2016 Softball Seniors...Where are They Now?



Crookston, Minn.- The 2017 softball season is less than one week away and the Golden Eagles continue to work indoors as they prepare for their opening weekend in Aberdeen, South Dakota, February 11th and 12th. The UMC team looks to better their 2016's finish of 11-39, 5-25 in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC), and boasts a roster of 21 strong that includes 14 returning players, seven of which started many, or all, of the 2016 regular season games.

Seven Golden Eagle players completed their careers in the maroon and gold last season and have moved on to the next chapter in their academic careers and the workforce.

[Kaylin Beatty](#) (OF, Andover, Minn.) entered the workforce as a veterinary nurse in Lexington, Kentucky where she works for Hagyards Equine Medical Institute. The four-year Golden Eagle plans to attend veterinary school in the 2017-18 school year and she is currently interviewing at multiple schools.

[Jordyn Derflinger](#) (P/OF, Henderson, Nev.) played two seasons in the maroon and gold and she finished up her elementary education program last fall where she student taught in both East Grand Forks, Minnesota and her hometown of Henderson. Immediately following her student teaching experience, Jordyn was hired to teach a kindergarten class in Henderson where she started teaching in January. Derflinger also plans to continue her education next fall when she will work on a master's of education.

[Allison Foley](#) (SS, Lockport, Ill.) entered the workforce shortly after graduation when she returned to downtown Chicago to a position of reporting accountant with Equity Residential, a residential real estate firm that specializes in high-rise apartments in heavily populated cities. Foley also plans to attend grad school next year and embark in her slow pitch career in the Chicago metro area.

[Ashley Hoyle](#) (2B, Blaine, Minn.) took a semester off before enrolling in a graduate program just down Interstate 29 at North Dakota State University. The Animal Science major will be doing research on the genetic change on piglets based on the mother's diet during gestation.
