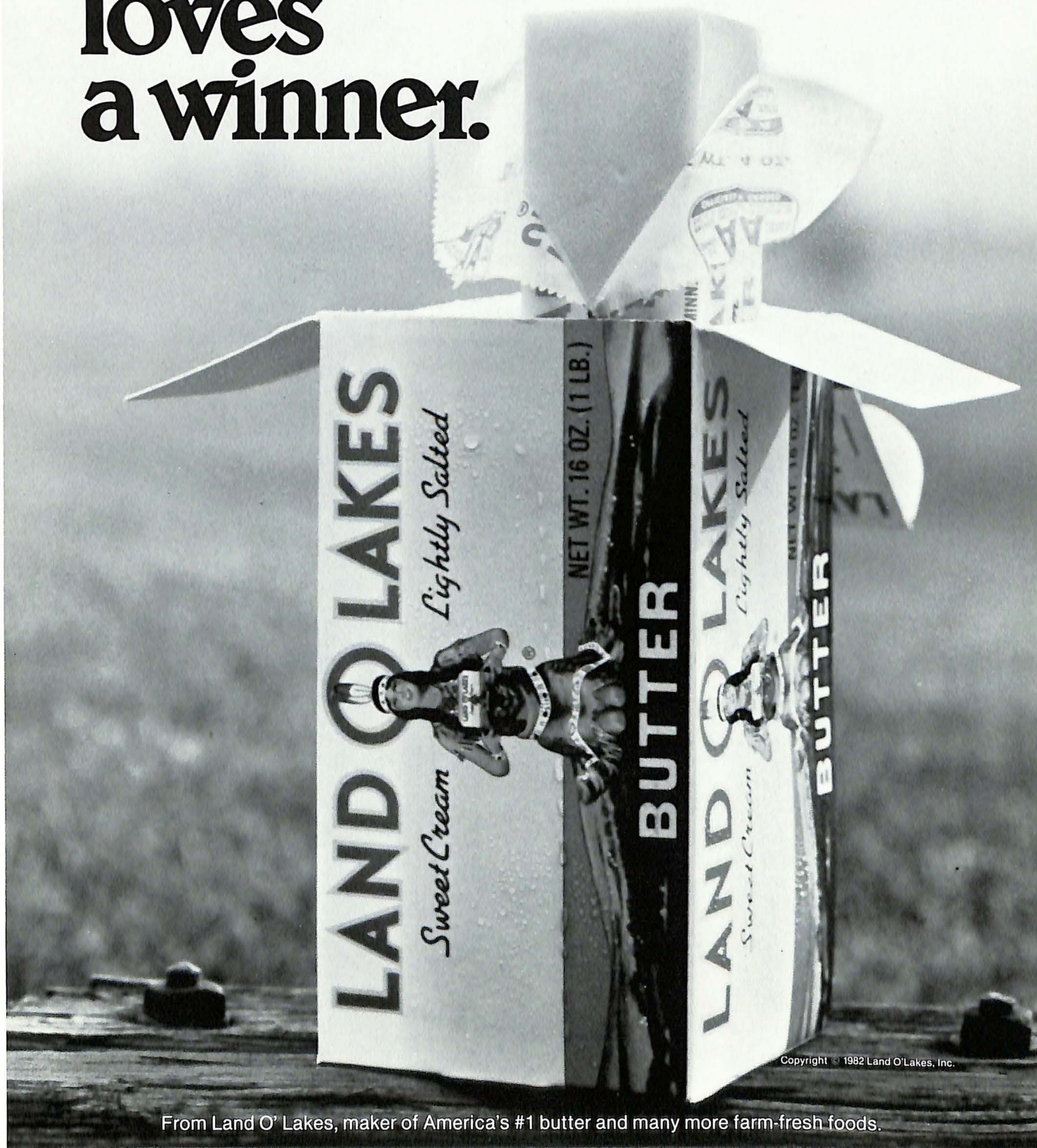

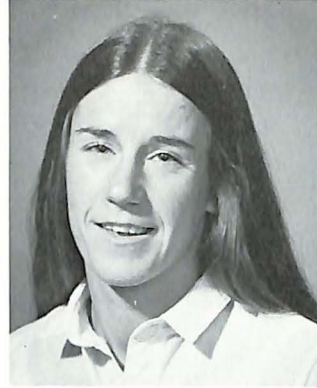




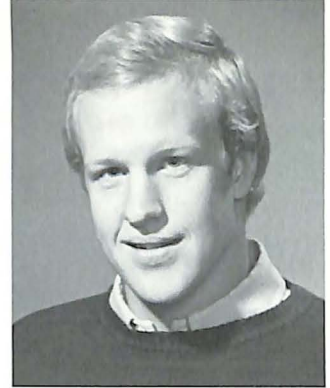

Meet The Coaches

Jean Freeman

Head Coach Jean Freeman is in her tenth season as the Golden Gopher swimming coach. Accumulating an enviable 62-20 dual meet record, she has built the Minnesota program into one of the Midwest's finest. Twelve Minnesota swimmers under Freeman have earned All-American status 19 times and the Gophers have placed in the top 40 at the AIAW National Championships for nine consecutive years. Last year they scored their best-ever national finish at 15th place.

Freeman first began coaching at north Minneapolis' Ascension Swim Club—one of Minnesota's oldest AAU programs. A swimmer with the Gopher Swim Club as an undergraduate at the University, Freeman graduated in 1972 with a physical education degree. She became assistant coach of Minnesota's first varsity team in 1972 and accepted the head coaching position the next year.

Coaching swimmers is a year-round occupation for Freeman. She has been active in the Gopher Swim Club (a campus-based development program) for 11 years, and she coached at the 1979 USA Olympic Development Training Camp in Colorado Springs, CO. In the summer of 1980 she accompanied Gopher standouts Stephanie Schoening and Peggy Huebsch to the Seventeen Swim Meet of Champions (a national qualifying event) and to the USA Olympic Trials.

In addition to coaching, Freeman teaches swimming, lifesaving, and aquatic administration in the University's physical education department. Though coaching now takes most of her time, Freeman has also directed swimming instruction in four-week University summer extension division sports fitness camps for elementary school children.

Craig Lincoln

Olympic medalist and former Gopher diving star Craig Lincoln returns to the University of Minnesota for his second season as both the women's and men's diving coach and the team sports psychology consultant. Replacing former coach Frank Oman, Lincoln brings with him a most impressive record as a coach and diver.

As an AAU diver, Lincoln was a two-time national champion in the United States and Canada. He also won the NCAA National Championship while at Minnesota and captured the Big Ten title three times during his collegiate years. No stranger to international competition either, Lincoln won a silver medal at the 1971 Pan-American games in Cali, Colombia, and a bronze medal at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich, West Germany.

While still an undergraduate, Lincoln began coaching both the men's and women's Gopher diving squads. He earned his B.A. in psychology in 1973, and from 1976 to early 1982 coached the boys' and girls' teams at Hopkins Eisenhower High School. In addition to his coaching duties, Lincoln is now completing work on his master's degree at the University.

Terry Ganley Nieszner

Former All-American Terry Ganley Nieszner is now in her sixth season as part of the Minnesota Coaching Staff.

Nieszner's credentials include an impressive AAU and collegiate career. She began swimming competitively under Coach Freeman at the Ascension Swim Club at 10 years of age and set several state age group records before enrolling at the University. As a Gopher swimmer, Nieszner became the University of Minnesota's first female All-American in any sport in

1974, and she repeated the honor three more times before graduating in 1977.

Art Griffith

Art Griffith will be assisting the Gophers for the second time this year. A veteran of the Minnesota program, Griffith led Minnesota's men's swim team in the sprint events for four years and earned All-American honors in both sprint freestyles as well as becoming the Big Ten 100-yard freestyle champion in 1981.

Griffith works mainly with sprinters and freestylers in the "fine tuning" of their events. He has been ranked in the Top 20 in the world for the last five years and has been a member of the United States National Swim Team. Griffith was also a member of Mission Viejo's American record-setting 200-yard freestyle relay team in 1981 as well as Mission's team captain, leading them to another national title.

He participated in the 1982 National Sports Festival in Indianapolis and in the 1982 U.S. nationals, where his score in the 50 and 100 freestyles ranked him in the top 10 in the world for those events. Griffith has completed a degree in urban planning at the University and is currently pursuing a second degree in civil engineering.

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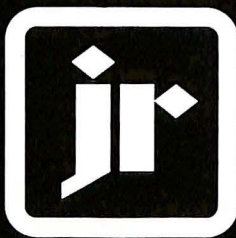

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Tips for the Diving Spectator

To the untrained eye, the winners and scores in diving may be harder to spot than those in the more objective swimming events—where the first one across the pool wins. But judging diving events is even more difficult than watching the sport because it involves forming an instantaneous impression of each dive. The process is further complicated by the fact that the same dive can often appear different to judges seeing it from different angles. A fault one judge may not be able to see at all may be the most obvious part of the dive to other judges only a few feet away. Here then are some tips to help untrained eyes in the tough job of watching diving by demystifying the nearly impossible job of those who must evaluate what they see.

The points to consider in judging a dive are the approach, hurdle, takeoff, execution, and entry. The dive is judged as a whole, however, and the separate parts do not make up specific portions of the total score. Scores can range from 0 to 10 points, with half points allowed, according to the following scale:

Very good	9-10 points
Good	7-8.5 points
Satisfactory	5-6.5 points
Deficient	3-4.5 points

Unsatisfactory	.5-2.5 points
Completely Failed	0 points

A dive starts with the approach on the board. The approach must be a normal walk of at least three steps, executed with obvious confidence. The takeoff must be from both feet at once and the hurdle should be flowing and graceful. The whole process should be so smooth and effortless that no one can tell if the diver is doing a compulsory dive, an optional dive, or just a practice takeoff.

Dives in the springboard events are divided into five different groups. Dives in different directions relative to the board and starting position comprise the first four groups and the final group includes any dive with a twist:

Forward Group: The diver faces the front of the board and dives facing toward the water. Dives in this group vary from the simple front dive to the difficult forward three and one-half somersault.

Backward Group: All the dives in the backward group begin with the diver on the end of the board with her back to the water. The direction of the dive is away from the board toward the water.

Reverse Group: These dives begin with the diver using a forward approach and

diving back in toward the board; the opposite direction of rotation from the forward group. This group of dives was formerly called "Gainers."

Inward Group: The diver stands on the end of the board with her back to the water and dives in toward the board; the opposite direction of rotation from the backward group. The earlier term for these dives was "Cutaways."

Twisting Group: Any dive with a twist is included in this group. As with non-twisting dives, there are four types of twisting dives—forward, backward, reverse, and inward. This group includes more dives than do the other four groups, however, because there are so many possible combinations.

Five dives, one from each of the above groups, are classified as the basic or, in competition, the required dives. The five required dives are a forward dive, a backward dive, a reverse dive, an inward dive, and a forward dive with a one-half twist. The basic dives may be performed in any one of the following body positions:

Tuck: With the body bent at the waist and knees, thighs drawn to the chest, and heels kept close to the buttocks.

Pike: With legs straight, toes pointed, and the body bent at the waist. The body should be as compact as possible. The arm position is dictated by the particular dive or, in some cases, is the option of the diver.

Layout or Straight: With a straight body with no bend at the waist or knees. However, there may be an arch in the back, depending on the dive. The feet must be together and the toes must be pointed. As in the Pike position, the arm placement is either the diver's choice or defined by the particular dive.

Free: This is not an actual body position but a diver's option to use any of the other three positions or combinations thereof when performing a dive which includes somersaults and twists. In dives of this kind, however, the tuck position is rarely used. A combination of layout and pike is the most common.

The entry into the water for all dives must be vertical or nearly so, with the body straight and toes pointed. All head-first entries shall be executed with the arms stretched beyond the head in line of the body, with hands close together. In all feet-first entries the arms must remain close to the body with no bending at the elbows.

Each diver must make an honest attempt to complete each of the dives as announced or she will be disqualified. If the referee is certain a diver executed a dive other than the one announced, he or she will call it a failed dive and will not ask for the judges' scores. If a dive is performed partially in a position other than that announced, it will be awarded no more than two points. In the event of a balk or false start by the diver, the referee will order the total score to be reduced by one third.

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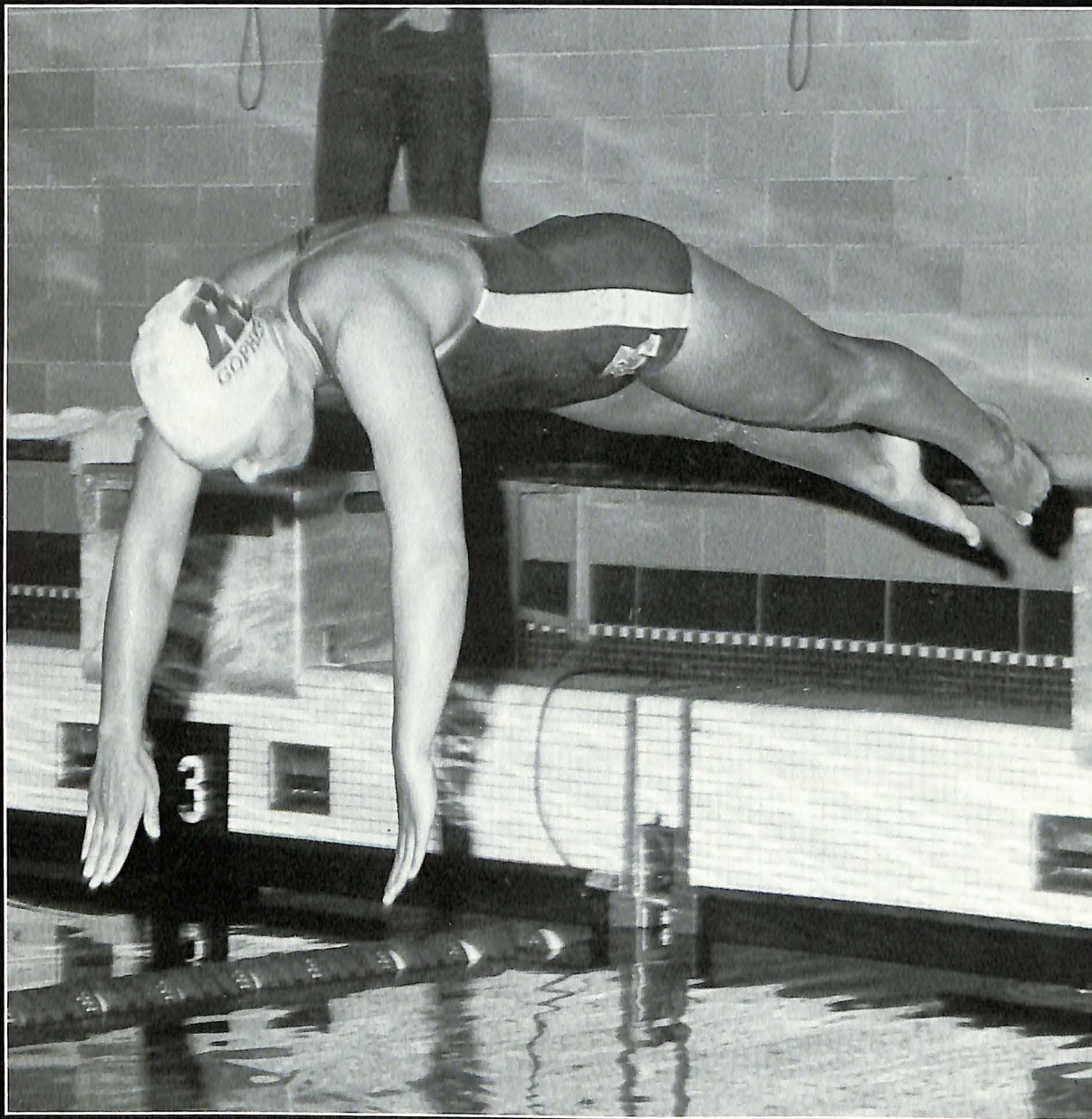
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
