MODERN CHEMISTRY AND ITS PROBLEMS

THE CENTRAL DEPOSIT SYSTEM

No general deposit cards are issued to students during the summer session. Each student pays the \$5.00 deposit and is given credit for that amount, against which customary charges are made, such as post-office, directory, lockers and keys, etc.

Persons in charge of assignments for which charges are made and those in charge of departments where breakage occurs and charges are made against deposit fees, will file these charges at once with the central deposit bureau in the Registrar's office for auditing and record.

Convenient memorandum booklets for use in filing charges against deposit fees have been printed and sent to the departments. The original sheet is to be sent to the central bureau, Registrar's office; the duplicate to the student; and the triplicate is retained as a department record.

In instances where the same charge is made against the deposit accounts of several or a group of students, as in the assignment of lockers, a typewritten sheet giving the names of students and the amount to be charged may be sent to the central bureau, for the sake of convenience.

INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS REGISTERING FOR THE SUMMER SESSION AFTER MONDAY, JUNE 21, 1920

1. Before attending any class, secure a petition at the office of Dean Nicholson, Room 239, Chemistry Building, and on it write a request for late registration, indicating course of study desired, and giving reasons for being late.
 2. Present your petition for late registration to Dean Nicholson, and, if it is granted, call at Window 1, registrar's office, for a registration blank.
 3. On the registration blank indicate course you wish to carry, days per week, hours per day, number of credits, and buildings in which the classes are conducted.
 4. Return the entire registration blank to Window 3, registrar's office, for auditing, and secure a fee statement.
 5. Take the fee statement to the University cashier's office, opposite the registrar's office, and pay your fees. Your registration is not complete until fees have been paid.
 6. Attend classes in accordance with the printed schedule.
