PAYMENT OF FALL QUARTER FEES

September 17, 1921, will be the last date for the payment of Fall quarter fees without penalty by students registered at the University this quarter. Fee statements will be mailed by the Registrar's office on or before September 1.

The penalty for late payment is \$2.00 until the day previous to that on which classes begin, and thereafter (beginning September 28) increases at the rate of \$1.00 per day until fees are paid. The maximum penalty is \$12.00. If payment is made late the correct penalty should be added to insure completing the student's registration. The postmark on the envelope in which remittance is forwarded to the University Cashier will be regarded as the date of payment in such cases.

Fee statements will be mailed to the home address given by students on their registration blanks for this quarter. Students will be held responsible for reporting changes of address to this office, or leaving forwarding addresses at their home post offices, if they are not to be there this summer. Failure to receive a fee statement on account of changes of address not reported to this office before August 25 cannot be accepted as sufficient reason for waiving the penalty for late payment of fees.
