WILLMAR 8 PREMIERES ON CAMPUS The documentary film, "The Willmar 8," which focuses on the 18-month strike by eight female bank tellers in Willmar, Minn. after they had formed a union in 1977, will be shown at various times on Wednesday (Feb. 4) on campus. The film, which is open to the public at no charge, will be shown at 10:30 a.m., noon, 1:30 p.m., and 3 p.m. in the Kirby Student Center Ballroom, and again at 7:30 p.m. in Life Science 185. The film is being brought to campus by the Women's Studies Program at UMD.
