DULUTH--An Air Force official will visit UMD Oct. 14 to meet college seniors or recent graduates interested in earning an Air Force commission under the Officer Training School program.

Capt. Arthur Crum, officer selection specialist from Minneapolis, will spend the day at Kirby Student Center. Joining the interviewing team will be Tech. Sgt. Alamo B. Rambo, recruiting service representative in Duluth, and Lt. Col. Harold J. Hopkins, professor of air science at UMD.

Under the program, a young man or woman attends the OTS school in Texas for three months, graduating as a second lieutenant. The graduate can choose in advance his or her Air Force job assignment during four years service. Graduates also may qualify for further advanced training in their specialty fields or may even earn advanced college degrees.

Applicants must be between 20 1/2 and 29 1/2 years of age and a citizen of the U.S. Male applicants may be married, but female applicants must be single and have no dependents.
