

DULUTH--A well known writer on economic subjects will address the annual meeting of the Minnesota Economic association at 4 p.m. Saturday (Oct. 12) in the UMD library reading room.

Oswald H. Brownlee, professor of economics at the University of Minnesota on leave as economist with the International Cooperation administration, will speak on "Impediments to Economic Development in Latin America."

He has co-authored three books on public finance, economic analysis and defense finance.

A contributing editor of the Encyclopedia Britannica, he also has written a number of articles for economic journals, including the American Economic Review, the Harvard Business Review, the Journal of Political Economy and the Journal of Farm Economics.

A graduate of Montana State college, the University of Wisconsin and Iowa State college, where he received the Ph.D. degree, Professor Brownlee has taught at Iowa State, Carnegie Institute and the University of Chicago as well as at Minnesota.

He also has been an economist with the Office of Price Administration in Washington, with the Pennsylvania joint state government commission, the agricultural committee of the National Planning association and Archer-Daniels Midland Co., Minneapolis.

More than a dozen upper Midwest campuses will be represented at the conference, being held for the first time on the UMD campus. First session will be at 11 a.m. Community and campus tours for delegates and their wives will precede the session. Richard O. Sielaff, chairman, UMD division of the social sciences, is coordinator.
