FINANCIAL AID MONEY STILL AVAILABLE Despite national reports of serious cutbacks in federal aid to students, UMD will award an all-time high of \$14.5 million in federal, state and private and institutional financial aids for the upcoming academic year, an increase of \$500,000 over last year. Aids Director Nicolas Whelihan says about 95 percent of the expected requests for aid are in hand, but that there still is room for prospective or past students to apply for aid for this year. Interested students should contact the Financial Aids office soon. Based on the current request for education now before Congress, UMD will fare as well as or somewhat better than it did last year. State funds are higher than a year ago.

TUITION FOR 1982-83 The official figures based on Regents approval of tuition rates for 1982-83 show the following for UMD colleges and schools: Lower Division (for all units), \$30.75 per credit hour; Letters and Science, \$32.75 per credit hour; Education, \$33 per credit hour; Business and Economics, \$32.50 per credit hour; Fine Arts, \$34.25 per credit hour; Social Development, \$38.50 per credit hour; Graduate School, UMD, \$53 per credit hour; and the MBA program, \$76 per credit hour.
