DULUTH -- A musical ensemble from the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis will present works by Ibert, Dvorak and Beethoven in an 8 p.m. concert Wednesday (October 20) in the Recital Hall of the UMD Humanities building.

The group, composed of students and faculty, will be directed by Richard E. Sieber, director of the University orchestra in Minneapolis.

The concert is open to the public. There is no admission charge.

It is the first of five programs to be sponsored by the UMD music department during fall quarter.

The Duluth chapter of the American Guild of Organists and UMD will co-sponsor the appearance of Dr. Heinrich Fleischer, renowned organist and associate professor of music on the Minneapolis campus, on October 25.

Dr. Fleischer will deliver a lecture at 11:30 a.m. in Recital Hall and present an organ recital at 8:15 p.m. at St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

Other programs include a string clinic at Woodland High School on November 5, a concert by the UMD String Quartet on November 16 and a guest recital by Gustavus Adolphus violinists on November 22, both in Recital Hall.
