DULUTH — The problems, methods and techniques involved in community and family life will be part of a course in Adult Education in Home Economics during the first UMD Summer Session term June 17-July 20.

The three-credit course will meet at 9 a.m. Monday through Friday in Room 104, Education building. Dr. Ruth Palmer, head of home economics at UMD, will teach the course.

"We cover the methods and materials which would be of interest and of value to adults," said Dr. Palmer. "It is quite different than what we offer school-age students in the course during the regular academic year."

Dr. Palmer explained that the course is required of all teachers certified in federally-aided secondary programs. "It also can be selected for graduate credit for in-service teachers while people in extension service, nursing education and other allied fields have found it helpful," she added.

First-term registration will be held June 17 with classes beginning the following day. No registrations will be allowed after June 20 without the special permission of the director of Student Personnel Services.
