THE MCKNIGHT AWARDS FOR INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH PROJECTS IN PLANT BIOLOGY The McKnight Foundation announces a series of awards designed to stimulate research and training in basic plant biology as it relates to agriculture. The purpose of the Awards is to create new efforts and alliances and to encourage continuing efforts of established groups which emphasize training as a major component of their research. These awards will permit approaches to research and training that are not presently possible through the usual granting channels. Thus, the awards will make available the resources necessary for interdisciplinary research initiatives that will place a major emphasis on training of pre- and post-doctoral students. Modest funding is also available for a limited number of undergraduate students as an incentive for them to enter careers in fundamental plant biology. THE PHARMACEUTICAL MANUFACTURERS ASSOCIATION FOUNDATION, INC. announces six (6) pharmacology based funding programs for 1984: 1) Faculty Development Awards in Pharmacology - The purpose of which is to strengthen basic pharmacology by helping to maintain the present academic capability and ultimately to expand this by broadening the faculty base; 2) Research Starter Grants - The purpose of which is to offer financial support to individuals beginning their independent research careers at the faculty level; 3) Fellowships for Careers in Clinical Pharmacology - An opportunity for training in the scientific basis for the field of clinical pharmacology; 4) Faculty Development Awards in Clinical Pharmacology - Annual awards are made to medical schools for support for full-time junior faculty members in the field of clinical pharmacology; 5) Fellowships for Advance Predoctoral Training in Pharmacology Toxicology - Aimed at supporting promising students during their thesis research; and 6) Postmarketing Monitoring Methodology Grant Program - Supports studies aimed at extending or developing imaginative, feasible methodologies to systematically generate information about prescription medications as they are customarily used in the non-hospital population.
