HONORED-----Moses Passer, associate professor of chemistry has been named to a 12-member standing committee on chemical education by R. M. Warren, Washington, D. C., secretary of the American Chemical Society. Committee duties are: To study policies relating to improvement of scientific education; to advise committees responsible for administration of scholarship grants-in-aid and associated activities; to advise in matters concerning accrediting of courses of study and vocational guidance; to develop a program of vocational guidance, and to act upon petitions for establishment of chapters of student affiliates.

REGENTS' SCHOLARSHIPS-----Full-time Civil Service employees are invited to submit applications for Regents' Scholarships for spring semester Extension Division (evening school) courses no later than January 9, 1959. Eighteen scholarships are available.

A Regents' Scholarship enables employees to take a tuition-free course of up to six credits or six hours of classes a week. Interested employees may get an application blank from the Office of the Director, Student Personnel Services, Kirby Student Center.

The Civil Service Committee makes the final selection of winners, considering the relation of the requested course to the present job or promotional opportunities, length of service and work load in the department.

Scholarship applications may be submitted any time throughout the year, but the deadlines for any quarter (or semester) is always a month before the classes begin. This gives the Civil Service Committee time to select and notify the winners. Applications for Summer Session scholarships should be submitted as far in advance as possible. RECENT DEATHS-----Mrs. Mary C. Bohannon, Duluth, widow of Dr. Eugene W. Bohannon, president of Duluth Normal School and Duluth State Teachers College from 1901 to 1938, passed away December 31, 1958 at Oak Park, Illinois. Survivors include two daughters, Mary Elizabeth Bohannon, professor of history at Wellesley College, and Ruth Bohannon. A son George, president of the Pullman Company, resides in Oak Park, Illinois. Dr. and Mrs. Bohannon made many significant contributions during the past 50 years to the development of Duluth and the collegiate community. Dr. Bohannon died May 9, 1955. Mrs. Bohannon was active in numerous clubs and organizations. Private services were held in Oak Park on Friday, January 2. The family called attention to the E. W. Bohannon Scholarship and Loan Fund at UMD and requested no flowers.

Mr. Harry A. Smith, father of Arthur E. Smith, head of the UMD Art Department, passed away December 16, 1958 at his home in Kenmore, New York. Mr. Smith was a sales representative for the Curtis Screw Company. Other survivors include his wife, Florence G. and a son, Harry G., both of Kenmore.

V. E. Hawley of Grantsburg, Wisconsin, father of Grace H. Evans, Head Residence Hall Counselor at UMD, died December 13, 1958. Mr. Hawley, who was in the hardware business from 1914 to the time of his death and active in religious and civic organizations, is also survived by his wife.
