DULUTH--Dr. Nicholas Nyaradi, a man who has gained national acclaim for his anti-subversive speeches and writings, will address a student-public convocation at 10:30 ^{a.m.} Wednesday (May 2) at UMD's Kirby Student Center ballroom.

Dr. Nyaradi will speak on the topic "Shall We Survive?" His appearance at UMD will be co-sponsored by the Convocations and Lectures committee and the UMD Alumni Association.

Dr. Nyaradi currently is director of the School of International Studies at Bradley University, Peoria, Illinois, and formerly was Minister of Finance in Hungary.

Nyaradi participated in the anti-Nazi underground movement in Hungary during World War II, was Under Secretary of the Treasury in the post-war government, then Finance Minister. In 1948, because of Soviet pressure, Nyaradi and his wife were forced to flee the country.

Nyaradi's book "My Ringside Seat in Moscow" details his experiences there when he was negotiating a Russian reparation claim against Hungary. He has written articles for leading newspapers and magazines such as the Saturday Evening Post, Fortune magazine and the Scripps Howard newspapers.

Dr. Nyaradi will address a student assembly at ~~East~~ High School at 8:15 a.m. Wednesday and meet with newsmen at a 9:00 a.m. news conference before his UMD convocation appearance. He will speak to a UMD class on political thought at 1:30 p.m. in Social Science 102.
