+	=	1.3
D	=	1.0
D-	=	0.7

All CSOM courses, including lower division pre-management courses, will use this system which will be monitored for the next five years to see what impact it has on grade distributions. These symbols will show only on the transcripts of CSOM students.

Please make this change also on p. 26 under the Probation list of honor points.

Honors and Distinction Calculations-p. 28- Graduation honors are calculated using the Carlson School of Management GPA's of the students who graduated the two quarters prior to the quarter in which the student is graduating. For example, for Spring 1992, honors and distinction will be based on Fall 1991 and Winter 1992.

Accounting 1050-p.37- The accounting "tool" course has been changed from 4 credits to 5 credits (effective Fall 1991).

Accounting 5180-p. 37- The course title has been changed from "Advanced Accounting II" to "Advanced Financial Reporting II."

Business Administration 3000-p. 38- A 2 credit, S/N course, BA 3000, "Orientation for Managers," has been added to the curriculum. The course will provide an integrated approach to career exploration, values clarification and self-development for students seeking careers in management. The course will focus on developing student awareness of internal and external factors which shape personal life and professional careers.

Business Law 3058-p. 39- The prerequisite for BLaw 3058 should be Economics 1101 or 1002.

Management 5101-p. 48- The course title has been changed from "Advanced Topics in Management" to "Topics in Management."

Insurance classes-p. 51- The insurance curriculum is under review. Contact an adviser in 290 Humphrey Center for updated information.

Foreign Study in Dijon-p. 11- FSMg 3590- A new IES International Business Management Program has been added to the study abroad list. It is a semester study in France at the Ecole Superieure de Commerce in Dijon. The program is taught in English for business and economics students with at least one year of French. It features course work on the European Community, multinational business firms, and financial management of global firms. Between 1 and 24 credits may be earned. The application deadline for Spring semester 1992 is November 1, 1991 (affiliate priority October 15, 1991).

Change in Fall application deadline-p. 16- The new deadline for Fall quarter applications to the Carlson School is June 1.

Second Language Requirement-p. 17- The second language requirement has been changed to 1 college year (three quarters or 2 semesters) or 2 high school years of the same second language. All students who graduated from high school July 1986 or later must meet this requirement.

There is no second language requirement for students who graduated from high school June 1986 or earlier.

Calculus 1211-1241 Series-p. 20- The calculus 1211-1241 series has changed to 4 credits each.

Tool course equivalents-p. 20- If you have taken a course which you think may be equivalent to a required "tool" course, please bring it to the attention of an adviser in 290 Humphrey.

Foreign Study Credits-p. 21- Delete the following sentence "No more than 45 of these credits may be used to meet degree requirements."

Accounting Coursework Residency-p. 22- 50% of accounting coursework must be taken at the CSOM (generally, this is a minimum of 5 upper-division CSOM accounting courses).
