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SS II OPENS MONDAY More than 150 courses and at least 13 workshops will be offered during UMD's second term of Summer Session which begins Monday. Students may register through Monday without paying a late fee at the Registrar's Office, 104 Darland Administration Building. Workshops include Adapted Aquatics and Physical Education, Back to Basics Movement in Education, Behavior Change Techniques, Community and Adult Education in Community Schools, Human Relations Education, Maintaining Teacher Vitality, Motivational Strategies, Racism and Sexism in Schools, Specialization in Reading, Transactional Analysis in Education, Family Communication, and Play in the Making of Poetry.

RAPP OFF TO RUSSIA CLS Dean George Rapp Jr. will fly to Russia next week to conduct research and attend a conference. He will spend eight days in Armenia viewing early metallurgical sites; August 1 - 10 Rapp will attend an International Quaternary Conference at the University of Moscow and will present a paper on his archaeological work in the eastern part of the Mediterranean Sea.
